

QUICK NOTES:

- VSU jumped to No. 12 on the NCAA National Rankings as voted on by the NABC Coaches last week. The Blazers 19-2 record earned them 216 total votes in the polls. Fellow GSC team West Florida made the national rankings at 20th.
- Following a dominant victory over West Georgia and a pair of overtime conference victories on the road last week, men's baskethall Head Coach Mike Helfer was honored on a national level as the HoopDirt. com National Division II Coach of the Week.
- Junior gaurd Beau Justice earned his second GSC Player of the Week honors this month after setting new career highs in back-to-back games over the weekend. Justice poured 32 points vs. AUM on Friday night and proceeded to put up an astonishing 40 points against West Georgia two days later. the gaurd connected for 10-11 three pointers in the Blazers 114-92 win last Sunday.
- · Justice's efforts have placed him on the watchlist for the top 100 student-athletes for the Bevo Francis Award. The prestegious award is presented annually to the player with the finest overall season within Small College Basketball, given to just one college basketball player annually.
- Junior transfer Clay Guillozet has been an offensive juggernaut as of lately for the Blazers. He drained a season-high 24 points against North Alabama in Saturday nights road matchup, and contributed 17 points in the overtime win against UAH.



13TH SEASON CAPITAL 1989



Entering his 13th year with Valdosta State, Mike Helfer has established himself as one of the top coaches in the nation. After all, in his first 12 years, he has compiled a 201-119 record, including winning seasons in nine of his 11 years, and repeatedly established his program as one of the most exciting teams in the Gulf South Conference, South Region, and nationwide.

The Blazers returned to form in 2015-16 with a 17-11 overall record and a 13-9 conference record. The season included a slew of near-misses

as VSU took teams into overtime seven times and fell in five of those hardfought contests. Valdosta State's run last season led to a return to the Gulf South Conference Tournament, marking Helfer's 10th appearance in the playoffs as a head coach at VSU.

Helfer's plan for the Valdosta State program nearly reached its pinnacle in 2009-10 as his team advanced further than any squad in school history. En route to advancing to the national quarterfinals. Helfer directed his team to a school record 28 victories, against just five defeats, and claimed a share of the program's second straight Gulf South Conference East Division title. The Blazers reached as high as No. 2 in the national polls during the year, the highest VSU has ever been ranked nationally, and twice defeated the No. 1 team in the nation, the first incident coming in an 81-75 victory over Augusta State during the regular season and the second occurring when Valdosta State defeated Arkansas Tech 72-60 in the semifinals of the NCAA South Region Tournament. The 28 victories on the year marked the second-highest win total in a single season for Helfer in his 13-year coaching career.

Personal honors were handed out to various Blazers at the conclusion of the season, led by Tyrone Curnell who was named the Gulf South Conference and South Region Player of the Year while earning All-America honors for the second straight season. Helfer shared the GSC East Division Coach of the Year honors, earning the award for the second straight year. Ricardo Lewis was also honored by the Gulf South Conference as he joined Curnell on the first team All-Conference squad.

The single season wins record was not the only Blazer school record to fall during the season as Valdosta State also established a new school mark for points in a season, finishing the year with 2,666 to surpass the old mark of 2,591 set during the 1967 season. The aggressive Blazers also established a new school mark of free throw attempts in a season, tallying 812 attempts on the year, while Curnell set the individual record in both free throws made and free throw attempts, connecting on 156-of-226 attempts on the season to best both old school marks by two. Valdosta State fell just one win shy of tying the school record for consecutive victories in a season as it went 15 mes, a stretch that lasted from December 15 until February 18, without losing a contest.

