What a difference a week makes. Just when it looked like the Valdosta State football team was out of the playoff hunt, the Blazers traveled to Mississippi and handily defeated the then-ranked No. 19 Statesmen of Delta State. That win, along with Florida Tech's win over top-ranked West Alabama, have placed VSU right back in the thick of the GSC race.

Valdosta State's resurgence began two weeks ago with a dominant 55-3 win over Mississippi College, and the momentum carried full force into the Delta State matchup, where the Blazers rolled into Cleveland and torched the Statesmen in a 34-13 victory. In the last two weeks, Valdosta State has found tremendous success in their running game. Led by senior Jordan Germany's average of 7.8 yards per carry, the Blazers have racked up 411 rushing yards over the last two games for an average of 205.5 yards per game and six total touchdowns. In contrast, the Black Swarm did not allow MC or DSU to score on the ground and under 300 yards of total offense, on average

Another huge factor of success for the Blazer defense since the loss to West Georgia has been turnovers forced. All total, Valdosta State has forced seven turnovers in the last two games, including five interceptions and two fumbles recovered. Last week alone, the Blazers used those

turnovers to account for 24 of the team's 34 points.

This weekend, the red and black will aim to avenge last year's difficult loss to Florida Tech, in which the Panthers took down VSU for the first time ever with a 38-20 victory in Melbourne, Fla. This year's showdown marks the fourth all-time between the two teams, with Valdosta State holding a 3-1 edge in the series. The Panthers will enter Saturday's contest with momentum of their own, thanks to a massive 41-39 upset of conference leading West Alabama Tigers. FIT's win over UWA marked the Tigers' first conference loss of the season.

- · Valdosta State is now in its 36th year of intercollegiate football and owns an overall record of 275 wins, 124 losses and four ties.
- Last year's matchup between the Panthers and the Blazers made for an exciting evening, as the Blazers overcame an early deficit to tie the contest up at 17-17 less than 20 seconds into the fourth quarter. FIT's 21 fourth quarter points proved to be the difference, giving FIT their first ever win over the Blazers. Valdosta State struggled to find an answer for running back Antwuan Haynes, who is currently in his junior season. As a sophomore last year, Haynes rushed for 197 yards on 28 attempts with one touchdown. Valdosta State was held to just 249 yards of offense against 505 for the Panthers
- Junior punter Gavin Wilson earned Valdosta State their first Gulf South Conference Player of the Week honor as the Special Teams selection in recognition of his effort last weekend against Delta State. In the game, Wilson saw six opportunities and used three of those to pin the Statesmen inside the 20-yard line. The Thomasville, Ga. native averaged 43.1 yards per punt, one of which was a 55-yard boomer in the third quarter to help prevent DSU from gaining any second quarter momentum.
- The Gulf South Conference standings have taken an interesting turn after last weekend's results, thanks in large part to FIT's 41-39 win over UWA. As it stands, six teams now have two losses thus far in 2017. Delta State's four wins place them half of a game over five teams that are tied for third with 3-2 conference records. West Alabama continues to reign in the top spot with a 5-1 GSC record.

CLEVELAND, *Tenn.* - Valdosta State put together

cleveland, *Tenn.* - Valdosta State put together their second consecutive solid performance, resulting in a dominant 34-13 Gulf South Conference win over the Delta State Statesmen on Saturday afternoon in Cleveland, Miss.

Turnovers were the difference for the red and black, as the Black Swarm forced Delta State to throw three interceptions and fumble the ball once early. Valdosta State capitalized on all four turnovers, turning three into touchdowns and one into a field goal for 24 of their 34 points

After forcing the Blazers to go three-and-out on their opening drive, the Statesmen appeared to have momentum, as they marched the ball down to the VSU 5-yard line. The game shifted early, however, when a fumble by Breck Ruddick was scooped up and carried 95 yards by Alex Williams for a Blazer touchdown. The recovery for the score put the Blazers in front 7-0 and marked Valdosta State's second touchdown of the season on a fumble return on a fumble return.

On DSU's ensuing drive, Ruddick committed another turnover when he tested Donte Taylor on a deep ball down the left side of the field. Taylor was up to the challenge and went up high over the top of the intended receiver to haul in Valdosta State's first interception of the game.

