

QUICK NOTES:

- Valdosta State cleaned house in the All-GSC award department on Monday. Jeremiah Hill was named GSC Player of the Year and First Team All-GSC, while Saadiq Muhammad secured Second Team honors. The Blazers, who were picked to finish seventh at the beginning of the season, finished in first place and Head Coach Mike Helfer became just the fifth coach to ever win three GSC Coach of the Year honors.
- The Blazers have moved up The blazers have moved up to No. 20 in the most recent release of the NABC polls. The ranking marks the highest in a season for Valdosta State since January of 2011, when the team spent one week in the polls at No. 24.
- Head Coach Mike Helfer picked up the 400th win of his collegiate coaching career with a win over Delta State on January 19th. In addition, the veteran's double-overtime victory over Mississippi College on the road on February 2nd marked Helfer's 100th career GSC victory.
- Tonight's matchup marks the 75th all-time between North Alabama and Valdosta State. The Lions hold the advantage in the all-time series with 39 wins against 35 losses. The two teams last faced each other on February 18th, when the VSU's Josh Lemons hit a game-saving layup and added two free throws in the final six seconds of regulation to help the Blazers secure a 77-74 victory. VSU has won both matchups against the Lions this season.

12TH SEASON CAPITAL 1989



Entering his 12th year with Valdosta State, Mike Helfer has established himself as one of the top coaches in the nation. After all, in his first 11 years, he has compiled a 201-119 record, including winning seasons in nine of his 11 years, and repeatedly established his program as one of the most exciting teams in the Gulf South Conference, South Region, and nationwide.

The Blazers returned to form in 2015-16 with a 17-11 overall record and a 13-9 conference record. The season included a slew of near-misses

as VSU took teams into overtime seven times and fell in five of those hardfought contests. Valdosta State's run last season led to a return to the Gulf South Conference Tournament, marking Helfer's 10th appearance in the playoffs as a head coach at VSU.

Helfer's plan for the Valdosta State program nearly reached its pinnacle in 2009-10 as his team advanced further than any squad in school history. En route to advancing to the national quarterfinals. Helfer directed his team to a school record 28 victories, against just five defeats, and claimed a share of the program's second straight Gulf South Conference East Division title. The Blazers reached as high as No. 2 in the national polls during the year, the highest VSU has ever been ranked nationally, and twice defeated the No. 1 team in the nation, the first incident coming in an 81-75 victory over Augusta State during the regular season and the second occurring when Valdosta State defeated Arkansas Tech 72-60 in the semifinals of the NCAA South Region Tournament. The 28 victories on the year marked the second-highest win total in a single season for Helfer in his 13-year coaching career.

Personal honors were handed out to various Blazers at the conclusion of the season, led by Tyrone Curnell who was named the Gulf South Conference and South Region Player of the Year while earning All-America honors for the second straight season. Helfer shared the GSC East Division Coach of the Year honors, earning the award for the second straight year. Ricardo Lewis was also honored by the Gulf South Conference as he joined Curnell on the first team All-Conference squad

The single season wins record was not the only Blazer school record to fall during the season as Valdosta State also established a new school mark for points in a season, finishing the year with 2,666 to surpass the old mark of 2,591 set during the 1967 season. The aggressive Blazers also established a new school mark of free throw attempts in a season, tallying 812 attempts on the year, while Curnell set the individual record in both free throws made and free throw attempts, connecting on 156-of-226 attempts on the season to best both old school marks by two. Valdosta State fell just one win shy of tying the school record for consecutive victories in a season as it went 15 games, a stretch that lasted from December 15 until February 18, without losing a contest.

The success of the 2009-10 season was not an overnight occurrence

as Helfer spent four years prior to that year establishing the Blazers as one of the top school in the NCAA Division II ranks. His first four years with Valdosta State saw his teams play in a pair of NCAA South Region Tournaments while the Blazers won the Gulf South Conference East Division title in 2008-09, just the third time in school history that the Blazers finished first in the league's division

Helfer's ability to teach the game of basketball was never more evident than the 2008-09 season, when in addition to the GSC East Division title and a NCAA South Regional appearance, he led his squad to a 24-7 record, despite losing four starters from the previous year. The squad, which featured 10 new players, went 9-3 in conference play and advanced to the championship game of the league tournament. Helfer's direction helped several Blazers earn individual honors, led by Curnell, who earned All-America status from the National Association of Basketball Coaches while also being named to the All-Gulf South Conference squad. Curnell and Lewis each earned GSC All-Tournament honors during the season while Helfer was named the GSC East Division Coach of the Year at the conclusion of the season.

