#### **BLAZERS AIM TO STAY HOT WITH ANOTHER GSC MATCHUP**

Conference play continues this Saturday on the road for the Valdosta State Blazer football team, who has seen a steady increase of improvements each week this season leading up to last weekend's huge win over the Wolves of West Georgia.

This week, the flame red and black hits the road for Clinton, Miss. to face the Choctaws of Mississippi College in an afternoon matchup. The contest marks the first to be played outside of the state of Georgia since VSU's only loss back on September 17 against North Alabama.

The Blazers enter the contest sitting in three way tie with Florida Tech and West Florida for third place behind West Alabama in second place and the North Alabama Lions, who are currently undefeated in conference play. Meanwhile, the Choctaws come into Saturday's matchup searching for their first GSC victory of the 2016 season.

Valdosta State's defense has been extremely impressive this season and currently ranks second in the Gulf South Conference when measured by average yards allowed per game. Blazer opponents are averaging 333.8 yards per contest, while West Georgia leads the pack with an average of 325.7 yards allowed per game. Upon further breakdown of the Black Swarm's performance in 2016, VSU's 15 interceptions lead the conference and place the Blazers second in the nation in picks, behind only Black Hills State's total of 16. Brandon Roe's efforts in the secondary have played a key role in the Blazers' success, as he is currently locked in a seven-way tie for the individual league lead with three interceptions of his own.

Complementing the success of the Black Swarm, the Blazer offense has brought balance to Head Coach Kerwin Bell's squad in recent weeks as well. Bell's attack has been firing on all cylinders in recent weeks, particularly in the past two weeks, during which Valdosta State has racked up 1185 yards for an average of 592.5 yards per game. Much of the Blazers' offensive success can be attributed to the gradual improvement of the offensive line, which did not allow a single sack against the top defense in the league.

#### **QUICK NOTES**

- Valdosta State is now in its 35th year of intercollegiate football and owns an overall record of 270 wins, 120 losses and four ties.
- The Blazers' mantra this year is "New era. Same tradition." With the exception of Jeremy Darveau, the Blazer
  coaching staff features an entirely new lineup, consisting of four new assistant coaches. The group is led by
  Kerwin Bell, who was named the program's new head coach in January, and will serve as the eighth head coach
  in a line of Valdosta State Football head coaches.
- The Blazers have scored points in 299 straight games, which represents a Division II Football record. The last time the Blazers were shutout was in the 1991 season opener against Central Florida.
- Freshman Cedric Hollingshed landed his second Gulf South Conference Freshman of the Week honor in three weeks on Monday. The recognition by the league office came on the heels of a performance that included a career-high 86 rushing yards, along with nine receptions for 52 yards and a touchdown. Hollingshed currently ranks third on the team in scoring after three touchdowns scored for 18 points.
- Valdosta State football's winning percentage of .685 places them second all-time at the Division II level. The only program with a higher winning percentage is Grand Valley State. The Lakers have a record of 376-137-3, which tops Division II with a .728 winning percentage.
- Among all Division II or higher NCAA football programs in the state of Georgia, no team has a better current record than Valdosta State. The Blazers are currently tied with Kennesaw State in that sample of teams as the best in the state with a matching 4-1 record.

#### SERIES HISTORY AGAINST MISSIPPI COLLEGE

The Choctaws hold an all-time series advantage of 8-7-1 against the Blazers throughout the years. Prior to VSU's two wins over the course of the last two seasons over MC, Valdosta State had not faced the Choctaws since November 4, 1995, when VSU claimed a 42-16 win. The last time Mississippi College defeated Valdosta State was on October 27, 1990. MC won that contest 17-10 in Valdosta, Ga.

Known for its offense, Valdosta State is the current NCAA Division II leader in games without being shutout as the Blazers have scored in each of their last 299 games. The last time VSU was shutout was on September 14, 1991 when UCF defeated the Blazers 12-0 in Orlando, Fla.

