QUICK NOTES:

- Valdosta State is currently averaging 87.5 points per game. That average places the team nearly 10 points higher than last year's average and ranks the squad 1st in the Gulf South Conference and 22nd in the country.
- Valdosta State entered the NABC D2 Poll at No. 24 two weeks ago, but fell back into the "receiving votes" camp after a loss to Delta State on February 4th. The Blazers returned to the rankings this week, coming in at No. 25
- Head Coach Mike Helfer picked up the 400th win of his collegiate coaching career with a win over Delta State on January 19th. In addition, the veteran's double-overtime victory over Mississippi College on the road two weeks ago marked Helfer's 100th career GSC victory.
- Thursday night's showdown marks the second of the season between the Blazers and the Chargers. Alabama-Huntsville defeated Valdosta State 82-72 in that matchup, resulting in Valdosta State's only home loss of the 2016-17 season. The Blazers have met 51 times in the history of the two programs, with the Blazers holding a slight 26-25 edge in the all-time series.
- Regional implications loom large this week with the first release of the NCAA regional rankings . Valdosta State falls in at No. 2, while tonight's opponent, UAH, lands at No. 1. In addition, the two teams currently sit in a first place tie in the Gulf South Conference standings.

HEAD COACH MIKE HELFER

**12TH SEASON
CAPITAL, 1989**



Entering his 12th year with Valdosta State, Mike Helfer has established himself as one of the top coaches in the nation. After all, in his first 11 years, he has compiled a 201-119 record, including winning seasons in nine of his 11 years, and repeatedly established his program as one of the most exciting teams in the Gulf South Conference, South Region, and nationwide.

The Blazers returned to form in 2015-16 with a 17-11 overall record and a 13-9 conference record. The season included a slew of near-misses, as VSU took teams into overtime seven times and fell in five of those hard-fought contests. Valdosta State's run last season led to a return to the Gulf South Conference Tournament, marking Helfer's 10th appearance in the playoffs as a head coach at VSU.

Helfer's plan for the Valdosta State program nearly reached its pinnacle in 2009-10 as his team advanced further than any squad in school history. En route to advancing to the national quarterfinals, Helfer directed his team to a school record 28 victories, against just five defeats, and claimed a share of the program's second straight Gulf South Conference East Division title. The Blazers reached as high as No. 2 in the national polls during the year, the highest VSU has ever been ranked nationally, and twice defeated the No. 1 team in the nation, the first incident coming in an 81-75 victory over Augusta State during the regular season and the second occurring when Valdosta State defeated Arkansas Tech 72-60 in the semifinals of the NCAA South Region Tournament. The 28 victories on the year marked the second-highest win total in a single season for Helfer in his 13-year coaching career.

Personal honors were handed out to various Blazers at the conclusion of the season, led by Tyrone Curnell who was named the Gulf South Conference and South Region Player of the Year while earning All-America honors for the second straight season. Helfer shared the GSC East Division Coach of the Year honors, earning the award for the second straight year. Ricardo Lewis was also honored by the Gulf South Conference as he joined Curnell on the first All-Conference squad.

The single season wins record was not the only Blazer school record to fall during the season as Valdosta State also established a new school mark for points in a season, finishing the year with 2,666 to surpass the old mark of 2,591 set during the 1967 season. The aggressive Blazers also established a new school mark of free throw attempts in a season, tallying 812 attempts on the year, while Curnell set the individual record in both free throws made and free throw attempts, connecting on 156-of-226 attempts on the season to best both old school marks by two. Valdosta State fell just one win shy of tying the school record for consecutive victories in a season as it went 15 games, a stretch that lasted from December 15 until February 18, without losing a contest.

The success of the 2009-10 season was not an overnight occurrence

as Helfer spent four years prior to that year establishing the Blazers as one of the top school in the NCAA Division II ranks. His first four years with Valdosta State saw his teams play in a pair of NCAA South Region Tournaments while the Blazers won the Gulf South Conference East Division title in 2008-09, just the third time in school history that the Blazers finished first in the league's division.

Helfer's ability to teach the game of basketball was never more evident than the 2008-09 season, when in addition to the GSC East Division title and a NCAA South Regional appearance, he led his squad to a 24-7 record, despite losing four starters from the previous year. The squad, which featured 10 new players, went 9-3 in conference play and advanced to the championship game of the league tournament. Helfer's direction helped several Blazers earn individual honors, led by Curnell, who earned All-America status from the National Association of Basketball Coaches while also being named to the All-Gulf South Conference squad. Curnell and Lewis each earned GSC All-Tournament honors during the season while Helfer was named the GSC East Division Coach of the Year at the conclusion of the season.

Helfer turned in perhaps his finest coaching performance the year after the magical 2009-10 season as he again directed his squad to a 20-win season, despite having to completely retol and reload his squad after massive losses from the previous year's team. The 2010-11 Valdosta State team lost nine out of the 12 players that led the team to the 2009-10 Elite Eight, which accounted for 78.3 percent of the team's scoring and 83.0 percent of its rebounding.

With an entirely new squad, Helfer led his squad to a 21-9 record and a second place finish in the GSC's East Division. Two Blazers, Kevin Harris and Christian Hunter, earned All-Gulf South Conference honors while the team tallied 277 three-pointers on the season, a new school record. The 21 victories gave Valdosta State its third straight season of 20 or more wins, marking just the second time in school history VSU accomplished that feat, with the other occurrence coming during between 1965 and 1968.

