The Blazers head into a monster rivalry matchup this weekend on the heels of a win and an off-The Blazers head into a monster fivalry matchup this weekend on the heels of a win and an off-week. With a 1-2 overall record and a 1-1 mark in conference play, each victory is monumental at this point for the red and black, and VSU's road to the playoffs continues on Saturday with a trip to Carrollton, Ga. for a showdown with the West Georgia Wolves.

West Georgia is hot coming into the weekend skirmish, with wins in each of the team's last two matchups against Albany State and North Alabama, respectively. The Blazers, meanwhile, showed tremendous improvement in their last matchup and handed West Florida their first loss of the season in a 30-19 Gulf South Conference win on the road in Pensacola, Fla.

Linranked Valdosta State faces a situation similar to that of last year's matchup against LIWG.

Unranked Valdosta State faces a situation similar to that of last year's matchup against UWG, in that VSU comes into the contest as an underdog. West Georgia recently jumped into the fray of nationally ranked teams, as UWG snuck into the AFCA rankings at No. 25. Last season, West Georgia fell as the No. 12 ranked team in the country, thanks in large part to the efforts of the stellar 2016 VSU secondary. Current Indianapolis Colt Kenny Moore picked off one pass with a big return in the contest, and two of this year's returners accounted for the remaining three. Brandon Roe, who already has one interception this season, netted one pick alongside Raymond Palmer, who recorded two interceptions in the game. The defensive effort led to a 38-27 home victory for the Blazers. In addition, Valdosta State's 546 total yards marked the fourth-best all-time offensive performance by the Blazers against their long-time rival performance by the Blazers against their long-time rival.

Last year's win snapped a three-game skid versus West Georgia, including two losses during the 2015 season at University Stadium. Valdosta State's last game in Carrollton, Ga. was a playoff loss in 2015. This year's matchup marks the 37th all-time between the two teams. VSU leads the

series 26-12.

- Valdosta State is now in its 36th year of intercollegiate football and owns an overall record of 273 wins, 123 losses and four ties.
- Just as they will on Saturday, Valdosta State came into last year's matchup against West Georgia as the underdog. The Blazers, ranked No. 25 in the nation at the time, saw everything come together for a convincing 38-27 win over the then-ranked No. 12 Wolves. Valdosta State racked up 546 offensive yards in the contest while holding UWG to just 383 yards of total offense. The Blazers also threw the Wolves out of whack with a strong defensive effort that led to four interceptions and one fumble. which helped lead the Blazers to points in each of the game's four quarters.
- · Saturday's matchup marks the first against the Wolves since former Blazer Head Coach David Dean took over the program prior to the 2017 season. Dean currently represents the all-time wins leader among VSU head coaches throughout the years, with 79 wins at Valdosta State. The tally, achieved over a nine-year span, narrowly edges out Chris Hatcher, who racked up 76 wins in a seven-year head coaching career at VSU.
- Valdosta State's pass defense has been impressive this season. The Black Swarm currently ranks third in the Gulf South Conference in average passing yards allowed per game, giving up just 182.7 yards per contest. The Blazer defense is currently averaging one interception per game with one of those three picks returned for a touchdown by John Marvin two weeks ago against West Florida.

PREVIOUSLY. ON BLAZER FOOTBALL...

The Valdosta State football team took care of business on the road with a big 30-19 Gulf South Conference win over the West Florida Argonauts

on Saturday in Pensacola, Fla.

The Blazers got off to a strong start defensively, holding the Argonauts at bay until the offense ignited midway through the first quarter. After taking over 1st and 10 at their own 20-yard line, the Blazers marched down the field for an impressive drive that ended with an Adam Robles 6-yard scamper into the endzone to cap off a five-plus minute drive for the only scoring play of the first quarter.

As the final seconds ticked away in the first, Robles connected with Travon Roberts for a big 37-yard play, and the momentum carried right over into the second quarter, as Robles delivered to Roberts again for a 25-yard slant just two plays later. The latter play put the Blazers at UWF's 1-yard line, and Ron Johnson put the exclamation point on the drive with a rush around the left side

to put VSU on top 14-0.