The success of the 2009-10 season was not an overnight occurrence

as Helfer spent four years prior to that year establishing the Blazers as one of the top school in the NCAA Division II ranks. His first four years with Valdosta State saw his teams play in a pair of NCAA South Region Tournaments while the Blazers won the Gulf South Conference East Division title in 2008-09, just the third time in school history that the Blazers finished first in the league's division

Helfer's ability to teach the game of basketball was never more evident than the 2008-09 season, when in addition to the GSC East Division title and a NCAA South Regional appearance, he led his squad to a 24-7 record, despite losing four starters from the previous year. The squad, which featured 10 new players, went 9-3 in conference play and advanced to the championship game of the league tournament. Helfer's direction helped several Blazers earn individual honors, led by Curnell, who earned All-America status from the National Association of Basketball Coaches while also being named to the All-Gulf South Conference squad. Curnell and Lewis each earned GSC All-Tournament honors during the season while Helfer was named the GSC East Division Coach of the Year at the conclusion of the season.

Helfer turned in perhaps his finest coaching performance the year after the magical 2009-10 season as he again directed his squad to a 20win season, despite having to completely retool and reload his squad after massive losses from the previous year's team. The 2010-11 Valdosta State team lost nine out of the 12 players that led the team to the the 2009-10 Elite Eight, which accounted for 78.3 percent of the team's scoring and 83.0 percent of its rebounding.

With an entirely new squad, Helfer led his squad to a 21-9 record and a second place finish in the GSC's East Division, Two Blazers, Kevin Harris and Christian Hunter, earned All-Gulf South Conference honors while the team tallied 277 three-pointers on the season, a new school record. The 21 victories gave Valdosta State its third straight season of 20 or more wins, marking just the second time in school history VSU accomplished that feat, with the other occurrence coming during between 1965 and 1968.

After going 11-16 in 2011-12, Helfer once again proved his ability as a team builder as he returned just one player for his 2012-13 squad. The job Helfer turned in during his seventh year was nothing short of masterful as he molded a collection of new players into a team that improved with each passing game. The 2012-13 Blazers finished the year with a 19-10 record, including a 9-9 mark in GSC play, but saved their best for last as they charged through the GSC Tournament, including an upset of sixth-ranked Alabama-Huntsville, before falling 65-62 to Christian Brothers in the Championship game.

Three Blazers earned All-Gulf South Conference honors at the end of the 2012-13 season, including Josh Sparks, who earned All-Region honors after setting a new VSU and GSC record with 100 blocks on the season. He was joined on the All-GSC team by guard Patrick Diop and forward James Anacreon.

Helfer inherited a team that averaged 68.0 points a game in 2004-05 and led it to a 17-11 mark while averaging 83.5 points a game in 2005-06, his first season at the helm of the Blazers. Helfer's first squad went 7-7 in Gulf South Conference play and finished tied for fourth in the league's East Division. Two of Helfer's players, Jon Rogers (First) and Michael Crane (Second), were named to the All-GSC team while Rogers also earned All-GSC Tournament honors after VSU advanced to the tournament's quarterfinals.



Blazers Outlast FVSU for 83-81 Win in Season Opener

Valdosta State Wins, 83-81

VALDOSTA, Ga. – The Valdosta State men's basketball team survived a scare down the stretch to lock up an 83-81 win over Fort Valley State at the Gulf South Conference/Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference on Saturday in Pensacola, Fla.

Fort Valley State's production in the paint proved to be problematic for the Blazers throughout the night, as the Wildcats put up 40 points on the inside. Valdosta State used a solid effort off the bench, however, to help even things out. Led by Clay Guillozet's 10-point performance, Valdosta State benefited from 26 points off the bench.

By halftime, the Blazers were well in control of the contest with a 48-32 lead. In that first period, VSJ shot 63.0 percent from the field and connected on 9-of-17 from beyond the arc for a sizzling 52.9 percent three-point shooting percentage. Meanwhile, the Blazer defense held FVSU to just a 36.4 shooting percentage from the field prior to the half.