After going 11-16 in 2011-12, Helfer once again proved his ability as a team builder as he returned just one player for his 2012-13 squad. The job Helfer turned in during his seventh year was nothing short of masterful as he molded a collection of new players into a team that improved with each passing game. The 2012-13 Blazers finished the year with a 19-10 record, including a 9-9 mark in GSC play, but saved their best for last as they charged through the GSC Tournament, including an upset of sixth-ranked Alabama-Huntsville, before falling 65-62 to Christian Brothers in the Championship game.

Three Blazers earned All-Gulf South Conference honors at the end of the 2012-13 season, including Josh Sparks, who earned All-Region honors after setting a new VSU and GSC record with 100 blocks on the season. He was joined on the All-GSC team by guard Patrick Diop and forward James Anacreon.

Helfer inherited a team that averaged 68.0 points a game in 2004-05 and led it to a 17-11 mark while averaging 83.5 points a game in 2005-06, his first season at the helm of the Blazers. Helfer's first squad went 7-7 in Gulf South Conference play and finished tied for fourth in the league's East Division. Two of Helfer's players, Jon Rogers (First) and Michael Crane (Second), were named to the All-GSC team while Rogers also earned All-GSC Tournament honors after VSU advanced to the tournament's quarterfinals.

Blazers Blow by Wildcats in Season Opener

Valdosta State Wins, 85-72

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Blazers raced out of the gate and never looked back for a convincing 85-72 triumph over the Fort Valley State Wildcats in the squad's season opener on Friday night in Fort Valley, Ga.

The Blazers could do no wrong early in the contest and blistered the Wildcats in the opening minutes to open up a 25-point advantage. Fort Valley leveled off late in the opening period, however, and used the three ball to make a run late in the first half and narrow the deficit to 49-34 at intermission.

Valdosta State made the necessary adjustments at halftime to slow down FVSU's long range attack, and the two teams traded buckets throughout the majority of the second half. Valdosta State's lead proved to be insurmountable, allowing the Blazers to secure the victory in the non-conference showdown.

The key difference came at the charity stripe, where FVSU shot just 12-of-27. In contrast, the Blazers shot 76.7 percent with a 23-of-30 performance.

Four Blazers reached double-digit figures in the scoring column, and Jeremiah Hill and Damian Young paced the effort with 18 points. In addition, five different VSU players hauled in seven or more rebounds. Hill led in the rebounding column as well and nearly missed a double-double after notching a team-high 18 rebounds.

Blazers Outlast Golden Rams

Valdosta State Wins, 88-80

FORT VALLEY, Ga. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team outlasted Albany State for a tightly contested, 88-80 non-conference victory over the Golden Rams in Fort Valley, Ga. late Saturday afternoon.

With the win, the Blazers improved to 2-0 on the young season. Meanwhile, the Golden Rams dropped to 0-2.

In the first half, the Blazers led during a majority of the frame, although the score remained very tight throughout. Valdosta State looked as though they might break away after Jimmy Kodet delivered a three point play at the 11:11 mark to spark an 8-2 run and give VSU a 27-18 lead.

Albany State fired right back, however, and answered with a 13-4 run over the course of the next seven minutes to knot the contest back up at 31-31. The race to intermission was neck-and-neck, but the Blazers entered the break with a slight advantage at 42-41.

The first ten minutes of the second half featured seven ties and a slight advantage for Albany State, as they led for a majority of the stretch. The Blazers found their mark, however, after using a jumper by Sheldon Zaboltny to take a 67-65 lead with 9:12 to go in regulation. Zaboltny's bucket put Valdosta State's offense back on track and cued up a 15-6 run that would put VSU in front for good.

Saadiq Muhammad served as the primary force on the attack for VSU and recorded eight rebounds to go along with a team-high 20 points. The senior shot 9-for-14 in the game and complemented the efforts of Zaboltny, Jeremiah Hill, and Carlos Beverly, who scored 19, 16, and 11 points respectively.

Valdosta State shot over 51 percent from the field in the game and used 22 putback points on 15 offensive rebounds to help offset ASU's gritty effort.

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team thrived in their hometown environment on Monday night and relished their home opener after outshining the Southeastern Fire in a 111-83 win in Valdosta, Ga. at The Complex.

Sophomore Beau Justice set the tone less than 20 seconds into the contest with a three ball from the right side to give VSU a 3-0 advantage, and both Josh Lemons and Jeremiah Hill followed suit on the next two possessions with a pair of three balls that gave the Blazers a 9-0 lead just over one minute after the opening tip.

The early offensive onslaught was a sign of things to come throughout the night, as the Blazers used 15 long balls and a sparkling 46.9 shooting percentage from long range to maintain a comfortable advantage throughout the evening.

Justice and Saadiq Muhammad averaged for 52 of VSU's 111 points in the game, as each scored 26 points. The pair racked up their big numbers in very different ways, however, as Justice used an 8-for-11 performance from the three point line, and Muhammad tallied most of his points on a 12-for-14 performance from close range.

In the game, the Blazers shot 58.1 percent from the field on a 43-of-74 effort, and ten different players helped contribute to the offensive attack. In addition, Valdosta State outrebounded the Fire 37 to 29, all while committing just 12 turnovers.