Helfer turned in perhaps his finest coaching performance the year after the magical 2009-10 season as he again directed his squad to a 20win season, despite having to completely retool and reload his squad after massive losses from the previous year's team. The 2010-11 Valdosta State team lost nine out of the 12 players that led the team to the the 2009-10 Elite Eight, which accounted for 78.3 percent of the team's scoring and 83.0 percent of its rebounding.

With an entirely new squad, Helfer led his squad to a 21-9 record and a second place finish in the GSC's East Division, Two Blazers, Kevin Harris and Christian Hunter, earned All-Gulf South Conference honors while the team tallied 277 three-pointers on the season, a new school record. The 21 victories gave Valdosta State its third straight season of 20 or more wins, marking just the second time in school history VSU accomplished that feat, with the other occurrence coming during between 1965 and 1968.

After going 11-16 in 2011-12, Helfer once again proved his ability as a team builder as he returned just one player for his 2012-13 squad. The job Helfer turned in during his seventh year was nothing short of masterful as he molded a collection of new players into a team that improved with each passing game. The 2012-13 Blazers finished the year with a 19-10 record, including a 9-9 mark in GSC play, but saved their best for last as they charged through the GSC Tournament, including an upset of sixth-ranked Alabama-Huntsville, before falling 65-62 to Christian Brothers in the Championship game.

Three Blazers earned All-Gulf South Conference honors at the end of the 2012-13 season, including Josh Sparks, who earned All-Region honors after setting a new VSU and GSC record with 100 blocks on the season. He was joined on the All-GSC team by guard Patrick Diop and forward James Anacreon

Helfer inherited a team that averaged 68.0 points a game in 2004-05 and led it to a 17-11 mark while averaging 83.5 points a game in 2005-06, his first season at the helm of the Blazers. Helfer's first squad went 7-7 in Gulf South Conference play and finished tied for fourth in the league's East Division. Two of Helfer's players, Jon Rogers (First) and Michael Crane (Second), were named to the All-GSC team while Rogers also earned All-GSC Tournament honors after VSU advanced to the tournament's quarterfinals.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Blazers raced out of the gate and never looked back for a convincing 85-72 triumph over the Fort Valley State Wildcats in the squad's season opener on Friday night in Fort Val-

ley, Ga.

The Blazers could do no wrong early in the contest and blistered the Wildcats in the opening minutes to open up a 25-point advantage. Fort Valley leveled off late in the opening period, however, and used the three ball to make a run late in the first half and narrow the deficit to 49-34 at

Valdosta State made the necessary adjustments at halftime to slow down FVSU's long range attack, and the two teams traded buckets throughout the majority of the second half. Valdosta State's lead proved to be insurmountable, allowing the Blazers to secure the victory in the non-conference showdown.

The key difference came at the charity stripe, where FVSU shot just 12-of-27. In contrast, the Blazers shot 76.7 percent with a 23-of-30 performance

Four Blazers reached double-digit figures in the scoring column, and Jeremiah Hill and Damian Young paced the effort with 18 points. In ad-dition, five different VSU players hauled in seven or more rebounds. Hill led in the rebounding column as well and nearly missed a double-double after notching a team-high 18 rebounds.

The Blazers found their mark, however, after using a jumper by Sheldon Zablotny to take a 67-65 lead with 9:12 to go in regulation. Zablotny's bucket put Valdosta State's offense back on track and cued up a 15-6 run that would put VSU in front for good.

Saadiq Muhammad served as the primary force on the attack for VSU and recorded eight rebounds to go along with a team-high 20 points. The senior shot 9-for-14 in the game and complemented the efforts of Zablotny, Jeremiah Hill, and Carlos Beverly, who scored 19, 16, and 11 points respectively.

Valdosta State shot over 51 percent from the field in the game and used 22 putback points on 15 offensive rebounds to help offset ASU's gritty effort.

Valdosta State Wins, 111-83

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team thrived in their hometown environment on Monday night and relished their home opener after outshining the Southeastern Fire in a 111-83 win in Valdosta. Ga. at The Complex.

Sophomore Beau Justice set the tone less than 20 seconds into the contest with a three ball from the right side to give VSU a 3-0 advantage, and both Josh Lemons and Jeremiah Hill followed suit on the next two possessions with a pair of three balls that gave the Blazers a 9-0 lead just over one minute after the opening tip.

The early offensive onslaught was a sign of things to come throughout the night, as the Blazers used 15 long balls and a sparkling 46.9 shooting percentage from long range to maintain a comfortable advantage throughout the evening.

