# Saturday, September 2nd • 7:00 p.m. EST Albany, Ga. • Albany State Coliseum

After a lengthy preseason that began in early August, the Valdosta State Blazers will at long last kick off their highly anticipated 2017 campaign this Saturday against non-conference rival Albany State in Albany, Ga.

The Blazers come into their season opener with a No. 11 ranking in the first American Football Coaches Association poll of the new campaign. The mark represents the highest for VSU since the week of September 28th in 2015, when the team made their 143rd all-time appearance in the top ten of the weekly poll

all-time appearance in the top ten of the weekly poll.

Saturday's matchup will mark the 19th time the Blazers have faced the Golden Rams and the fourth consecutive season in which VSU and ASU have squared off for a season opener. Valdosta State is 17-1 all-time against Albany State, with the Blazers only loss coming in a narrow 24-22 defeat in the 2004 season opener. The game was played in Albany, Ga., and the Blazers avenged that loss later that same season with a 38-24 playoff win.

Season openers have been kind to the flame red and black, as the Blazers hold a 24-11 opening day record. Since its inception in 1982, the Valdosta State football program has outscored opponents 913-511, and the team carries a three-game opening day winning streak into Saturday's contest.

# OUICK NOTES

- Valdosta State is now in its 36th year of intercollegiate football and owns an overall record of 272 wins, 121 losses and four ties.
- The Blazers enter the 2017 season just outside of the American Football Coaches Association Division II top ten. Valdosta State snagged a No. 11 ranking in the first poll of the new season, with North Alabama representing the only Gulf South Conference team to earn a higher ranking. The Lions, following an appearance in the 2016 National Championship game, landed a spot at No. 6.
- Head Coach Kerwin Bell enjoyed a strong first year outing at the Division II level
  with an 8-3 record and an appearance in the NCAA DII Playoffs. Bell has stated numerous times throughout preseason that last year's early exit from the playoffs was
  tough to swallow, and one key goal moving forward is a deep playoff run.
- The Blazers will not see a home matchup until the third week of the season, the same weekend the team opens up GSC play against rival North Alabama.
- The Gulf South Conference recognized several Blazers in the 2017 Preseason All-GSC release. On the defensive side of the ball, senior Brandon Roe represented the Black Swarm following a junior campaign at defensive back that led to five interceptions and two fumble recoveries. One of those fumbles was returned for a touchdown. Linebacker Malik Slater also made the cut, after having 32 tackles in 2016. For the offense, junior quarterback Adam Robles joined linemen Josh Adams and Brandon Kemp on the list of preseason honorees. As a freshman last year, Kemp earned First Team All-GSC and First Team All-Super Region 2 recognition.

#### **BLAZERS PICKED TO FINISH SECOND...**

If the Gulf South Conference Preseason Release is any indication of what lies in store for the Valdosta State football program in 2017, Blazer Nation has plenty to be excited about, as the Blazers have been predicted to finish in second place in the GSC. Furthermore, five student-athletes made their way on to the list of Preseason All-GSC honorees.

In the annual poll taken of GSC head coaches throughout the league, the Blazers picked up 54 votes, including one first place vote, to finish eight points behind the North Alabama Lions, who earned 62 points and seven first place votes heading into their final season before an upcoming transition to the Division I ranks. Falling in at third place were the West Georgia Wolves with 49 points, followed closely by the Florida Tech Panthers, who secured 47 points for a predicted fourth place finish. West Alabama and Delta State landed 32 and 31 points, respectively, to claim the fifth and sixth place positions.

Rounding out the poll in the bottom three positions were West Florida at number seven with 25 points, followed by Mississippi College in the eighth place spot with 16 points. Eight votes placed Shorter in the final ninth place position.

As for individual honors, the Blazers were well represented on both sides of the ball. Adam Robles, Valdosta State's primary starter at the quarterback position in 2016, earned recognition heading into his junior season with the red and black. The Ocala, Fla. native tossed 18 touchdown passes and averaged over 200 yards passing per game last year, with his top performance coming against Kentucky State, when he threw for 401 yards and three touchdown passes. Alongside Robles on the offensive side with his first career Preseason All-GSC honor was Brandon Kemp, an upcoming sophomore out of Stone Mountain, Ga. As a red-shirt freshman last season, Kemp made a big splash at the offensive tackle position and earned both All-GSC and All-Region honors. Kemp was also joined by returning senior and offensive guard Josh Adams, who has been a starting lineman for the Blazers since 2015.