The only downside for VSU came at the free throw line, where the Blazers shot just 10-of-18. Head Coach Mike Helfer's squad overcame the slip at the charity stripe, however, with 11 steals to complement the aforementioned offensive barrage.

Other top performers in the contest included Lemons, who posted 19 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and 4-of-5 shooting from the line, along with Jimmy Kodet, who poured in 16 points on a 7-of-9 shooting effort from the field.

The win lifted VSU to 3-0 on the year, while Southeastern saw their record drop to 2-3 overall.

Offensive Onslaught Leads VSU to Victory Valdosta State Wins, 101-93

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team delivered another impressive offensive outing and eclipsed the 100 point mark for the second straight game to pick up an important South Region victory over the Lynn Fighting Knights at the Palm Beach Atlantic Thanksgiving Classic on Saturday in West Palm Beach, Fla.

Momentum shifted in Lynn's favor after the break, as Lynn allowed one quick bucket by Saadiq Muhammad before stringing together a four-minute run during which the Fighting Knights scored 13 unanswered points. The stretch pulled Lynn to within five points, but Jeremiah Hill snapped the stretch with a vengeance when he flushed home a dunk at the 14:49 mark while drawing a foul. Hill connected from the stripe to complete the three-point play and put VSU in front 55-47.

The momentum of Hill's three point play sparked a 12-4 run for Valdosta State over the next three minutes, which gave VSU a fairly comfortable 15-point advantage at 66-51. Lynn battled to keep the contest respectable and closed VSU's lead to single digits in the closing minutes. The Fighting Knights were never able to overcome the deficit, however, as the Blazers used a series of timely buckets and free throws to hold the opposition at bay throughout the remainder of regulation.

Justice topped his career high for the second time this week with an impressive 31-point outing that included 10-of-14 shooting from the field, 3-of-5 shooting from the perimeter, and a perfect 8-of-8 performance from the free throw line. Young also posted a career high with 21 points, while Jeremiah Hill chipped in with 17 points and eight assists.

The Blazers took full advantage of their opportunities at the stripe and racked up 25 points on free throws alone. The team shot a sparkling 89.3 percent from the line (25-of-28) and used 17 assists and 15 steals to offset their 15 turnovers.

With the win, Valdosta State added to their strong start to improve to 4-0 on the season. Meanwhile, the Fighting Knights fell to 1-4 overall.

Blazers Edged Out by Sailfish

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team suffered a 95-86 loss to the hosting Palm Beach Atlantic Sailfish in South Region action on the final day of the 2016 Thanksgiving Classic in West Palm Beach, Fla. on Sunday.

Blazer guard Sheldon Zaboltny, who led the Blazers with 25 points in the game, helped VSU get off to a great start in the contest with a layup and a three pointer in the opening minutes. Zaboltny's effort sparked an 11-5 run out of the gate, and VSU held that advantage for a 22-18 lead after the first nine minutes of the opening period.

The Sailfish fired back, however, using a three-point barrage during the remaining minutes of the first half to overtake the Blazers with a narrow 50-45 lead at halftime.

In the second half, Valdosta State connected for seven of their 11 three pointers in the game, including four from Zaboltny, who hit from beyond the arc seven times in the game. Against a 64.5 percent second-half shooting performance by the Sailfish, however, the long-range shooting effort was not enough for the Blazers, who were awarded just two free throw attempts in the game, both in the first half.

The story of the night was PBA's shooting effort, which led to a 37-of-65, 56.9 percent performance from the field and a 10-of-20, 50 percent night from the three point line. PBA's accuracy from the field overshadowed an otherwise impressive 37-of-77, 48.1 percent shooting effort by Valdosta State.

PBA's De'Andre Jackson was the offensive highlight for the Sailfish with 27 points (11-of-14), nine of which came on long range shots. Meanwhile, Saadiq Muhammad and Jimmy Kodet joined Zaboltny with double digits in the scoring column for Valdosta State.

Blazers Bury Pirates
Valdosta State Wins, 95-72

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State Blazers delivered a statement win in their last matchup before conference play with an impressive 95-72 win over Armstrong State on Thursday night at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

The win improved Valdosta State to 5-1 on the season and snapped a four-game winning streak for the Pirates, which dropped Armstrong State to 4-3 overall.

The Pirates scored the first points of the game after a pair of early free throws by Denzel Council at the 18:34 mark, before the Blazers fired back and reclaimed a 4-2 advantage with back-to-back jumpers by Jeremiah Hill and Damian Young. The two teams traded buckets during the next three minutes and the Pirates reclaimed a narrow lead until the 14:20 mark, when Marquise Simuels sliced through the lane to sink a contested layup and give VSU a 12-10 lead.

With the help of a 12-point (5-for-11) first half performance by Hill, Valdosta State continued to build on their lead throughout the remainder of the opening frame, and the Blazers stretched their lead to 16 points at 46-30 by the end of the half.

The Pirates hung around in the second half but never came any closer than 13 points, as Valdosta State used a 57.6 percent second-half shooting effort to hold Armstrong State at bay. Josh Lemons was the anchor for the Valdosta State offense, which has scored 85 or more points in every contest this season. The senior buried 9-of-10 shots from the field in the game, shot a perfect 3-of-3 from the three point line, and a hit 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. Lemons' 25 points in the game marked a career-high and eclipsed his previous career-best of 19, which he achieved in Valdosta State's last home game against Southeastern on November 21st.