Justice and Saadig Muhammad accounted for 52 of VSU'S 111 points in the game, as each scored 26 points. The pair racked up their big numbers in very different ways, however, as Justice used an 8-for-11 performance from the three point line, and Muhammad tallied most of his points on a 12-for-14 performance from close range.

In the game, the Blazers shot 58.1 percent from the field on a 43-of-74 effort, and ten different players helped contribute to the offensive attack. In addition, Valdosta State outrebounded the Fire 37 to 29, all while committing just 12 turnovers.

The only downside for VSU came at the free throw line, where the Blazers shot just 10-of-18. Head Coach Mike Helfer's squad overcame the slip at the charity stripe, however, with 11 steals to complement the aforementioned offensive barrage.

Other top performers in the contest included Lemons, who posted 19 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and 4-of-5 shooting from the line, along with Jimmy Kodet, who poured in 16 points on a 7-of-9 shooting effort from the field.

The win lifted VSU to 3-0 on the year, while Southeastern saw their record drop to 2-3 overall.

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team suffered a 95-86 loss to the hosting Palm Beach Atlantic Sailfish in South Region action on the final day of the 2016 Thanksgiving Classic in West Palm Beach, Fla. on Sunday.

Blazer guard Sheldon Zablotny, who led the Blazers with 25 points in the game, helped VSU get off to a great start in the contest with a layup and a three pointer in the opening minutes. The story of the night was PBA's shooting effort, which led to a 37-of-65, 56.9 percent performance from the field and a 10-of-20, 50 percent night from the three point line. PBA's accuracy from the field overshadowed an otherwise impressive 37-of-77, 48.1 percent shooting effort by Valdosta State.

PBA's De'Ondre Jackson was the offensive highlight for the Sailfish with 27 points (11-of-14), nine of which came on long range shots. Meanwhile, Saadiq Muhammad and Jimmy Kodet joined Zablotny with double digits in the scoring column for Valdosta State.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - The Valdosta State men's haskethall team fell victim to a remarkable second-half shooting effort by Christian Brothers, resulting in an 85-77 Gulf South Conference loss on Thursday night at Canale Arena in Memphis, Tenn.

The Blazers took control of the contest early and led throughout the majority of the first half, thanks in large part to the performance of Jeremiah Hill. The senior hit 5-of-8 attempts from the field during the first half and scored 13 of his 20 points in the opening period, which helped Valdosta State post a 51.6 field goal percentage from the field and outscore the Bucs 41-35

The lead slipped out of Valdosta State's hands, however, during the first five minutes of the second half, when CBU came out firing and ripped off a 15-4 run to take a 52-45 lead. The Bucs used a series of critical three point shots and a host of timely offensive rebounds to thwart the Blazers' come-from-behind effort.

As a team, the Bucs shot 56.3 percent from the field in the second half and connected on nearly half of their three-point attempts to close out the final period with a 7-of-15 performance for 46.7 percent. Adam Dieball was held below his scoring average by the Blazer defense, but each of his two treys came at key moments in the second half. Furthermore, Joe Laravie was completely unconscious from the field, shooting well above his average with an 8-of-14 shooting performance from the field and a 6-of-10 display from the three-point line. Laravie, who entered the game with an average of fewer than seven points per game, finished with 27 points, a number that bested his previous season-high of 16.

For the Blazers, Jeremiah Hill posted 20 points on 7-of-18 shooting, and Damian Young chipped in with 16 points on a 6-of-11 night. In the second half, the Blazers shot an uncharacteristically low 20.0 percent from the three point line (3-of-15) and hit just 13-of-36 from the field for 36.1 percent. Furthermore, starting forward Saadig Muhammad was forced to exit the game just five minutes into the second half after he was charged with his fifth foul.

Blazers Pick Up Road Win Over Lee

Valdosta State Wins, 76-72

CLEVELAND, Tenn. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team trailed by three at halftime, but a strong second half performance allowed the Blazers to overcome the deficit and hold off the Lee Flames for a 76-72 Gulf South Conference win on Saturday afternoon in Cleveland, Tenn.

After Isaac Merian connected from three point range with two seconds to play in the first half, Lee was afforded a 36-33 advantage at intermission. The Blazers didn't falter however, and completely controlled the first 16 minutes of the second half to open up a 17-point lead with 4.27 to play in regulation.