#### **BLAZERS AMONG THE NATIONS BEST**

Now in its 35th year of football, Valdosta State ranks among the top schools in the nation in terms of all-time winning percentage. In fact, only one school - Grand Valley State - has a better all-time winning percentage than the Blazers, whose 262-116-3 all-time record accounts for a .685 winning percentage. Below is a look at the top five teams by winning percentage all-time on the NCAA Division II level:

#### **ONE OF THE BEST SINCE 2000**

Much of the Blazers' all-time winning percentage ranking can be attributed to Valdosta State's play since the beginning of the 2000 season, as only two Division II teams have won more games during that period. The Blazers have tallied 158 wins over the course of the last 15 seasons, behind only Grand Valley State's 183 and Northwest Missouri State's 180. GVSU (.848), NMSU (.850) and Tuskegee (.805) are the only teams with a better winning percentage than Valdosta State's .796. #### **BLAZERS PICKED TO FINISH FIFTH IN GSC**

Preseason All-Gulf South Conference pick Kenny Moore and the Valdosta State football team will enter the 2016 campaign with something to prove, according to a poll taken of the Gulf South Conference coaches, as the Blazers were picked to finish fifth in the league in a release by the GSC on Wednesday.

Despite a preseason national ranking at No. 13 in the 2016 Lindy's Sports Magazine Preseason Division II poll, the Blazers picked up two third place votes, four fourth place votes and two fifth place votes for 40 total points. As a result, VSU trailed Delta State, who fell into fourth place with 46 points (one second place vote, five third place votes, one fourth place vote, one fifth place vote). Florida Tech edged out DSU by a narrow margin in third place with 48 points (two first place votes, one second place vote, one third place votes, one fifth place vote), while North Alabama came in second with 53 points (six second place votes, one third place vote, one fourth place vote). West Georgia topped the preseason list for the second straight season with 63 points (seven first place votes, one second place vote).

Rounding out the poll in the bottom four positions were West Alabama in sixth place with 26 points, followed by Mississippi College, West Florida, and Shorter in the bottom three with 21, 16, and 11 points, respectively.

#### **ONE BLAZER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC**

As for individual honors, the Blazers were represented by Moore, a local product out of Lowndes High School who is preparing for his senior season. Moore established himself as one of the top defensive backs in the GSC after a stellar 2015 season, in which the Titletown native snatched three interceptions and returned two for touchdowns. Additionally, Moore recorded a career high 51 tackles last season to extend his career total beyond the century mark at 106, and earned All-GSC and All-Super Region II honors as a result. Moore was one of just five defensive players to be chosen as a unanimous pick in the poll, voted on each preseason by coaches throughout the GSC.

## **NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS**

Overall, VSU has tallied a 95-34-1 record all-time in non-conference games, a winning percentage of .731 in non-GSC games.

Under former head coach **David Dean**, VSU compiled a 37-7 record and an .860 winning percentage during his nine year stint. Of the six losses under Dean, three came against GSC foes during the NCAA playoffs, which rendered the contest a non-conference matchup.

Current head coach Kerwin Bell has one non-conference game under his belt with Valdosta State, a contest he won against the Albany State Golden Rams, 16-7, in the 2016 season opener.

#### THE BLAZERS AT HOME

Valdosta State has won 146 of 193 games, with 44 losses and one tie (.756), on its home field since beginning football in 1982. The Blazers are an impressive 136-44-1 (.751) at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium and have a 9-4 (.692) at Martin Stadium.

VSU has gone undefeated at home seven times (5-0 in 2006, 6-0 in 2004, 9-0 in 2002, 5-0 in 1995, 8-0 in 1994, 3-0-1 in 1992 and 5-0 in 1986) in its 29-year history. The Blazers have been particularly successful at home since the beginning of the 2000 season as they have tallied a 77-19 record (.802) during that span.

#### THE GSC IN THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Only three teams in the Gulf South Conference have made appearances in the Division II National Championship. Delta State appeared in both the 2000 and 2010 title games, while North Alahama (1985, '93, '94, '95) and Valdosta State (2002, '04, '07, '12) have each appeared four times. The Blazers and the Lions have each won three titles, and DSU has won once.