Representing the Black Swarm, Brandon Roe head-lined Valdosta State's defensive unit in recognition of a 2016 junior season in which he picked off five passes for a second-place tie among all GSC defensive backs. In addition, Roe helped lead the Blazer secondary to a nation-leading 27 interceptions last season and added two fumble recoveries, one of which was returned for a touchdown. Malik Slater also joined the fray after a 2016 season that included 32 tackles, a pass breakup, and 0.5 tackles for loss at the linebacker position.

#### BEST IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA...

Valdosta State has been pegged as the best college football program in the state of Georgia, regardless of division, according to a recent release by HERO Sports.

In a story highlighting the best collegiate football programs in each of the nation's 50 states, HERO Sports used an equation that measured winning percentage, individual awards, conference championships, playoff appearances, and national championships. Stats and records from the last five seasons were used to supply data, so every team is judged on the same timeline and a heavy emphasis is placed on how successful teams have been in recent years.

#### THE BLAZERS AGAINST THE SIAC...

Valdosta State has a long history playing against schools from the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. In addition to the 18 games that the Blazers have played against Albany State, VSU has played 28 additional games versus the SIAC for a 42-4 record overall and a .911 winning percentage against the conference.

The Blazers have faced Fort Valley State the most among SIAC teams with wins in 18 of those 21 meetings and has swept Clark Atlanta and Kentucky State with three and four wins against those schools, respectively.

erwin Bell is set to begin his second season at the helm of the Valdosta State football program, aiming to follow a strong 2016 outing during which he led the Blazers to their sixth playoff appearance in the last eight years.

In 2016, Bell picked up right where his predecessor left off and overcame an abbreviated recruiting season to navigate the Blazers to an 8-3 record. His offense-driven approach to the game paid dividends for VSU, as the team earned hosting rights for the first round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Furthermore, Bell's defense was a force to be reckoned with, as the program's secondary led the nation with 27 interceptions.

Bell, a Mayo, Fla. native and graduate of Lafayette County High School, brought extensive coaching experience to Valdosta State in 2016 after having coached at Jacksonville University for nine years, while leading the NCAA Football Championship Series program to a 66-35 record during his time there. Under his direction, the Dolphins won two Pioneer Football League championships, set a PFL record with 16 consecutive wins, and led the team to the best record in school history during the Dolphins' 10-1 run in 2010.

His responsibilities at JU included roles as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, which produced a highpowered offense that led to big numbers in each of his nine seasons. During the aforementioned 2010 PFL championship season, Jacksonville led the nation in total offense with an average of 486 yards per game and also in scoring with an average of 42.2 points per game.

Bell's coaching experience dates back to 1990, when he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida, where he also played from 1983-87 while earning a Psychology degree and serving as the team's quarterback. In his four years as a Gator, Bell constructed a career that consisted of an SEC Freshman of the Year honor in 1984 after leading the Gators to a 9-1-1 record. He accumulated 7,586 career passing yards and 56 touchdowns in his time at Florida, which ultimately landed him in the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

After completing a professional playing career in the 1990's that included time in the National Football League, the Canadian Football League, and the World League of American Football, Bell returned to a coaching career as an offensive coordinator for the Toronto Argonauts, where

he served for two seasons before coaching at Trinity Catholic High School in Ocala, Fla. until his time began at JU, where he posted 9-2 records in both 2014 and 2015.



Bell's collegiate playing career started at the University of Florida with 18 wins and just two losses during his freshman and sophomore seasons. His performance during those two years led to a Southeastern Conference Player of the Year award as a freshman in 1984, and he earned First-Team All-SEC honors the following year in 1985. In his four years as a Gator, Bell threw for 7,585 yards and 56 touchdowns. He was inducted into the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 as a "Gator Great", and In 2006, The Gainesville Sun sportswriters placed him No. 26 on the list of 100 greatest Gators of all time. Bell went on to play professionally in both the NFL and the CFL.

# DANNY VERPAELE

Defensive Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State MONTANA (2008)

Danny Verpaele officially joined the Valdosta State coaching staff as a linebackers coach on April 18 of 2016, and was promoted to the position of Defensive Coordinator prior to the start of the 2017 season.

Verpaele came to Valdosta State after two seasons as an assistant coach at Army

West Point. During his tenure at the United States Military Academy in West Point, N.Y., he acquired a significant amount of recruiting experience, particularly in the southeast, with time spent in Texas, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Louisiana, Arkansas, and Mississippi.