Just over one minute later, the Flames began to foul in order to stop the clock. A series of missed free throws by Valdosta State and four three-pointers by the Flames in the closing minutes allowed Lee to narrow the gap to just two points with less than one minute to play. Saadig Muhammad stepped up in the final seconds, however, to drill two critical free throws and hold LU at bay.

Jeremiah Hill led the way for the Blazers on offense with 18 points on a 7-of-16 performance from the field. The senior came just two rebounds shy of a double-double after hauling in eight rebounds, and he added four assists with one steal. In addition, guard Josh Lemos added 13 points, and Jimmy Kodet poured in 11 points, eight of which came in the second half.

Valdosta State shot 33.3 percent from three point range in the first half with a 4-of-12 effort, but the team made their most substantial strides from long range in the second half with a 55.6 shooting performance (5-of-9). Kodet accounted for two of the second half threes, while Lemons, Hill, and Damian Young added one each. In contrast, the Flames were 0-of-10 from beyond the arc until their aforementioned surge during the game's final three minutes.

The win put Valdosta State in a three-way tie for third place in the GSC, improving the team to 9-3 overall and 4-2 against league opponents. The Flames saw their record fall to an even 6-6, and their conference record dropped to 2-4 overall.

Blazers Cruise to 93-76 Win Over Hawks

ROME, Ga. — A dual offensive explosion, along with a tremendous defensive effort, led the Valdosta State men's basketball team to their second straight Gulf South Conference win, 93-76, over the Shorter Hawks in Rome, Ga. on Monday night.

The Blazers held Shorter to under 40 percent at 37.3 percent from the field in the contest to limit the Hawks' damage on the night. In addition, SU hit ust 6-of-23 attempts from long range and were held to just one three ball in the second half.

In contrast, the Blazer offense lit up Winthrop-King Centre with an incredible shooting display that resulted in a 53.4 percent [31-of-58] effort from the field and a 51.9 percent [44-of-27) performance from beyond the arc. In addition, VSU hit 17-of-22 free throws for 77.3 percent to cap off the offensive

Valdosta State's barrage was led by Damian Young, who found his stride early in the contest and proceeded to bury 12-of-18 attempts from the field and 5-of-6 from long range. As a result, Young produced a career-high 34 points to lead all scorers in the game. Jeremiah Hill complemented Young with 33 points of his own after connecting on 10 three-pointers. The long range exhibition by Hill nearly matched his record setting performance last season against West Alabama, when he buried 11 treys for a single-game record.

The Blazer defense held Phil Taylor, the nation's leading scorer, to just seven first half points to help set the tone of the game early, but the guard used 13 second-half free throws and six field goals to push to a 33-point total to

Despite Taylor's production in the game, Valdosta State picked up the win to improve to 10-3 overall and 5-2 against league opponents. Meanwhile, the Hawks dropped to 8-4 overall and 3-4 in conference play.

VALDOSTA, Ga. – In a highly anticipated matchup on Thursday night between two of the Gulf South Conference's top ranked teams, the Valdosta State Blazers knocked off the Delta State Statesmen, 79-62, and helped Head Coach Mike Helfer secure his 400th career victory as a collegiate head coach.

"When you reach a milestone like this, you tend to look back in amazement at how many players have played for you and how great many of them were," stated Helfer. "It's not about the wins and losses as much as it is about the relationships and doing our best to influence lives in a positive way."

With the support of nearly 1,000 attendees, the Blazers took a 7-4 lead early in the first half after back-to-back layups by Saadig Muhammad and never trailed again for the rest of the night. Thanks to an impressive shooting effort that resulted in a 49.1 percent performance from the field and a 45.0 percent three-point display, the Blazers remained in complete control throughout the duration of the night.

Even more impressive, was the intensity level of the Blazer defense throughout the night. The Blazers held the GSC's second-best scorer, Devin Schmidtor to just five first-half points and 15 total points in the game. Coach Helfer credited the team's defensive success to their ability to carry out a specific game plan.

"I thought tonight, maybe more than any other time this season, we took the scouting report and applied it on the floor," said Helfer after the game. "That is a very tough team to guard. Schmidt is very tough to guard. But with strong execution tonight, we were able to do both."

Four different players reached double figures in the scoring column, and Justin Simon added 10 rebounds to his 11 points for a double-double. Beau Justice had a big night on offense as well, scoring 16 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the field.

"This is one of my favorite teams that I've coached," added Helfer after being asked about achieving his 400th win with his current team. "They understand me, I understand them, and I think the chemistry we have is really helping us as an organization right now."

VALDOSTA, Ga. – A sizzling second half offensive performance allowed the Valdosta State men's basketball team to run away from the Mississippi Col-lege Choctaws in the second half for a 103-79 rout on Saturday evening in Valdosta, Ga.