Hill finished with 24 points in the game and added five rebounds and three assists, while Young made his first career start at home court with 17 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the field.

Blazers Get 2OT Win in Conference Opener

Valdosta State Wins, 92-89

PENSACOLA, Fla. - The Valdosta State Blazers saw four players score 17 points or more in a resilient 92-89, double-overtime win in their Gulf South Conference opener against the Argonauts of West Florida in Pensacola, Fla. on Monday night.

Jeremiah Hill highlighted the thrilling triumph with a 24-point performance, which included a 6-of-18 shooting effort from the field, along with two three pointers and a perfect 10-of-10 night at the free throw line. In addition, Hill recorded his first double-double of the season after hauling in 11 rebounds, and the senior finished just one assist shy of a triple-double.

The Blazers never led by more than four points in the contest, which featured 13 ties and 14 lead changes over the course of the night. The Blazers hung around, however, and held to within striking distance by never allowing UWF to open up a lead any further than nine points.

The outcome looked promising for Valdosta State late in the second half after Beau Justice buried a three with 2:02 remaining in regulation to put Valdosta State in front 76-72. But, two unanswered field goals by Rashaun Benson in the final two minutes, the second of which came with just 23 seconds on the clock, forced a 76-76 tie and sent the game into overtime.

In the first overtime frame, the Blazers took the lead two different times during the first four minutes, before Darryl Tucker used a three-point play to swing the advantage in UWF's favor for a one-point, 81-80 lead. Hill proceeded to knock down a pair of free throws after he was fouled on the ensuing possession, but Mario Stramaglia gave the Blazers a scare with a long three from the corner with just 39 seconds remaining on the clock. Stramaglia's clutch shot gave UWF a two-point lead, but Hill drew another Argonaut foul with nine seconds remaining and proceeded to calmly bury both free throws to force a second overtime period.

The Blazers took their final lead of the game with 1:43 on the clock in the second overtime period after Hill threaded a pass through the lane to Saadiq Muhammad, who connected from close range while drawing a foul for a three-point play. Senior Josh Lemons took over from there and provided the storyline in the closing moments of the game with four of his eight free throws in the last ten seconds to hold UWF at bay.

Second-Half Shooting Leads CBU to Win

Christian Brothers Wins, 85-77

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team fell victim to a remarkable second-half shooting effort by Christian Brothers, resulting in an 85-77 Gulf South Conference loss on Thursday night at Canale Arena in Memphis, Tenn.

The Blazers took control of the contest early and led throughout the majority of the first half, thanks in large part to the performance of Jeremiah Hill. The senior hit 5-of-8 attempts from the field during the first half and scored 13 of his 20 points in the opening period, which helped Valdosta State post a 51.6 field goal percentage from the field and out-score the Bucs 41-35.

The lead slipped out of Valdosta State's hands, however, during the first five minutes of the second half, when CBU came out firing and ripped off a 15-4 run to take a 52-45 lead. The Bucs used a series of critical three point shots and a host of timely offensive rebounds to thwart the Blazers' come-from-behind effort.

As a team, the Bucs shot 56.3 percent from the field in the second half and connected on nearly half of their three-point attempts to close out the final period with a 7-of-15 performance for 46.7 percent. Adam Dieball was held below his scoring average by the Blazer defense, but each of his two treys came at key moments in the second half. Furthermore, Joe Laravie was completely unconscious from the field, shooting well above his average with an 8-of-14 shooting performance from the field and a 6-of-10 display from the three-point line. Laravie, who entered the game with an average of fewer than seven points per game, finished with 27 points, a number that bested his previous season-high of 16.

For the Blazers, Jeremiah Hill posted 20 points on 7-of-18 shooting, and Damian Young chipped in with 16 points on a 6-of-11 night. In the second half, the Blazers shot an uncharacteristically low 20.0 percent from the three point line (3-of-15) and hit just 13-of-36 from the field for 36.1 percent. Furthermore, starting forward Saadiq Muhammad was forced to exit the game just five minutes into the second half after he was charged with his fifth foul.

JACKSON, Tenn. - The Blazers of Valdosta State men's basketball wrapped up a successful road trip on Saturday with a dominant 96-72 rout of the Union Bulldogs in Gulf South Conference action on Saturday evening in Jackson, Tenn.

The Blazers fell behind early and trailed 5-0 at the 17:20 mark before Justin Simon completed a three-point play for VSU's first points of the game. The buckets for Simon sparked an eight-plus minute span, in which Valdosta State outscored the Bulldogs 32-9 to take a 32-14 lead.

Valdosta State never looked back from that point forward and extended their lead to as many as 35 points late in the second half. A short run by Union during the closing minutes of the contest pulled the Bulldogs to within 24 before the final buzzer sounded.

Head Coach Mike Helfer saw six of his players reach double-digit figures in the game, with Saadiq Muhammad leading the charge. The senior forward used a series of strong moves in the paint to score a game-high 20 points in the game on 8-of-13 shooting, and Jeremiah Hill complemented the offensive effort with 18 points of his own (5-of-9).