## **KENNY MOORE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC**

Preseason All-Gulf South Conference pick Kenny Moore and the Valdosta State football team will enter the 2016 campaign with something to prove, according to a poll taken of the Gulf South Conference coaches, as the Blazers were picked to finish fifth in the league in a release by the GSC on Wednesday.

Despite a preseason national ranking at No. 13 in the 2016 Lindy's Sports Magazine Preseason Division II poll, the Blazers picked up two third place votes, four fourth place votes and two fifth place votes for 40 total points. As a result, VSU trailed Delta State, who fell into fourth place with 46 points (one second place vote, five third place votes, one fourth place vote, one fifth place vote). Florida Tech edged out DSU by a narrow margin in third place with 48 points (two first place votes, one second place vote, one third place vote, three fourth place votes, one fifth place vote), while North Alabama came in second with 53 points (six second place votes, one third place vote, one fourth place vote). West Georgia topped the preseason list for the second straight season with 63 points (seven first place votes, one second place vote).

Rounding out the poll in the bottom four positions were West Alabama in sixth place with 26 points, followed by Mississippi College, West Florida, and Shorter in the bottom three with 21, 16, and 11 points, respectively.

As for individual honors, the Blazers were represented by Moore, a local product out of Lowndes High School who is preparing for his senior season. Moore established himself as one of the top defensive backs in the GSC after a stellar 2015 season, in which the Titletown native snatched three interceptions and returned two for touchdowns. Additionally, Moore recorded a career high 51 tackles last season to extend his career total beyond the century mark at 106, and earned All-GSC and All-Super Region II honors as a result. Moore was one of just five defensive players to be chosen as a unanimous pick in the poll, voted on each preseason by coaches throughout the GSC.

"I just want to honor God and my family for pushing me to standards that I would not have reached on my own," said Moore on Wednesday after learning of the honor, "I didn't do any of this on my own, and I give all the credit back to the people who made me who I am along the way. 

FLORENCE, Ala. - A host of Blazer miscues, combined with a strong offensive outing by North Alabama quarterback Jacob Tucker, resulted in a lopsided 44-19 victory for the Lions in Saturday's Gulf South Conference road matchup in Florence, Ala.

The Lions evened up their overall record at 1-1 with the victory and opened up GSC play at 1-0, while the Blazers fell to 1-1 overall and 0-1 in conference action.

Statistically, the numbers didn't matchup with the outcome of the contest, as Valdosta State racked up 433 total yards against UNA's 369. The Blazers struggled to complete drives, however, as the Lion defense tightened up in the red zone and forced VSU to kick field goals on four out of six opportunities.

VALDOSTA, Ga. – An impressive start fizzled out for the Blazer football team on Saturday night at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium, but the VSU defense forced some key turnovers down the stretch to give Valdosta State a 40-28 Gulf South Conference win over West Florida.

Former Blazer quarterback Kaleb Nobles, who took a few moments for an emotional gathering at midfield with his former Blazer teammates following the game, completed 21of-52 passes for the Argonauts on the night with two touchdowns. Ishmel Morrow played a huge part in those numbers with a host of tremendous grabs that led to 156 receiving yards. His 10 receptions marked the most for a Blazer opponent since Darryl Collins of West Alabama hauled in 10 against the Blazers nearly two years ago on October 30, 2014.

The Valdosta State defense was the difference for the Blazers, forcing seven turnovers in the contest and holding the Argonauts to -6 rushing yards, a mark which tied the eighth fewest allowed in the history of Blazer football.

new era of Blazer football began in 2016 with Kerwin Bell at the helm, as Bell was announced as Valdosta State's next head football coach by Valdosta State Athletic Director Herb Reinhard in January.

Bell, a Mayo, Fla. native and graduate of Lafayette County High School, joins the program with extensive coaching experience after having coached at Jacksonville University for nine years, while leading the NCAA Football Championship Series program to a 66-35 record during his time there. Under his direction, the Dolphins won two Pioneer Football League championships, set a PFL record with 16 consecutive wins, and led the team to the best record in school history during the Dolphins' 10-1 run in 2010.