The Blazers were firing on all cylinders in The Complex, particularly in the second half, during which Head Coach Mike Helfer's club buried 19-0f-23 field goals for a remarkable 75-percent shooting exhibition. Seven of the 19 shots were three pointers, resulting in a 7-0f-10, 70 percent effort from long range, and VSU also drilled 9-0f-12 attempts from the free throw lines.

The second half surge pushed the Blazers to a season-high 59.7 shooting per-centage in the game, and 19 of VSU's 103 points came from the free throw line. Valdosta State has now shot 50 percent or better from the field in eight games this season, and the team has shot 40 percent or better in each game of their current six-game winning streak.

Jeremiah Hill an<mark>chored the team with</mark> 27 points on the attack, with Josh Lemons and Jimmy Kodet adding 17 and 15 points, respectively. Hill also added seven assists and six rebounds for team leads in both categories, and the Blazers completely dominated the boards with 33 rebounds against MC's 21.

With the victory, Valdosta State improved to 14-3 overall and 9-2 in conference play, adding to their best start in over five years. Mississippi College's woes continued, as they fell to 4-11 overall and 1-10 against conference opponents.

VALDOSTA, Ga. – Jeremiah Hill scored 27 points for the second straight game to help the Valdosta State men's basketball team outlast a gritty West Florida Argonauts squad for an 89-82 Gulf South Conference win in Valdosta, Ga. on Monday night.

Hill hit 8-of-17 shots from the field and 4-of-10 from long range, and the Blazers boosted the offensive output by way of four other players to reach double-digit figures in the scoring column.

The Blazers shot over 42.6 percent for the seventh straight game, a stretch during which VSU has ripped off seven consecutive victories. The solid shooting performance was a critical one for Valdosta State and gave the red and black just enough cushion to hold off a late push by the Argonauts.

Trailing by 20 points at the 10:30 mark, West Florida's Darryl Tucker hit a three to spark a 26-7 run over the course of the next eight minutes. The Stretch allowed the Argonauts to pull to within one point at 80-79, but a timeout by Head Coach Mike Helfer allowed the Blazers to gather themselves and outscore UWF 9-3 outring the final two minutes.

Valdosta State matched a season high with 51 rebounds in the game, out-rebounding the Argonauts by a total of 17. Of those rebounds, 19 came on offense, which set the Blazers up for 18 second-chance points. Saadig Muhammad was the top performer on the boards with a career-high 15 boards. The double-double, which included 12 points, marked Muhammad's third of the season.

With the victory, VSU launched to 15-3 overall and 10-2 in Gulf South Conference play. In contrast, West Florida fell to 11-6 overall and 6-6 against league opponents.

Blazers Roll to 107-77 Win Over UWG

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team delivered an incredible performance in front of an incredible crowd to land their eighth consecutive win with a 107-77 Gulf South Conference victory over the rival West Georgia Wolves on Thursday night at The Complex.

West Georgia's Aaron Cameron struck first in the first minute of the game to put the Wolves in front by two, but Beau Justice drilled a three just 20 sec-onds later to spark a relentless offensive attack by the Blazers that continued throughout the rest of the night.

Both teams shot well in the first half, and West Georgia hit 50.0 percent of their shots from the field. The Blazers fired off more shots, however, and connected on 21-of-37 attempts for a 55.8 shooting percentage. The result was a 55-38 lead for the Blazers at the half

Valdosta State dominated in every facet of the game and led in every major statistical column. VSU pulled down 45 rebounds, committed just 11 turnovers, and dished out 15 assists in the game. Jeremiah Hill once again led the way with 24 points and was joined by eight other scorers, four of which posted double-digit scoring numbers.

Most impressive of all, perhaps, was Valdosta State's ability to completely shut down Stephaun Branch, UMG's top offensive scorer. Branch came into the game averaging 18.6 per game and served as one of the top five scorers in the league, but Valdosta State held him scoreless. Furthermore, VSU held the senior to just a single shot attempt and essentially forced him out of the game early in the second half after frustration set in and led to a technical foul. The technical foul, followed by another quick foul in the opening minutes of the second half, led Head Coach Michael Cooney to bench Branch with four fouls. He never returned and notched just 18 minutes in the game.

In addition to Hill's impressive effort, Damian Young added 20 points for his third highest scoring effort of the season. The performance helped lead VSU to a 16-3 overall record and an 11-2 stint in GSC play. The Wolves fell to 8-10, 5-7 against league opponents.