Along with a 58.6 percent shooting display from the field, the Blazers also racked up 23 points at the free-throw line on a 23-of-25 performance for 92.0 percent. In addition, nine different Blazers contributed to 39 rebounds in the game against just 27 for UU.

With the win, Valdosta State improved to 7-2 overall and bumped their GSC record up to 2-1. Union fell to 6-4 overall and dropped to 1-3 against conference opponents.

Blazers Win Second Straight

Valdosta State Wins, 99-82

VALDOSTA, Ga. - Valdosta State put their offensive firepower on display yet again on Saturday afternoon with a 99-82 Gulf South Conference win over North Alabama in Valdosta, Ga. at The Complex.

The game featured 18 lead changes, 10 of which came in the second half. Valdosta State flipped a switch at the 7:21 mark, however, and two Saadiq Muhammad free throws triggered a sprint to the finish during which the Blazers outscored the Lions 32-14. The powerful finish for the Blazer offense marked one of their most impressive runs of the season and was anchored by solid free throw shooting that helped cap off a 91.9 percent (34-of-37) shooting effort at the stripe.

"We've been able to make free throws we need to make free throws," said Head Coach Mike Helfer after the game. "They are an important part of every game, and if we are going to get those opportunities, we're going to have to continue to convert."

Guards Beau Justice and Josh Lemons fueled the attack on the afternoon and finished with 22 and 20 points, respectively. Justice connected on 6-of-10 from the field and 5-of-7 from beyond the arc, which helped lead the Blazers to a 54 percent (27-of-50) shooting percentage from the field and a 55 percent (11-of-20) shooting effort from beyond the arc.

Additional factors that played into Valdosta State's success included a lock down on UNA's perimeter shooting, as well as a tremendous rebounding performance. The Blazers held the Lions to just 18.5 percent (5-of-27) from long distance, and VSU outrebounded UNA 42-17.

"One of the big differences in this game for us had to be rebounding," added Helfer. "When you outboard somebody by 15, that's a significant difference. I was really proud of our guys for putting an emphasis on that part of our game today, and that's something we've been really trying to focus on for several games now."

With the victory, the Blazers improved to 8-2 overall and 3-1 against GSC opponents, while the Lions dropped to 6-4 and fell to 1-3 in league action.

Valdosta State Wins, 76-72

CLEVELAND, Tenn. — The Valdosta State men's basketball team trailed by three at halftime, but a strong second half performance allowed the Blazers to overcome the deficit and hold off the Lee Flames for a 76-72 Gulf South Conference win on Saturday afternoon in Cleveland, Tenn.

After Isaac Merian connected from three point range with two seconds to play in the first half, Lee was afforded a 36-33 advantage at intermission. The Blazers didn't falter however, and completely controlled the first 16 minutes of the second half to open up a 17-point lead with 4:27 to play in regulation.

Just over one minute later, the Flames began to foul in order to stop the clock. A series of missed free throws by Valdosta State and four three-pointers by the Flames in the closing minutes allowed Lee to narrow the gap to just two points with less than one minute to play. Saadiq Muhammad stepped up in the final seconds, however, to drill two critical free throws and hold LU at bay.

Jeremiah Hill led the way for the Blazers on offense with 18 points on a 7-of-16 performance from the field. The senior came just two rebounds shy of a double-double after hauling in eight rebounds, and he added four assists with one steal. In addition, guard Josh Lemons added 13 points, and Jimmy Kodet poured in 11 points, eight of which came in the second half.

Valdosta State shot 33.3 percent from three point range in the first half with a 4-of-12 effort, but the team made their most substantial strides from long range in the second half with a 55.6 shooting performance (5-of-9). Kodet accounted for two of the second half threes, while Lemons, Hill, and Damian Young added one each. In contrast, the Flames were 0-of-10 from beyond the arc until their aforementioned surge during the game's final three minutes.

The win put Valdosta State in a three-way tie for third place in the GSC, improving the team to 9-3 overall and 4-2 against league opponents. The Flames saw their record fall to an even 6-6, and their conference record dropped to 2-4 overall.

Blazers Cruise to 93-76 Win Over Hawks

ROME, Ga. — A dual offensive explosion, along with a tremendous defensive effort, led the Valdosta State men's basketball team to their second straight Gulf South Conference win, 93-76, over the Shorter Hawks in Rome, Ga. on Monday night.

The Blazers held Shorter to under 40 percent at 37.3 percent from the field in the contest to limit the Hawks' damage on the night. In addition, SU hit just 6-of-23 attempts from long range and were held to just one three ball in the second half.

In contrast, the Blazer offense lit up Winthrop-King Centre with an incredible shooting display that resulted in a 53.4 percent (31-of-58) effort from the field and a 51.9 percent (14-of-27) performance from beyond the arc. In addition, VSU hit 17-of-22 free throws for 77.3 percent to cap off the offensive onslaught.

Valdosta State's barrage was led by Damian Young, who found his stride early in the contest and proceeded to bury 12-of-18 attempts from the field and 5-of-6 from long range. As a result, Young produced a career-high 34 points to lead all scorers in the game. Jeremiah Hill complemented Young with 33 points of his own after connecting on 10 three-pointers. The long range exhibition by Hill nearly matched his record setting performance last season against West Alabama, when he buried 11 treys for a single-game record.