"Coach Verpaele is a very knowledgeable guy, but he also brings a lot of juice, or energy, as we say, to our practices and our games," said Head Coach Kerwin Bell.

Verpaele spent time as a member of Coach Bell's staff at Jacksonville University prior to his position at Army, working under Coach Bell as an assistant defensive coach with a primary focus on defensive backs. In 2012, his work at JU produced a defensive unit that ranked No. 1 in pass defense and total defense in the Pioneer Football League.

Success at JU led to a graduate assistant coaching position at Mississippi State in 2013, where Verpaele worked at the linebackers position and helped lead the Bulldogs to a No. 18 national ranking on defense. In addition, he helped guide sophomore Bernardrick McKinney to All-American honors and he helped develop New England Patriot free agent Deontae Skinner.



Prior to Jacksonville University, Verpaele kicked off his coaching career at Virginia Military Institute as an assistant coach in 2009, and he posted a three-year letterman career as a strong safety at the University of South Florida from 2004-08.

"[Verpaele] is a guy who brings great energy, who gets after it, and who gets his players to play at a very high level," added Bell. "He's a great addition to our staff and is going to bring a lot to the table."



# JEREMY DARVEAU

Offensive Line/Recruiting Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State MONTANA (2008)

Bringing a wealth of coaching knowledge and eight years of experience to the Valdosta State program, Jeremy Darveau was named the Offensive Line coach for the Blazers in 2015.

While earning a Sociology Bachelors of Science Degree, Darveau put together

an impressive collegiate career at the University of Louisville. Following four successful years at the Division I level, he added to his on-field experience with the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe and closed out his playing career with one year in the Arena 1 Football League as a member of the Tampa Bay Storm.

In 2008, Darveau began his coaching career at Southwest Minnesota State, where he served as a Tight End and Running Backs Graduate Assistant Coach for two years while earning a Masters Degree in Business Administration. His efforts with the program resulted in a full-time job as the Offensive Coordinator and Offensive Line Coach through the 2013 season, in which the Mustangs earned their first-ever bowl appearance. During his tenure at SMSU, Darveau helped his players rewrite both the school and conference record books with over 40 new offensive records with the program and seven new league marks.



Before joining the Valdosta State program, Darveau returned to the Sunshine State in 2014 as the Offensive Quality Control Coach at the University of Florida, and he continued to prove his worth after helping lead the UF offense to 12 new offensive records and a Birmingham Bowl victory to close out the year.

Throughout the duration of his coaching career, Darveau has helped train countless All-Americans, three of which he personally developed. In addition, he personally oversaw the development of nine All-Conference student-athletes.







## DAVID ROWE

Defensive Backs Coach First Season at Valdosta State RUTGERS (2012)

David Rowe was named the defensive backs coach for Valdosta State in 2017. He is a 2009 graduate of Rutgers University and served as a three-year starter for the Scarlet Knights, and he has since established himself as a talented football coach at the collegiate level, with a wealth of experience obtained in

a relatively short period of time.

"It's an honor to have this opportunity to work at such a prestigious university," said Rowe. "I look forward to helping our student-athletes continue to be winners both on and off the field."

A former cornerback and safety during his playing career at Rutgers, Rowe transitioned into a coaching career in the summer of 2013 when he joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers by way of the Bill Walsh Minority Internship program. The four-month internship proved to be time well spent, as Rowe was picked up as a Defensive Assistant in September of 2013. His experience with the Bucs included direct work with Tampa Bay Safeties Coach Jeff Hafley.

Following his stint with the Bucs during their 2013 season, Rowe elected to further his education at Western Michigan while serving as a Graduate Assistant Cornerbacks Coach. His work there helped the Broncos



become the number one ranked team in the Mid American Conference in pass efficiency defense. Following his time at Western Michigan, Rowe preceded his new position at Valdosta State as the defensive coordinator at Rockledge High School in Rockledge, Fla.



# WILLIE TILLMAN

Defensive Line Coach First Season at Valdosta State MONTANA (2008)

Willie Tillman, a former four-year letter winner and two year starter as a wide receiver at Purdue University, joins the Blazer football coaching staff in 2017 and brings a veteran presence to Valdosta State after having accumulated nearly 20 years of coaching experience.