The second half was a bit of a different story, as the Blazers cooled off from the field while the Wildcats racked up 19 field goals on 38 tries for a 50 percent second-half shooting effort. The offensive performance helped Fort Valley string together a 10-2 run in the final two minutes of the game, but the Wildcats misfired on a last second shot to allow VSU to escape with the win.

Overall, the Blazers outshot the Wildcats by over 10 percentage points from the field, and a 25-point performance by Preseason All-GSC Selection Beau Justice helped lead the way. Justice finished 7-of-10 overall and 5-of-7 from the three point line, while both KJ James and Winston Morgan each added 12.

For the Wildcats, Tyler Edwards did a majority of the offensive damage with 21 points, while three other players reached double-digit figures in the scoring column. Valdosta State picked up the win despite being outrebounded 41-32 on the night.

PENSACOLA, Fla. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team connected nine times from the three point line on 11 attempts in the second half to run away with a 100-76 win over the Albany State Golden Rams in south region NCAA basketball action at the SIAC/GSC Crossover on Sunday afternoon in Pensacola, Fla.

Jimmy Kodet constructed a breakout offensive effort with a career-high 18 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the floor and a 4-of-6 performance from three-point range. Meanwhile, Beau Justice delivered his second straight 20-plus point effort with 21 points on 7-of-11 shooting and a 5-of-7 effort from long distance.

The sharpshooting display of the Blazer offense wasn't just limited to the second half, as Valdosta State connected on 16-of-28 from long distance over the course of the entire game for a 57.1 percent three-point shooting effort. The percentage marked the highest for the program since February 18, 2016, when former Blazer Jeremiah Hill connected on a school record 11 threes in Livingston, Ala. Newcomers Winston Morgan and Tyrone Sam rounded out the long distance assault with four and three treys, respectively.

Valdosta State's offense produced a balanced attack, with six different players reaching double-digit figures in the scoring column. KJ James and Clay Guillozet were among those six, and both finished just shy of a double-double with nine rebounds each.

With the victory, the Blazers improved to 2-0 on the young season, while the Golden Rams fell to 0-2. As representatives of the Gulf South Conference in the weekend crossover, both West Florida and VSU were a perfect 3-0 against Fort Valley State and Albany State heading into the final matchup between West Florida and FVSU later on Sunday afternoon.

TUSKEGEE, ALA. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team outlasted a pesky Tuskegee team to extend their early season winning streak to three with a 75-61 win in non-conference action on Saturday afternoon in Tuskegee, Ala.

The Blazers didn't perform at their full potential on offense in the close-quarters arena, but a strong defensive effort and a gritty performance in the remaining facets of the game allowed Head Coach Mike Helfer's crew to compensate for a below-average shooting performance.

KJ James reached the double-double mark for the first time this season with 12 boards and 12 points in the game, and Tyrone Sam led the team offensively with his second straight 20-point perfor-

As a team, the Blazers shot just 40 percent (22-of-55) from the floor and 20 percent (4-of-20) from beyond the arc. The red and black softened the w from the free throw line, however, with 27 points and a 75 percent (27-of-36) shooting effort from the stripe.

"We have a long way to go, but we are getting better in areas of concern," added Helfer. "We are certainly looking forward to playing in The Comadded Helfer. plex on Tuesday for our first home game of the year.

The Blazers (5-0) entered Saturday's contest as the Gulf South Conference leaders in points scored per game with an average of 94.5 per contest. Valdosta State needed every bit of that offensive production to outlast the Broncos (1-3), who shot 44.2 percent from the field and were led by the 27 points of Josh Bryant.

Valdosta State wasn't as productive from the three point line as they have grown accustomed to during the young season, but a 51.6 percent shooting effort from the field helped even out the afternoon for Helfer's

After the Broncos outscored the Blazers 14-4 during the final four minutes of the first half to close VSU's lead to 35-33, VSU came out of the break with guns blazing for a 20-5 run in the first six minutes of the second half. The surge gave the Blazers their biggest lead of the afternoon at 55-38, but Fayetteville State refused to backdown.