With possession at their own 12-yard line Ro-

With possession at their own 12-yard line, Rogan Wells broke off his first big play of the game with a 39-yard rush. The freshman quarterback proceeded to find Dallas Baldner for a 35-yard completion, and after two incompletions, Brian Saunds hauled in a 14-yard pass in the back of the endzone for his fourth touchdown of the season to put the Blazers up 14-0.

The only touchdown for the Blazers that didn't come off of a turnover came early in the second quarter, when Jordan Germany used some strong blocking to slip through the middle and turn on the

blocking to slip through the middle and turn on the jets for a 56-yard scoring rush. The strike for Germany helped boost the senior's total to 77-yards in the game, which led the Blazers on the afternoon. Trailing 24-3 after halftime, thanks to a 45-yard field goal by Andrew Gray at the end of the first half, Delta State attempted to fire back on their opening drive in the third quarter. The Statesmen used an 18-play drive to put the ball inside VSU's 10-yard line, but the Black Swarm held tough and forced the Statesmen to settle for another field goal

The Blazers went three-and-out on the ensuing drive, but got the ball right back thanks to an interception by Decary Croaker. Wells and Saunds teamed up again for a 33-yard pass play on the following drive to fuel Valdosta State's final touchdown drive of the contest and essentially seal the victory with a 31-6 advantage late in the third.

With the win, the Blazers propelled themselves back into the playoff hunt as one of four teams to be currently tied for third place in the Gulf South Conference. Valdosta State now holds a record of 3-3 overall and 3-2 in conference play, while the Statesmen fell into second place outright at 6-2 overall and 4-2 against league opponents.

Notable statistics for the afternoon included Germany's aforementioned 77-yard rushing effort,

Germany's aforementioned 77-yard rushing effort, while Saunds led the receiving corps with three receptions and 68-yards. In addition, Wells rushed for 45 yards and delivered 233 passing yards in the game.

erwin Bell is set to begin his second season at the helm of the Valdosta State football program, aiming to follow a strong 2016 outing during which he led the Blazers to their sixth playoff appearance in the last eight years.

In 2016, Bell picked up right where his predecessor left off and overcame an abbreviated recruiting season to navigate the Blazers to an 8-3 record. His offense-driven approach to the game paid dividends for VSU, as the team earned hosting rights for the first round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Furthermore, Bell's defense was a force to be reckoned with, as the program's secondary led the nation with 27 interceptions.

Bell, a Mayo, Fla. native and graduate of Lafayette County High School, brought extensive coaching experience to Valdosta State in 2016 after having coached at Jacksonville University for nine years, while leading the NCAA Football Championship Series program to a 66-35 record during his time there. Under his direction, the Dolphins won two Pioneer Football League championships, set a PFL record with 16 consecutive wins, and led the team to the best record in school history during the Dolphins' 10-1 run in 2010.

His responsibilities at JU included roles as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, which produced a highpowered offense that led to big numbers in each of his nine seasons. During the aforementioned 2010 PFL championship season, Jacksonville led the nation in total offense with an average of 486 yards per game and also in scoring with an average of 42.2 points per game.

Bell's coaching experience dates back to 1990, when he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida, where he also played from 1983-87 while earning a Psychology degree and serving as the team's quarterback. In his four years as a Gator, Bell constructed a career that consisted of an SEC Freshman of the Year honor in 1984 after leading the Gators to a 9-1-1 record. He accumulated 7,586 career passing yards and 56 touchdowns in his time at Florida, which ultimately landed him in the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

After completing a professional playing career in the 1990's that included time in the National Football League, the Canadian Football League, and the World League of American Football, Bell returned to a coaching career as an offensive coordinator for the Toronto Argonauts, where

he served for two seasons before coaching at Trinity Catholic High School in Ocala, Fla. until his time began at JU, where he posted 9-2 records in both 2014 and 2015.