The Blazer defense held Phil Taylor, the nation's leading scorer, to just seven first half points to help set the tone of the game early, but the guard used 13 second-half free throws and six field goals to push to a 33-point total to lead the Hawks.

Despite Taylor's production in the game, Valdosta State picked up the win to improve to 10-3 overall and 5-2 against league opponents. Meanwhile, the Hawks dropped to 8-4 overall and 3-4 in conference play.

Blazers Finish Road Trip Strong With 79-70 Win Over UWG

CARROLLTON, Ga. — The Valdosta State men's basketball team thrived in a hostile environment at The Coliseum in Carrollton, Ga. to wrap up a perfect road trip with a 79-70 over the rival Wolves of West Georgia in Gulf South Conference action on Thursday night.

The Blazers opened up the contest with a bang after outscoring the Wolves 13-0 over the course of the first three-plus minutes. From that moment forward, the Wolves matched the Blazers throughout the rest of the opening half but struggled to cut into VSU's lead. Damian Young paced the Blazers in the first half with 12 points on 5-of-10 shooting, and Valdosta State took a 45-36 lead into intermission.

Beau Justice kicked off the second period with a backside tip-in to give Valdosta State a double-digit advantage within the first minute, but the contest took a shaky turn for the Blazers during the ensuing minutes. Valdosta State was unable to connect for the next five minutes, and West Georgia used the opportunity for a 12-0 run. As a result, UWG took their first lead of the game at 48-47 at the 14:27 mark.

Justice quickly broke VSU's offensive silence on the next possession with a three-ball to reclaim the lead for the Blazers, which led to a series of lead exchanges between the two teams. Jeremiah Hill sparked VSU's decisive run at the 9:41 mark, however, and gave the Blazers a 58-57 advantage with a jumper in the paint. Although the Wolves kept the game fairly tight, Valdosta State slowly extended their lead and did not relinquish it for the remainder of the contest.

Despite 19 turnovers in the game, the Blazers managed to overcome the slight by outrebounding the Wolves 51-33. More importantly, the red and black was able to use 17 offensive rebounds to score 19 second-chance points.

Justice served as the leading scorer for the Blazers with 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the field, while Saadiq Muhammad, Hill, and Young also reached double-digit figures with 16, 15, and 12 points each, respectively.

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team took advantage of a Delta State win over Alabama-Huntsville in Cleveland, Miss., and used a 74-53 triumph over West Alabama to enter a three-way tie for first place on Saturday afternoon in Valdosta, Ga.

The Blazers controlled the game from the outset, after Beau Justice gave VSU their first lead of the game with three pointers on back-to-back possessions. Valdosta State rode the momentum throughout the first half with deadeye accuracy from the field and a host of highlight-reel plays. The squad's 57.6 shooting percentage led the team to a 47-24 halftime lead, and Jeremiah Hill paced the effort with 23 points on 9-of-11 shooting in the first half alone.

In the second period, Valdosta State put together a steady, balanced spread that included an impressive defensive performance. The Blazer defense kept the contest in check and held the Tigers at bay, forcing UWA to shoot a paltry 8-of-29 from the field for just 27.6 percent.

Overall in the game, Hill led the way on offense with 28 points, while Saadiq Muhammad landed another double-double on the afternoon after scoring 10 points and hauling in 12 rebounds. Nine different players scored points in the game, and VSU completely dominated the boards with 44 against West Alabama's 28.

As mentioned, Saturday's result allowed the Blazers to claim a piece of the top spot in the GSC standings with both Alabama-Huntsville and Delta State. VSU improved to 12-3 overall and 7-2 in league action, while the Tigers dropped to 8-7 overall and 3-6 in conference play.

"I thought tonight, maybe more than any other time this season, we took the scouting report and applied it on the floor," said Helper after the game. "That is a very tough team to guard. Schmidt is very tough to guard. With strong execution tonight, we were able to do both."

Four different players reached double figures in the scoring column, and Justin Simon added 10 rebounds to his 11 points for a double-double. Beau Justice had a big night on offense as well, scoring 16 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the field.

"This is one of my favorite teams that I've coached," added Helper after being asked about achieving his 400th win with his current team. "They understand me, I understand them, and I think the chemistry we have is really helping us as an organization right now."

The Blazers were firing on all cylinders in The Complex, particularly in the second half, during which Head Coach Mike Helfer's club buried 19-of-23 field goals for a remarkable 75-percent shooting exhibition. Blazers Move to Seven Straight; Defeat UWF 89-82

VALDOSTA, Ga. — Jeremiah Hill scored 27 points for the second straight game to help the Valdosta State men's basketball team outlast a gritty West Florida Argonauts squad for an 89-82 Gulf South Conference win in Valdosta, Ga. on Monday night.

Hill hit 8-of-17 shots from the field and 4-of-10 from long range, and the Blazers boosted the offensive output by way of four other players to reach double-digit figures in the scoring column.

The Blazers shot over 42.6 percent for the seventh straight game, a stretch during which VSU has ripped off seven consecutive victories. The solid shooting performance was a critical one for Valdosta State and gave the red and black just enough cushion to hold off a late push by the Argonauts.

Trailing by 20 points at the 10:30 mark, West Florida's Darryl Tucker hit a three to spark a 26-7 run over the course of the next eight minutes. The Stretch allowed the Argonauts to pull to within one point at 80-79, but a timeout by Head Coach Mike Helfer allowed the Blazers to gather themselves and outscore UWF 9-3 during the final two minutes.