Tillman kicked off his coaching career at his alma-mater as an assistant in 1997, and has since coached at multiple colleges and universities, including a recent three-year stint as the defensive coordinator at Florida Tech. As the shot caller for all defensive staff, player personnel, play calling, game planning, and recruiting, Tillman took the program from its inception in 2013, to a winning record in 2014, and then to a second place finish in the Gulf South Conference in 2015. He followed his time at FIT with a head coaching position at Westminster Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., which ultimately led to his recent hire at Valdosta State.

"I am very excited about this opportunity to join the Valdosta State University football program." stated Tillman this week. "I look forward to being a part of TitleTown USA, and I certainly look forward to working with Coach Bell and the VSU football staff."

Tillman's experience as a football coach throughout the years is



made up of a host of highly respected programs at both the collegiate and professional levels. Since starting out as an assistant at Purdue, Tillman has added the Baltimore Ravens, Florida A&M, Murray State, and Bethel University to the list of programs where he has contributed his coaching talents.





# Kerry WEBE

Running Backs/Special Teams First Season at Valdosta State FLORIDA (2004)

Kerry Webb returned to Valdosta State prior to the 2017 season to bring an experienced coaching presence to the Blazers' stable of running backs. Webb has coached at four different collegiate programs, including a previous stint at Valdosta State as a graduate assistant in 2005 and 2006 while pursuing a Masters

in Education Health and Physical Education.

Prior to his first round at Valdosta State, Webb earned his first experience as a student assistant at the University of Florida. On the back end of his time with the Blazers in the mid-2000's, he transitioned into his first full-time coaching position as a running backs coach and special teams coordinator at Jacksonville University. With nearly 10 years of previous experience under the leadership of Kerwin Bell at JU, Webb is expected to bring some welcomed familiarity to the Blazers' coaching staff in 2017.

Notable accomplishments throughout Webb's career include the guidance of the JU running backs in 2010, which led the Sharks' offense to a No. 1 ranking in the country. The squad nearly repeated the feat in 2013 with a No. 5 ranking, and the Sharks ranked 3rd nationally in overall scoring during that same season.

After Bell left JU in 2016, Webb took a job at Tusculum College in



Greeneville, Tenn., where he spent one year as a wide receiver and special teams coach. Webb's tutelage helped produce First Team All South Atlantic Conference honors for return specialist Jay Boyd in 2016.

During his coaching career of over ten years, Webb has coached 11 All-Conference players, and his recruiting efforts led to the signing of two All-Americans and three players who progressed into the NFL.



# Marty McGHIN

Director of Football Operations Second Season at Valdosta State VALDOSTA STATE (2008)

For over a decade, McGhin has been, and continues to be, a key supporter of VSU Athletics. A VSU alum, Marty's financial support has helped to provide scholarship aid for many Blazer student-athletes allowing those student-athletes to reach their potential both as an athlete

and as a student. He currently serves in a key role with the Blazer football program and also serves as the team chaplain for the Blazer basketball team.

In recognition of his immeasurable support and contributions to Valdosta State Athletics, particularly the football program, McGhin was inducted into the VSU Hall of Fame in January of 2017. The football program has placed great faith in his talents and abilities, and McGhin has fully embraced a host of responsibilities as the team's Director of Football Operations. VALDOSTA, Ga. – An impressive start fizzled out for the Blazer football team on Saturday night at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium, but the VSU defense forced some key turnovers down the stretch to give Valdosta State a 40-28 Gulf South Conference win over West Florida.

Former Blazer quarterback Kaleb Nobles, who took a few moments for an emotional gathering at midfield with his former Blazer teammates following the game, completed 21-of-52 passes for the Argonauts on the night with two touchdowns. Ishmel Morrow played a huge part in those numbers with a host of tremendous grabs that led to 156 receiving yards. His 10 receptions marked the most for a Blazer opponent since Darryl Collins of West Alabama hauled in 10 against the Blazers nearly two years ago on October 30, 2014.

The Valdosta State defense was the difference for the Blazers, forcing seven turnovers in the contest and holding the Argonauts to -6 rushing yards, a mark which tied the eighth fewest allowed in the history of Blazer football.

The Argonauts suffered their first-ever conference loss to fall to 2-2 overall and 0-1 in GSC play. Meanwhile, the Blazers improved to 2-1 on the season and evened up their conference record at 1-1.

Minutes later, after being pinned inside their own 20-yard line by Gavin Wilson's 50-yard punt, the Tigers ripped off two big plays for a touchdown, the second of which was a 61-yard rush by Rashaad Lee.