The Blazer defense kept the drought from being a costly one, however, by allowing the Tigers just two free throws of their own during that same stretch Facing a 5-2 deficit at the 15:00 mark in the first half, UWA continued to stifle the Blazer offense and managed to outscore VSU over the next seven minutes to establish a 19-13 lead.

With eight minutes to play in the opening period, Valdosta State flipped a switch offensively and put together a 19-9 run. Jeremiah Hill came to life during that stretch, scoring 10 of his 12 points to help ignite the Blazer offense and push VSU out to a 42-28 lead at the break.

In the second half, the Tigers pulled to within two points four different times and used a pair of Jahmal Lane free throws to trim the Blazers' lead to 58-56 at the 8.45 mark. From that moment forward, however, Valdosta State's defense went into total lockdown mode, and Coach Mike Helfer's squad allowed UWA just five additional points throughout the remainder

"I feel like as season has gone along, we've gotten better defensively," added Muhammad. "We can score, but we've got to stop somebody if we are going to win games, especially games where we score under 80 points. In that final stretch tonight, we just buckled down and did what coach asked of us. After that, good things happened."

Saadiq Muhammad was the driving force behind VSU's offensive production on the night, as the senior forward shot 8-of-11 from the field and 2-of from the free throw line for a team-high 18 points. In addition, Justin Simon helped lead the Blazers to 44 rebounds in the game with 11 of his own. Valdosta State's rebound total exceeded UWA's Sy 20, and Simon's 10 points landed the senior another double-double.

Delta State Outlasts Blazer Basketball, 72-58

CLEVELAND, Miss, - The Valdosta State men's basketball team saw their 10game winning streak come to an end after a 72-58 loss to the Delta State Statesmen on Saturday evening at Walter Sillers Coliseum in Cleveland, Miss.

The Blazers fell behind early, scoring just four points during the first seven minutes of the game. The Blazer defense helped weather the storm, however, allowing DSU just eight points during that same stretch. Just over two minutes later, Saadiq Muhammad used a close bucket at the 10.46 mark to trim VSUS deficit to two points at 11-9, before Delta State produced a 16-7 run during the next nine minutes. At that moment, Valdosta State faced an 11-point deficit, their largest of the first half. Beau Justice helped right the ship, however with eight unanswered points during the final two minutes of the period to pull VSU to within three at 27-24.

In the second half, the Blazers picked up right where the first half ended and ripped off a 7-0 run during the first 90 seconds of the half to take a 31-27 lead. The Statesmen bounced back, however, and tied the game up at 34-34 just two minutes later. The two teams proceeded to exchange the lead eight times during the next ten minutes of the game, before DSU used a Cedric Harper put back tip to take a 53-52 lead at the 5:24 mark. The bucket sparked a 19-6 run during the final five minutes, which helped Delta State secure the victory.

Justice finished with a game-high 22 points for the Blazers, while PJ Davis and Harper teamed up for a perfect 13-of-13 shooting effort from the field and a combined 31 points.

Valdosta State fell to 18-4 overall and 13-3 in conference play, while DSU lifted their record to 15-6, 9-5 against GSC opponents.

Dramatic Comeback Gives Blazers 89-75 OT Win Over Union

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State Blazers overcame a slow start on offense with a gutsy comeback effort that led to an 89-75 overtime Gulf South Conference win over the visiting Union Bulldogs in Valdosta, Ga. on Thursday night.

Valdosta State used a spark of the bench in the final minutes of the opening period in the form of Jimmy Kodet. The junior forward ended the Blazers fought from three-point range with a pair of long distance shots during a one-minute span between the third and second minute mark. The two shots helped the Blazers to a 17-9 run during the final seven minutes of the half and pulled VSU to within 12 at 39-27 at intermission.

Damian Young buried three guick buckets during the first three minutes of banian long out the quick obtacts uning the first interminates to help pull Valdosta State to within six at 43-37. Fueled by a lively crowd, Beau Justice then caught fire and scored 10 points on three treys and a free throw within a three-minute window.

That crowd support became a huge factor late in the contest, when Blazer forward Justin Simon hit a close range shot in the final minute of regulation to the the contest up at 74-74. Ashanth Jay was fouled on a rebound attempt in the closing seconds, which afforded the Union standout a chance to give the Bulldogs a late lead from the free throw line with just seconds to spare. The 1,114 in attendance came to life prior to his free throw attempt, however, and produced a deafening roar to help influence a misfire by Day and force overtime.