Valdosta State matched a season high with 51 rebounds in the game, out-rebounding the Argonauts by a total of 17. Of those rebounds, 19 came on offense, which set the Blazers up for 18 second-chance points. Saadiq Muhammad was the top performer on the boards with a career-high 15 boards. The double-double, which included 12 points, marked Muhammad's third of the season.

With the victory, VSU launched to 15-3 overall and 10-2 in Gulf South Conference play. In contrast, West Florida fell to 11-6 overall and 6-6 against league opponents.

Blazers Roll to 107-77 Win Over UWG

VALDOSTA, Ga. — The Valdosta State men's basketball team delivered an incredible performance in front of an incredible crowd to land their eighth consecutive win with a 107-77 Gulf South Conference victory over the rival West Georgia Wolves on Thursday night at The Complex.

West Georgia's Aaron Cameron struck first in the first minute of the game to put the Wolves in front by two, but Beau Justice drilled a three just 20 seconds later to spark a relentless offensive attack by the Blazers that continued throughout the rest of the night.

Both teams shot well in the first half, and West Georgia hit 50.0 percent of their shots from the field. The Blazers fired off more shots, however, and connected on 21-of-37 attempts for a 56.8 shooting percentage. The result was a 55-38 lead for the Blazers at the half.

Valdosta State dominated in every facet of the game and led in every major statistical column. VSU pulled down 45 rebounds, committed just 11 turnovers, and dished out 15 assists in the game. Jeremiah Hill once again led the way with 24 points and was joined by eight other scorers, four of which posted double-digit scoring numbers.

Most impressive of all, perhaps, was Valdosta State's ability to completely shut down Stephann Branch, UWG's top offensive scorer. Branch came into the game averaging 18.6 per game and served as one of the top five scorers in the league, but Valdosta State held him scoreless. Furthermore, VSU held the senior to just a single shot attempt and essentially forced him out of the game early in the second half after frustration set in and led to a technical foul. The technical foul, followed by another quick foul in the opening minutes of the second half, led Head Coach Michael Cooney to bench Branch with four fouls. He never returned and notched just 18 minutes in the game.

In addition to Hill's impressive effort, Damian Young added 20 points for his third highest scoring effort of the season. The performance helped lead VSU to a 16-3 overall record and an 11-2 stint in GSC play. The Wolves fell to 8-10, 5-7 against league opponents.

Blazer Defense Locks Down Late to Defeat Tigers

LIVINGSTON, Ala. — Valdosta State overcame a slow offensive start to pick up a 73-61 Gulf South Conference road win over the West Alabama Tigers in Livingston, Ala. on Saturday for their ninth straight victory.

The Blazer defense kept the drought from being a costly one, however, by allowing the Tigers just two free throws of their own during that same stretch. Facing a 5-2 deficit at the 15:00 mark in the first half, UWA continued to stifle the Blazer offense and managed to outscore VSU over the next seven minutes to establish a 19-13 lead.

With eight minutes to play in the opening period, Valdosta State flipped a switch offensively and put together a 19-9 run. Jeremiah Hill came to life during that stretch, scoring 10 of his 12 points to help ignite the Blazer offense and push VSU out to a 42-28 lead at the break.

"Stuff isn't always going to go our way out there, and we just have to stay composed in those situations," said Saadiq Muhammad in response to VSU's slow start. "We have to just be patient, wear the other team down, and keep playing our game. If we do that, eventually, things will start going our way."

In the second half, the Tigers pulled to within two points four different times and used a pair of Jahmal Lane free throws to trim the Blazers' lead to 58-56 at the 8:45 mark. From that moment forward, however, Valdosta State's defense went into total lockdown mode, and Coach Mike Hefner's squad allowed UWA just five additional points throughout the remainder of regulation.

"I feel like as season has gone along, we've gotten better defensively," added Muhammad. "We can score, but we've got to stop somebody if we are going to win games, especially games where we score under 80 points. In that final stretch tonight, we just bucked down and did what coach asked of us. After that, good things happened."

Saadiq Muhammad was the driving force behind VSU's offensive production on the night, as the senior forward shot 8-of-11 from the field and 2-of-4 from the free throw line for a team-high 18 points. In addition, Justin Simon helped lead the Blazers to 44 rebounds in the game with 11 of his own. Valdosta State's rebound total exceeded UWA's by 20, and Simon's 10 points landed the senior another double-double.

Kodet Beats Buzzer to Give VSU Double OT Win

CLINTON, Miss. – Jimmy Kodet flushed home a two-handed put-back dunk with less than one second remaining to give No. 24 Valdosta State their 10th consecutive win, a 100-98, double overtime victory over the Mississippi College Choctaws in Gulf South Conference play on Thursday night in Clinton, Miss.

Valdosta State got off to a slow start in the opening minutes of the game, scoring just two points during the first five-plus minutes of the contest. The Blazers recovered in fine fashion, however, after Damian Young buried a three pointer at the 14:31 mark to spark a 34-point onslaught over the course of the remainder of the first half.

Young's effort played a huge role in VSU's first-half success, as the senior played in 15 of this game's 26 bench points in the opening period. Kodet teamed up with Carlos Beverly and Tim Dal Bon to account for 5, 4, and 2 points, respectively. Combined with Young, the Valdosta State reserves help ignite the Blazer offense for a 45-37 lead.