Bell's collegiate playing career started at the University of Florida with 18 wins and just two losses during his freshman and sophomore seasons. His performance during those two years led to a Southeastern Conference Player of the Year award as a freshman in 1984, and he earned First-Team All-SEC honors the following year in 1985. In his four years as a Gator, Bell threw for 7,585 yards and 56 touchdowns. He was inducted into the UF Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 as a "Gator Great", and In 2006, The Gainesville Sun sportswriters placed him No. 26 on the list of 100 greatest Gators of all time. Bell went on to play professionally in both the NFL and the CFL.

DANNY VERPAELE

Defensive Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State University of South Florida (2008)

Danny Verpaele officially joined the Valdosta State coaching staff as a linebackers coach on April 18 of 2016, and was promoted to the position of Defensive Coordinator prior to the start of the 2017 season.


Verpaele came to Valdosta State after two seasons as an assistant coach at Army

West Point. During his tenure at the United States Military Academy in West Point, N.Y., he acquired a significant amount of recruiting experience, particularly in the southeast, with time spent in Texas, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Louisiana, Arkansas, and Mississippi.

"Coach Verpaele is a very knowledgeable guy, but he also brings a lot of juice, or energy, as we say, to our practices and our games," said Head Coach Kerwin Bell.

Verpaele spent time as a member of Coach Bell's staff at Jacksonville University prior to his position at Army, working under Coach Bell as an assistant defensive coach with a primary focus on defensive backs. In 2012, his work at JU produced a defensive unit that ranked No. 1 in pass defense and total defense in the Pioneer Football League.

Success at JU led to a graduate assistant coaching position at Mississippi State in 2013, where Verpaele worked at the linebackers position and helped lead the Bulldogs to a No. 18 national ranking on defense. In addition, he helped guide sophomore Bernardrick McKinney to All-American honors and he helped develop New England Patriot free agent Deontae Skinner.



Prior to Jacksonville University, Verpaele kicked off his coaching career at Virginia Military Institute as an assistant coach in 2009, and he posted a three-year letterman career as a strong safety at the University of South Florida from 2004-08.

"[Verpaele] is a guy who brings great energy, who gets after it, and who gets his players to play at a very high level," added Bell. "He's a great addition to our staff and is going to bring a lot to the table."



JEREMY DARVEAU

Offensive Line / Recruiting Coordinator Second Season at Valdosta State Louisville (2008)

Bringing a wealth of coaching knowledge and eight years of experience to the Valdosta State program, Jeremy Darveau was named the Offensive Line coach for the Blazers in 2015.

While earning a Sociology Bachelors of Science Degree, Darveau put together

an impressive collegiate career at the University of Louisville. Following four successful years at the Division I level, he added to his on-field experience with the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe and closed out his playing career with one year in the Arena 1 Football League as a member of the Tampa Bay Storm.

In 2008, Darveau began his coaching career at Southwest Minnesota State, where he served as a Tight End and Running Backs Graduate Assistant Coach for two years while earning a Masters Degree in Business Administration. His efforts with the program resulted in a full-time job as the Offensive Coordinator and Offensive Line Coach through the 2013 season, in which the Mustangs earned their first-ever bowl appearance. During his tenure at SMSU, Darveau helped his players rewrite both the school and conference record books with over 40 new offensive records with the program and seven new league marks.



Before joining the Valdosta State program, Darveau returned to the Sunshine State in 2014 as the Offensive Quality Control Coach at the University of Florida, and he continued to prove his worth after helping lead the UF offense to 12 new offensive records and a Birmingham Bowl victory to close out the year.

Throughout the duration of his coaching career, Darveau has helped train countless All-Americans, three of which he personally developed. In addition, he personally oversaw the development of nine All-Conference student-athletes.





DAVID ROWE

Defensive Backs Coach First Season at Valdosta State Rutgers (2012)

David Rowe was named the defensive backs coach for Valdosta State in 2017. He is a 2009 graduate of Rutgers University and served as a three-year starter for the Scarlet Knights, and he has since established himself as a talented football coach at the collegiate level, with a wealth of experience obtained in

a relatively short period of time.

"It's an honor to have this opportunity to work at such a prestigious university," said Rowe. "I look forward to helping our student-athletes continue to be winners both on and off the field."