The potential play of the game came just moments later on West Florida's ensuing possession, when John Marvin picked off Mike Beaudry deep in Argonaut territory and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown. The pick six put VSU up 21-0 early in the second quarter, and marked the first interception return for Valdosta State since Egim Etta-Tawo brought one back 45 yards against Florida Tech on October 29th last year.

UWF was never able to recover from VSU's early scoring barrage, thanks to a strong defensive effort by Valdosta State's Black Swarm in key moments throughout the rest of the contest. The Blazers came up with several big stops, including a stand late in the first half, when the Argonauts had 1st and goal at the Blazer 8-yard line, but only

came away with a field goal.

West Florida managed to put points on the board on many of their drives throughout the second and third quarter, but were forced to settle for field

goals on each of those occasions. As a result, UWF kicker Austin Williams recorded four unanswered field goals to trim Valdosta State's lead to 21-12 at the 9:12 mark in the third quarter. Williams' four field goals marked the most by a VSU opponent since December 1, 2012, when Curt Duncan of Carson-Newman hit four during the Blazers' 2012 National Championship playoff run.

Robles, who threw for a season high 21 completions and 189 yards in the game, put the dagger in the Argonauts midway through the third quarter, when he connected with Dallas Baldner on a fade route for a 20-yard touchdown. The reception marked Baldner's first touchdown catch of the season and put the Blazers out of reach with

a 28-12 advantage.

West Florida finished the scoring on the night with their only touchdown of the game when Beaudry hooked up with Gage Krull for a 15-yard score with just 29 seconds left in the game.

erwin Bell is set to begin his second season at the helm of the Valdosta State football program, aiming to follow a strong 2016 outing during which he led the Blazers to their sixth playoff appearance in the last eight years.

In 2016, Bell picked up right where his predecessor left off and overcame an abbreviated recruiting season to navigate the Blazers to an 8-3 record. His offense-driven approach to the game paid dividends for VSU, as the team earned hosting rights for the first round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Furthermore, Bell's defense was a force to be reckoned with, as the program's secondary led the nation with 27 interceptions.

Bell, a Mayo, Fla. native and graduate of Lafayette County High School, brought extensive coaching experience to Valdosta State in 2016 after having coached at Jacksonville University for nine years, while leading the NCAA Football Championship Series program to a 66-35 record during his time there. Under his direction, the Dolphins won two Pioneer Football League championships, set a PFL record with 16 consecutive wins, and led the team to the best record in school history during the Dolphins' 10-1 run in 2010.

His responsibilities at JU included roles as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, which produced a highpowered offense that led to big numbers in each of his nine seasons. During the aforementioned 2010 PFL championship season, Jacksonville led the nation in total offense with an average of 486 yards per game and also in scoring with an average of 42.2 points per game.

Bell's coaching experience dates back to 1990, when he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida, where he also played from 1983-87 while earning a Psychology degree and serving as the team's quarterback. In his four years as a Gator, Bell constructed a career that consisted of an SEC Freshman of the Year honor in 1984 after leading the Gators to a 9-1-1 record. He accumulated 7,586 career passing yards and 56 touchdowns in his time at Florida, which ultimately landed him in the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

After completing a professional playing career in the 1990's that included time in the National Football League, the Canadian Football League, and the World League of American Football, Bell returned to a coaching career as an offensive coordinator for the Toronto Argonauts, where he served for two seasons before

coaching at Trinity Catholic High School in Ocala, Fla. until his time began at JU, where he posted 9-2 records in both 2014 and 2015.



Bell's collegiate playing career started at the University of Florida with 18 wins and just two losses during his freshman and sophomore seasons. His performance during those two years led to a Southeastern Conference Player of the Year award as a freshman in 1984, and he earned First-Team All-SEC honors the following year in 1985. In his four years as a Gator, Bell threw for 7,585 yards and 56 touchdowns. He was inducted into the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 as a "Gator Great", and In 2006, The Gainesville Sun sportswriters placed him No. 26 on the list of 100 greatest Gators of all time. Bell went on to play professionally in both the NFL and the CFL.