His responsibilities at JU included roles as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, which produced a high-powered offense that led to big numbers in each of his nine seasons. During the aforementioned 2010 PFL championship season, Jacksonville led the nation in total offense with an average of 486 yards per game and also in scoring with an average of 42.2 points per game.

Bell's coaching experience dates back to 1990, when he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida, where he also played from 1983-87 while earning a Psychology degree and serving as the team's quarterback. In his four years as a Gator, Bell constructed a career that consisted of an SEC Freshman of the Year honor in 1984 after leading the Gators to a 9-1-1 record. He accumulated 7,586 career passing yards and 56 touchdowns in his time at Florida, which ultimately landed him in the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

in the 1990's that included time in the National Football League, the Canadian Football League, and the World League of American Football, Bell returned to a coaching career as an offensive coordinator for the Toronto Argonauts, where he served for two seasons before coaching at Trinity Catholic High School

After completing a professional playing career

in Ocala, Fla. until his time began at JU, where he posted 9-2 records in both 2014 and 2015.

"I am very pleased and excited to have Kerwin join

Valdosta State University and our Blazer football program," stated Reinhard. "He has enjoyed success as a head coach and he has considerable ties in Georgia and Florida. His teams are exciting to watch, and I am confident that he will build on our wonderful foundation of football success."



Jake Grande was added to the Valdosta State football coaching staff in the summer of 2016, prior to the start of the 2016 season.

Grande is expected to serve as both a special teams and wide receivers coach, the latter of which will be an important role under Coach Bell, who has stated his intentions of offering up a high powered air attack.

"I am a very energetic and positive coach on the field," stated Grande. "I hope that my excitement in coaching will get my players excited when they attack the field. I'm hoping that the energy these receivers bring will help them stretch the field and open it up for Kerwin Bell's passing attack so we can have a great year at the receiver position."

During his stint at JU, Grande started with a bang as the defensive backs coach and led his secondary to a No. 12 pass defense ranking among all NCAA Division I FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) programs. By 2015, the Dolphins had progressed to a No. 1 ranking in the FCS in interceptions, and Grande helped lift the team to No. 4 ranking in pass defense efficiency and a No. 6 overall ranking in scoring defense in 2014.

Grande also served as an assistant to the Jacksonville Sharks Arena Football League team during his same years at Jacksonville University, and preceded his time with those two programs as an assistant coach with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton of Arena Football League fame, where he helped guide the Pioneers to a No. 1 ranking in scoring defense, turnover margin, and fumble recoveries in just his second year with the organization.

In addition to responsibilities as an instructor to the Blazer receiving corps during the upcoming season, Grande will also contribute as a special teams coach. His experience as a player at Wilkes University, where he served as a team captain and achieved All Conference recognition as both a cornerback and a return specialist, will no doubt help in his efforts.

Bringing a wealth of coaching knowledge and eight years of experience to the Valdosta State program, Jeremy Darveau was named the Offensive Line coach for the Blazers in 2015.

While earning a Sociology Bachelors of Science Degree, Darveau put together an impressive collegiate career at the University of Louisville. Following four successful years at the Division I level, he added to his on-field experience with the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe and closed out his playing career with one year in the Arena 1 Football League as a member of the Tampa Bay Storm.

In 2008, Darveau began his coaching career at Southwest Minnesota State, where he served as a Tight End and Running Backs Graduate Assistant Coach for two years while earning a Masters Degree in Business Administration. His efforts with the program resulted in a full-time job as the Offensive Coordinator and Offensive Line Coach through the 2013 season, in which the Mustangs earned their first-ever bowl appearance. During his tenure at SMSU, Darveau helped his players rewrite both the school and conference record books with over 40 new offensive records with the program and seven new league marks.

Before joining the Valdosta State program, Darveau returned to the Sunshine State in 2014 as the Offensive Quality Control Coach at the University of Florida, and he continued to prove his worth after helping lead the UF offense to 12 new offensive records and a Birmingham Bowl victory to close out the year.