After trailing for the first 16 minutes of the second half, the Choctaws used a Stacey Mack layup at the 3:12 mark, which sparked a 13-6 run over the course of the next three minutes and trimmed their deficit to 75-78 with four seconds to play in regulation. Deondre Haynes, who scored a team-high 28 points in the game, went to the free throw line and hit the first shot, before he purposely missed the second shot to try and give MC an offensive rebound opportunity. The gamble worked, as Haynes pulled down his own rebound and forced overtime with a last second, game tying layup.

The outcome looked bleak for VSU after the first two minutes of first overtime period, but Jeremiah Hill hit three shots from beyond the arc and scored 12 of his career-high 35 points in the final three minutes of the frame to help the Blazers overcome a six-point deficit and force an additional overtime period.

In the deciding frame, the two teams traded buckets throughout before VSU earned an opportunity for the last shot, as the final seconds ticked away. Hill prepared to take the final shot, and fired from long range with fewer than five seconds to play. The shot went left, but a heads-up play by Kodet put him in position to grab the miss out of the air and slam it home for the win.

Valdosta State fell to 18-4 overall and 13-3 in conference play, while DSU lifted their record to 15-6, 9-5 against GSC opponents.

Dramatic Comeback Gives Blazers 89-75 OT Win Over Union

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State Blazers overcame a slow start on offense with a gutsy comeback effort that led to an 89-75 overtime Gulf South Conference win over the visiting Union Bulldogs in Valdosta, Ga. on Thursday night.

Valdosta State used a spark of the bench in the final minutes of the opening period in the form of Jimmy Kodet. The junior forward ended the Blazers' drought from three-point range with a pair of long distance shots during a one-minute span between the third and second minute mark. The two shots helped the Blazers to a 17-9 run during the final seven minutes of the half and pulled VSU to within 12 at 39-27 at intermission.

Damian Young buried three quick buckets during the first three minutes of the second half, and Jeremiah Hill added five points in the next two minutes to help pull Valdosta State to within six at 43-37. Fueled by a lively crowd, Beau Justice then caught fire and scored 10 points on three treys and a free throw within a three-minute window.

That crowd support became a huge factor late in the contest, when Blazer forward Justin Simon hit a close range shot in the final minute of regulation to tie the contest up at 74-74. Ashanti Day was fouled on a rebound attempt in the closing seconds, which afforded the Union standout a chance to give the Bulldogs a late lead from the free throw line with just seconds to spare. The 1,114 in attendance came to life prior to his free throw attempt, however, and produced a deafening roar to help influence a misfire by Day and force overtime.

"Union is a great team," added Helfer. "They are big and strong, and they shoot it extremely well, which makes them difficult to guard. Tonight was a game that brought out our guys' heart and desire. We were struggling so much and had to dig deep. It was one of the best comeback wins of my coaching career."

Hill finished with 30 points in the game, which upped the senior's career point total up to 914 points. He hit 9-of-20 from the field, with 11 free throws, four assists, and two steals. Justice contributed with four second-half threes and 19 points in the game.

Blazers Stifle Bucs In 79-65 GSC Win

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State Blazers took an early lead and never looked back in a 79-65 victory over the Christian Brothers Bucs in Gulf South Conference action on Saturday at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

Beau Justice ignited the Blazers (20-4, 15-3 GSC) less than one minute into the game with a three-pointer from the right wing. The long range shot accounted for three of Justice's team-high 21 points in the game and gave VSU a lead they never relinquished throughout the rest of the contest.

"We're the type of team, that once we see one go early, that really gets us going," said Justice after the win. "I was lucky enough to hit that three, and that got the crowd into it early as well. Once the crowd started going, I knew we were going to take off and have a good start."

In front of a crowd of over 2,000 people, the largest of the year, the Blazers led by as many as 19 in the first half and opened the lead up even further to a 20-point advantage after a close-range shot at the 15:36 mark in the second half by Saadiq Muhammad, who closed out with 17 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field and a 4-of-5 effort from the charity stripe.

The big lead was more than enough for the Blazers down the stretch, thanks in large part to a 52.3 percent shooting display in the second half, during which the Blazers buried 18 shots on 34 attempts.

Justice finished 6-of-13 from the field, with all six of those field goals coming from beyond the arc. The sophomore added three free throws and was helped out along the way on offense by both Muhammad and Josh Lemons, who connected on six shots from the field for 12 points in the game.

Valdosta State controlled the ball and valued possessions effectively all night long. Head Coach Mike Helfer's squad issued just five turnovers on the night, which helped the team negate a strong effort by the CBU (14-10, 11-7 GSC) reserves, who teamed up for 23 points off the bench.

The win marked VSU's 20th of the 2017 season and set the stage for the year's most anticipated matchup next Thursday, as the Blazers travel to Huntsville, Ala. for a battle against Alabama-Huntsville.

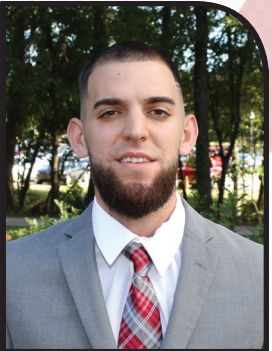