DANNY **VERPAELE**

Defensive Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State University of South Florida (2008)

Danny Verpaele officially joined the Valdosta State coaching staff as a linebackers coach on April 18 of 2016, and was promoted to the position of Defensive Coordinator prior to the start of the 2017 season.

Verpaele came to Valdosta State after two seasons as an assistant coach at Army

West Point. During his tenure at the United States Military Academy in West Point, N.Y., he acquired a significant amount of recruiting experience, particularly in the southeast, with time spent in Texas, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Louisiana, Arkansas, and Mississippi.

"Coach Verpaele is a very knowledgeable guy, but he also brings a lot of juice, or energy, as we say, to our practices and our games," said Head Coach Kerwin Bell.

Verpaele spent time as a member of Coach Bell's staff at Jacksonville University prior to his position at Army, working under Coach Bell as an assistant defensive coach with a primary focus on defensive backs. In 2012, his work at JU produced a defensive unit that ranked No. 1 in pass defense and total defense in the Pioneer Football League.

Success at JU led to a graduate assistant coaching position at Mississippi State in 2013, where Verpaele worked at the linebackers position and helped lead the Bulldogs to a No. 18 national ranking on defense. In addition, he helped guide sophomore Bernardrick McKinney to All-American honors and he helped develop New England Patriot free agent Deontae Skinner.



Prior to Jacksonville University, Verpaele kicked off his coaching career at Virginia Military Institute as an assistant coach in 2009, and he posted a three-year letterman career as a strong safety at the University of South Florida from 2004-08.

"[Verpaele] is a guy who brings great energy, who gets after it, and who gets his players to play at a very high level," added Bell. "He's a great addition to our staff and is going to bring a lot to the table."



JEREMY DARVEAU

Offensive Line/Recruiting Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State Louisville (2008)

Bringing a wealth of coaching knowledge and eight years of experience to the Valdosta State program, Jeremy Darveau was named the Offensive Line coach for the Blazers in 2015.

While earning a Sociology Bachelors of Science Degree, Darveau put together

an impressive collegiate career at the University of Louisville. Following four successful years at the Division I level, he added to his on-field experience with the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe and closed out his playing career with one year in the Arena 1 Football League as a member of the Tampa Bay Storm.

In 2008, Darveau began his coaching career at Southwest Minnesota State, where he served as a Tight End and Running Backs Graduate Assistant Coach for two years while earning a Masters Degree in Business Administration. His efforts with the program resulted in a full-time job as the Offensive Coordinator and Offensive Line Coach through the 2013 season, in which the Mustangs earned their first-ever bowl appearance. During his tenure at SMSU, Darveau helped his players rewrite both the school and conference record books with over 40 new offensive records with the program and seven new league marks.



Before joining the Valdosta State program, Darveau returned to the Sunshine State in 2014 as the Offensive Quality Control Coach at the University of Florida, and he continued to prove his worth after helping lead the UF offense to 12 new offensive records and a Birmingham Bowl victory to close out the year.

Throughout the duration of his coaching career, Darveau has helped train countless All-Americans, three of which he personally developed. In addition, he personally oversaw the development of nine All-Conference student-athletes.







DAVID ROWE

Defensive Backs Coach First Season at Valdosta State Rutgers (2012)

David Rowe was named the defensive backs coach for Valdosta State in 2017. He is a 2009 graduate of Rutgers University and served as a three-year starter for the Scarlet Knights, and he has since established himself as a talented football coach at the collegiate level, with a wealth of experience obtained in

a relatively short period of time.

"It's an honor to have this opportunity to work at such a prestigious university," said Rowe. "I look forward to helping our student-athletes continue to be winners both on and off the field."

A former cornerback and safety during his playing career at Rutgers, Rowe transitioned into a coaching career in the summer of 2013 when he joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers by way of the Bill Walsh Minority Internship program. The four-month internship proved to be time well spent, as Rowe was picked up as a Defensive Assistant in September of 2013. His experience with the Bucs included direct work with Tampa Bay Safeties Coach Jeff Hafley.