Throughout the duration of his coaching career, Darveau has helped train countless All-Americans, three of which he personally developed. In addition, he personally oversaw the development of nine All-Conference student-athletes.

JUSTIN HINDS DEFENSIVE LINE FIRST SEASON AT VALDOSTA STATE ROWAN UNIVERSITY (2008)

Justin Hinds joined the Valdosta State coaching staff as the defensive line coach prior to the 2016 season.

Hinds brings two years of coaching experience from Division I's Southeastern Conference after

having spent the 2014 season working under Coach David Turner at Mississippi State as a graduate assistant before a transitioning to another graduate assistant position at Florida for the 2015 season, where he worked under Chris Rumph and Geoff Collins to help lead the Gators to an SEC East title.

"Obviously this is a great opportunity at a great place with great tradition," said Hinds on Friday afternoon. "Just in my short time being here and getting a feel for the area, it's apparent that people really love football around here. This is an opportunity to coach some elite football players around a great fanbase, and I'm ready to be a part of something special that Coach Bell is building here at Valdosta State."

During his time in the SEC, Hinds had the opportunity to coach multiple NFL Draft picks, including John Bullard (2nd round to Chicago Bears) at Florida, along with Preston Smith (2nd round to Washington Redskins) and Chris Jones (2nd round to Kansas City Chiefs) at Mississippi State. Alex McCalister (5th round to Philadelphia Eagles) also benefitted from Hinds' tutelage while at Florida, and Hinds' recruiting efforts also helped the Gators acquire five-star defensive line recruit CeCe Jefferson, who went on to become an All-American during his freshman season in 2015 under the leadership of Hinds and the defensive line coaching staff at UF.

Prior to his hire at Mississippi State in 2014, Hinds worked as the Defensive Line Coach at Wagner College in Staten Island, New York, where he implemented defensive schemes and assisted the team's defensive coordinator with weekly game plans. His efforts helped lead the program to an NEC Championship in 2012, which represented the second of three seasons for Hinds with the team. Other experience includes defensive line coaching positions at Woodbridge and Plainfield in New Jersey, along with a position as the assistant defensive line coach at Rowan University, where he began his coaching career in Glassboro, New Jersey.

baseball team, has since established himself as a talented coach at the collegiate level, with a wealth of experience obtained in a relatively short period of time.


"I'm very excited about having Coach Rowe join us as a defensive coordinator," said Head Coach Kerwin Bell. "I had an opportunity to work with him at Jacksonville University, and I think he is a young superstar in this profession."

Rowe's time as a graduate assistant cornerbacks coach under Bell at JU began in 2012 and carried on throughout the 2013 season. His accomplishments in that role led to a promotion into an assistant coaching role for the wide receiver position in March of 2013, and he continued up the chain in 2014, with yet another promotion into the role of the team's defensive coordinator.

Following his time at Jacksonville University, Rowe was picked up as an addition to the secondary coaching unit at the University Florida, where he served time as a graduate assistant coach alongside Geoff Collins and Kirk Callahan. Under his tutelage, the Florida defense ranked No. 8 in scoring defense, No. 6 in total defense, and No. 11 in pass defense. Rowe also assisted in the development of some of the top defenders at the Division I level, including Thorpe Finalist and All-American Vernon Hargreaves, All-American safety Marcus Maye, and All-American defensive back Jalen Tabor.

Before joining Coach Bell's staff at Jacksonville University, Rowe began his collegiate coaching career, where he served as a graduate assistant coach for the Bethel University defensive staff in McKenzie, Tenn. during the 2011 season. The Wildcats finished that year ranked No. 14 in the nation, and BU finished the season as the West Division Mid-South Champions

"[Rowe] is a great communicator," added Bell. "That's probably his number one strength, is his ability to communicate with these young men. I also think he is a very cerebral guy that makes a lot of great adjustments during game situations, and I think he is going to be a great asset for our program as we move forward."