A former cornerback and safety during his playing career at Rutgers, Rowe transitioned into a coaching career in the summer of 2013 when he joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers by way of the Bill Walsh Minority Internship program. The four-month internship proved to be time well spent, as Rowe was picked up as a Defensive Assistant in September of 2013. His experience with the Bucs included direct work with Tampa Bay Safeties Coach Jeff Hafley.

Following his stint with the Bucs during their 2013 season, Rowe elected to further his education at Western Michigan while serving as a Graduate Assistant Cornerbacks Coach. His work there helped the Broncos

WILLIE TILLMAN

Defensive Line Coach First Season at Valdosta State Purdue (1997)

Willie Tillman, a former four-year letter winner and two year starter as a wide receiver at Purdue University, joins the Blazer football coaching staff in 2017 and brings a veteran presence to Valdosta State after having accumulated nearly 20 years of coaching experience.

Tillman kicked off his coaching career at his alma-mater as an assistant in 1997, and has since coached at multiple colleges and universities, including a recent three-year stint as the defensive coordinator at Florida Tech. As the shot caller for all defensive staff, player personnel, play calling, game planning, and recruiting, Tillman took the program from its inception in 2013, to a winning record in 2014, and then to a second place finish in the Gulf South Conference in 2015. He followed his time at FIT with a head coaching position at Westminster Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., which ultimately led to his recent hire at Valdosta State.

"I am very excited about this opportunity to join the Valdosta State University football program." stated Tillman this week. "I look forward to being a part of TitleTown USA, and I certainly look forward to working with Coach Bell and the VSU football staff."

Since starting out as an assistant at Purdue, Tillman has added the Baltimore Ravens, Florida A&M, Murray State, and Bethel University to the list of programs where he has contributed his coaching talents.





Kerry WEBB

Running Backs/Special Teams First Season at Valdosta State Florida (2004)

Kerry Webb returned to Valdosta State prior to the 2017 season to bring an experienced coaching presence to the Blazers' stable of running backs. Webb has coached at four different collegiate programs, including a previous stint at Valdosta State as a graduate assistant in 2005 and 2006 while pursuing a Masters

in Education Health and Physical Education.

Prior to his first round at Valdosta State, Webb earned his first experience as a student assistant at the University of Florida. On the back end of his time with the Blazers in the mid-2000's, he transitioned into his first full-time coaching position as a running backs coach and special teams coordinator at Jacksonville University. With nearly 10 years of previous experience under the leadership of Kerwin Bell at JU, Webb is expected to bring some welcomed familiarity to the Blazers' coaching staff in 2017.

Notable accomplishments throughout Webb's career include the guidance of the JU running backs in 2010, which led the Sharks' offense to a No. 1 ranking in the country. The squad nearly repeated the feat in 2013 with a No. 5 ranking, and the Sharks ranked 3rd nationally in overall scoring during that same season.

After Bell left JU in 2016, Webb took a job at Tusculum College in



Greeneville, Tenn., where he spent one year as a wide receiver and special teams coach. Webb's tutelage helped produce First Team All South Atlantic Conference honors for return specialist Jay Boyd in 2016.

During his coaching career of over ten years, Webb has coached 11 All-Conference players, and his recruiting efforts led to the signing of two All-Americans and three players who progressed into the NFL.



Marty McGHIN

Director of Football Operations Second Season at Valdosta State Valdosta State

For over a decade, McGhin has been, and continues to be, a key supporter of VSU Athletics. A VSU alum, Marty's financial support has helped to provide scholarship aid for many Blazer student-athletes allowing those student-athletes to reach their potential both as an athlete

and as a student. He currently serves in a key role with the Blazer football program and also serves as the team chaplain for the Blazer basketball team.

In recognition of his immeasurable support and contributions to Valdosta State Athletics, particularly the football program, McGhin was inducted into the VSU Hall of Fame in January of 2017. The football program has placed great faith in his talents and abilities, and McGhin has fully embraced a host of responsibilities as the team's Director of Football Operations. McGhin plays a large role in many key areas of day-to-day operations, including travel arrangements, scheduling, meals, and much more. Most impressive of all, is that fact that McGhin takes on all of these responsibilities on a complete volunteer basis.