"Union is a great team," added Helfer. "They are big and strong, and they shoot it extremely well, which makes them difficult to guard. Tonight was a game that brought out our guys' heart and desire. We were struggling so much and had to dig deep. It was one of the best comeback wins of my coaching career

Hill finished with 30 points in the game, which upped the senior's career point total up to 914 points. He hit 9-of-20 from the field, with 11 free throws, four assists, and two steals. Justice contributed with four second-half threes and 19 points in the game.

Blazers Stifle Bucs In 79-65 GSC Win

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Blazers took an early lead and never looked back in a 79-65 victory over the Christian Brothers Bucs in Gulf South Conference action on Saturday at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga

Beau Justice ignited the Blazers (20-4, 15-3 GSC) less than one minute into the game with a three-pointer from the right wing. The long range shot accounted for three of Justice's team-high 21 points in the game and gave VSU a lead they never relinquished throughout the rest of the contest.

"We're the type of team, that once we see one go early, that really gets us going," said Justice after the win. "I was lucky enough to hit that three, and that got the crowd into it early as well. Once the crowd started going, I knew were going to take off and have a good start."

In front of a crowd of over 2,000 people, the largest of the year, the Blazers led by as many as 19 in the first half and opened the lead up even further to a 20-point advantage after a close-range shot at the 15:36 mark in the second half by Sadaij Mulhammad, who closed out with 17 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field and a 4-of-5 effort from the charity stripe.

The big lead was more than enough for the Blazers down the stretch, thanks in large part to a 52.3 percent shooting display in the second half, during which the Blazers buried 18 shots on 34 attempts.

Justice finished 6-of-13 from the field, with all six of those field goals coming from beyond the arc. The sophomore added three free throws and was helped out along the way on offense by both Muhammad and Josh Lemons, who connected on six shots from the field for 12 points in the game.

Valdosta State controlled the ball and valued possessions effectively all night long. Head Coach Mike Helfer's squad issued just five turnovers on the night, which helped the team negate a strong effort by the CBU (14-10, 11-7 GSC) reserves, who teamed up for 23 points off the bench.

The win marked VSU's 20th of the 2017 season and set the stage for the year's most anticipated matchup next Thursday, as the Blazers travel to Huntsville, Ala. for a battle against Alabama-Huntsville.

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. – The No. 25 Valdosta State men's basketball team secured a position all alone at the top of the Gulf South Conference standings, following a thrilling 84-81 overtime victory over the No. 19 Alabama-Huntsville Chargers on Thursday night in Huntsville, Ala.

The win helped the Blazers secure hosting rights for a first round GSC quarterfinal playoff game on February 28th and represented a key regional victory, as UAH entered the contest ranked No. 1 in the South Region. Valdosta State improved to 21-4 overall and 16-3 in conference play following the win, while the Chargers fell to 19-6 overall and 15-4 against league opponents.

The Chargers jumped out to an early 10-0 lead during the first two minutes of the contest, before Jeremiah Hill buried a three Dall to put the Blazers on the board at the 17:34 mark. The Chargers maintained their lead and increased their advantage to nine, at 21-12 at the 11:51 mark.

Valdosta State remained calm, however, and scored 15 unanswered points over the next four minutes to claim a 27-21 advantage. The Blazers held strong to that lead and extended it to 39-31 at the break, thanks to a strong offensive effort late in the first half that was fueled in large part by the long range shooting of Damian Young, who connected on three first half three

A Tanner Finlay dunk put the Chargers in front 30 seconds later, before Justin Simon hit a layup to tie it right back up at 71-71. In the final minute Troy Saxton put back a missed three point attempt by Seab Webster, and UAH held the lead until the final two seconds, when Justice hit a tough three to beat the buzzer and force overtime.

The overtime period featured six lead changes, the last of which occurred when Hill buried a layup to give the Blazers an 82-81 lead with 15 seconds remaining. Saadig Muhammad came up with a steal during UAH's final possession to help secure the win for the Blazers.

Young proved to be one of the top stories of the night and represented the leading scorer for the Blazers off the bench with a team-high 20 points on 8-of-13 shooting from the field and a 4-of-8 effort from beyond the arc. Simon bolstered the Blazers with 11 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double, and Justice poured in 17 points.

The sharpshooting performance helped the Lions close the gap and overtake the Blazers for a 50-48 lead less than five minutes into the second period.

The two teams went blow for blow over the next 13 minutes, leading up to a Dimario Jackson three, which put the Lions up 73-71 at the 2-13 mark. The Blazers ted the game up at 73-73 when Saadig Muhammad backed down his defender for a close-range bucket inside the final minute of regulation, but UNA freed right back with a Jeff Hodge free throw to reclaim a 74-73 lead with 19 seconds to play.