Following his stint with the Bucs during their 2013 season, Rowe elected to further his education at Western Michigan while serving as a Graduate Assistant Cornerbacks Coach. His work there helped the Broncos



become the number one ranked team in the Mid American Conference in pass efficiency defense. Following his time at Western Michigan, Rowe preceded his new position at Valdosta State as the defensive coordinator at Rockledge High School in Rockledge, Fla.



WILLIE TILLMAN

Defensive Line Coach First Season at Valdosta State Purdue (1997)

Willie Tillman, a former four-year letter winner and two year starter as a wide receiver at Purdue University, joins the Blazer football coaching staff in 2017 and brings a veteran presence to Valdosta State after having accumulated nearly 20 years of coaching experience.

Tillman kicked off his coaching career at his alma-mater as an assistant in 1997, and has since coached at multiple colleges and universities, including a recent three-year stint as the defensive coordinator at Florida Tech. As the shot caller for all defensive staff, player personnel, play calling, game planning, and recruiting, Tillman took the program from its inception in 2013, to a winning record in 2014, and then to a second place finish in the Gulf South Conference in 2015. He followed his time at FIT with a head coaching position at Westminster Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., which ultimately led to his recent hire at Valdosta State.

"I am very excited about this opportunity to join the Valdosta State University football program." stated Tillman this week. "I look forward to being a part of TitleTown USA, and I certainly look forward to working with Coach Bell and the VSU football staff."

Tillman's experience as a football coach throughout the years is



made up of a host of highly respected programs at both the collegiate and professional levels. Since starting out as an assistant at Purdue, Tillman has added the Baltimore Ravens, Florida A&M, Murray State, and Bethel University to the list of programs where he has contributed his coaching talents.





Kerry WEBB

Running Backs/Special Teams First Season at Valdosta State Florida (2004)

Kerry Webb returned to Valdosta State prior to the 2017 season to bring an experienced coaching presence to the Blazers' stable of running backs. Webb has coached at four different collegiate programs, including a previous stint at Valdosta State as a graduate assistant in 2005 and 2006 while pursuing a Masters

in Education Health and Physical Education.

Prior to his first round at Valdosta State, Webb earned his first experience as a student assistant at the University of Florida. On the back end of his time with the Blazers in the mid-2000's, he transitioned into his first full-time coaching position as a running backs coach and special teams coordinator at Jacksonville University. With nearly 10 years of previous experience under the leadership of Kerwin Bell at JU, Webb is expected to bring some welcomed familiarity to the Blazers' coaching staff in 2017.

Notable accomplishments throughout Webb's career include the guidance of the JU running backs in 2010, which led the Sharks' offense to a No. 1 ranking in the country. The squad nearly repeated the feat in 2013 with a No. 5 ranking, and the Sharks ranked 3rd nationally in overall scoring during that same season.

After Bell left JU in 2016, Webb took a job at Tusculum College in



Greeneville, Tenn., where he spent one year as a wide receiver and special teams coach. Webb's tutelage helped produce First Team All South Atlantic Conference honors for return specialist Jay Boyd in 2016.

During his coaching career of over ten years, Webb has coached 11 All-Conference players, and his recruiting efforts led to the signing of two All-Americans and three players who progressed into the NFL.



Marty McGHIN


Director of Football Operations Second Season at Valdosta State Valdosta State

ALBANY, Ga. – The Valdosta State football team suffered a 29-12 loss to the Albany State Golden Rams on Saturday night in Albany, Ga., marking the Blazers' first loss in a season opener since the 2012 National Championship campaign.

The Blazers struggled to find rhythm offensively, due in large part to the effort of the Albany State defense, which gave the Golden Rams a defensive score within the first three minutes of the game for a lead they would never relinquish.

The loss for VSU represented their second all-time to the Golden Rams, with the Blazers' only other loss in the series taking place in the 2004 season opener. Later that same season, Valdosta State went on to defeat ASU in the playoffs en route to the program's first ever national championship.