Trailing by one, Helfer called on senior guard Josh Lemons, who delivered with a left handed layup with six seconds to play for two of his 16 points on the night. The Cincinnatin native didn't stop there, however, as the Lions' attempt at a game winner was denied when Lemons took a charge with just two seconds remaining on the game clock. Two Lemons free throws followed, and the Blazers escaped with the narrow win.

"Josh made a winning play by taking a charge on UNA's last possession," stated Helfer. "Plays like that don't always make the papers, but it's worth talking about. He has taken more charges than any player I've ever coached.

Lemons led the way offensively, while Jeremiah Hill, Beau Justice, and Mu-hammad each delivered 14 points in the game. Meanwhile, Carlos Beverly gave VSU a boost on the boards with a team-high eight rebounds.

Blazer Basketball Defeats Shorter; Locks Up First Place Playoff Seed

VALDOSTA, Ga. – An impressive victory over Shorter, combined with a surprising loss elsewhere for the Alabama-Huntsville Chargers, allowed the Valdosta State men's basketball team to claim the title of 2017 Gulf South Conference Regular Season champs on Thursday night in Valdosta, Ga.

In front of another rowdy crowd at The Complex, the Blazers survived a record-setting night by the league's leading scorer, Phil Taylor, with a career-high effort from senior guard Jeremiah Hill. Hill poured in seven three pointers in the game, six of which came in the first half. The hot hand led the Savannah, Ga. nactive to a progressively confident performance on offens that included a 12-of-20 hooting display from the field and a 5-of-8 effort from the stripe. Hills 36-point night narrowly topped his previous 35-point career high, achieved just three weeks ago against Mississippi College. Furthermore, Hill crept to within 10 of his 1,000th career point as a three-year Rlazer.

Valdosta State used a pair of threes by Beau Justice and Hill within the first two minutes of the game to jump out to a 6-2 start, and the Blazers never looked back from there. The Blazers screed 19 points in the first five minutes of the game and used a 53-1 percent (17-of-32) shooting performance from the field and a 47.4 percent (19-of-19) shooting effort from beyond the arc to open up a 56-44 advantage at intermission.

In the second half, the Blazers allowed 32 second half points by Taylor, but countered with a 64.5 percent shooting display (20-of-31), which kept Valdosta State in front by 10-plus points throughout the entirety of the second half.

Taylor finished with 53 points, the most ever scored by a single player in a matchup of two Gulf South Conference teams. In addition, the senior shot 26 free throws and connected on all 26, which also set a new GSC mark in both categories.

Saadiq Muhammad joined Hill for 21 points on the night, which marked his highest single game point total since his 26-point performance against Southeastern on November 21, 2016. The senior took ten shots and hit seven, which lifted his league-leading field goal shooting percentage to 61.6 percent

Blazers Earn Regular Season GSC Title; Hill Scores 1,000th Career Point

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The seven seniors of Valdosta State men's basketball finished the regular season in style, as Jeremiah Hill scored his 1,000th career point, and the Blazers outlasted Lee 83-72 in The Complex on Saturday evening in Valdosta, Ga.

The Blazers used a dunk by Hill within the first 30 seconds of the game to open up the scoring, and VSU expanded on that early success throughout the first half with a 43.2 percent (13-6-737) shooting effort from the field and a 41.7 effort (5-of-12) from beyond the arc. As a result, the Blazers took an 11-point, 44-33 lead to the locker room at halftime.

It was all Blazers in the first five minutes of the second half, as VSU manufactured a 14-5 run to open up a 20-point lead with just over 14 minutes to go in regulation. Valdosta State retained a fairly significant advantage until around the 8:30 mark, when Lee got a three-pointer from Keevin Tyus, which sparked a minimal run that allowed the Flames to slowly trim VSU's lead to single digits.

In fact, Lee pulled to within six two different times in the final three minutes of the game, before Justin Simon put the nail in the coffin with a layup at the 2:15 mark to put VSU on top 79-71.

Valdosta State's offensive effort was one of its most balanced of the season, as six different players reached double-digit figures in the contest. Simon led the way with 15 points, while Carlos Beverly provided a boost on the boards after hauling in a team-high 11 rebounds off the bench.

The Blazers led the Flames 49-41 in the rebounding column, which led to 22 put-back points on 19 offensive rebounds for Valdosta State. In addition, VSU protected the ball well with just eight turnovers in the contest.