A pesky Broncos squad closed the gap to just eight near the ten minute mark in the second half, but Valdosta State weathered the storm during the final ten minutes to hold the opposition at bay.

KJ James complemented Sam and Justice on offense with 13 points, while Winston Morgan efficiently managed the distribution with eight assists on the afternoon.

Sam's career high performance included a 10-of-13 effort from the field. Twelve of his 33 points came from the free throw line, as the junior shot 12-of-14 from the stripe. Meanwhile, Justice connected on 8-of-13 from the field and 3-of-6 from the three point line. Justice is now averaging 19.8 points per game, which places the junior 5th on the current GSC leaderboard.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The No. 20 ranked Blazers of Valdosta State delivered another impressive offensive effort in a 104-68 non-conference win over Webber International in men's basketball action on Sunday afternoon at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

The Blazers enjoyed another balanced outing on the attack, as five different players reached double-digit figures in the scoring column. The Blazers used a quick layup and a three ball by Winston Morgan in the first minute of the contest to jump out to a 5-0 lead over the Wild-ats. The advantage was one the Blazers would hang on to for the first eight minutes of the game, until the Wildcats turned the game around midway through the first half and took a 27-19 lead with three straight

With the help of a strong 13-point first half by Jimmy Kodet, Valdosta State whittled FV2U's lead away throughout the remainder of the first half and pulled even with a fastbreak dunk by KI ames with just 14 seconds left in the frame. However, a two-handed put-back dunk by Glemont in the final seconds put FV3U back in front for a 36-34 lead at intermission

The second half proved to be the beginning of the end for the Blazers, thanks in large part to a downward spiral on offense for VSU. Valdosta State shot just 8-of-31 from the field for 25.8 percent in the second half and connected on just 1-of-11 from three point range for a paltry 9.1 percent. As a result, the Wildcats outscored the Blazers 46-34 in the final period to run away with the victory.

Tyrone Sam led the way for the Blazers with 15 points, while Justin Mc-Bride made his Blazer debut with nine rebounds to tie Clay Guillozet for the team lead on the boards.

With the loss, Valdosta State fell to 7-2 overall. Meanwhile, the Wildcats improved to 6-4 on the season.

Valdosta State will return to Gulf South Conference action this Saturday at 4:00 p.m. against the visiting Montevallo Falcons. The contest will mark the first conference game of the season to take place at The Complex.

The initial overtime period featured five lead changes, before Montevallo used a circus three-point shot by Taylor to open up a 113-109 lead with 12 seconds remaining. When all seemed lost for the Blazers, KJ James drew a foul at the 0:04 mark and pulled the Blazers to second free throw, the senior transfer purposely missed the shot to give VSU an attempt at an offensive rebound. Greg Zuppas was there to save the possession, and threw the ball off of a Montevallo player as he recovered it just before falling out of bounds. With two seconds to go, the inbounds pass from season from the right corner as time expired to the the game at 113-113 and force double overtime.

Double overtime was more of the same, as the two teams went toe-to-toe throughout to send the game to yet another overtime period. With the score knotted at 124-124, Valodate State finally managed to extend the game beyond the Falcons' reach, thanks in large part to a pair of timely three point shots by Jimmy Kodet, who finished with a career-high 21 points in the game.

Taylor racked up a game-high 40 points in the game on a 14-of-28 performance from the field, and Chris Williams scored 36 points, 17 of which came on 19 attempts from the free throw line. Valdosta State countered the duo, however the control of t

The win, which replaced a 136-point night against Troy State in 1991-92 for a new school record, marked Valdosta State's first Gulf South Conference victory of the 2017-18 season and moved the Blazers to 8-2 overall and 1-1 in league play. Furthermore, Beau Justice poured in 16, despite a clear effort by the Tigers to limit the junior guard's opportunities.

As a team, Valdosta State posted another strong offensive outing with a 50.0 percent performance (28-of-56) from the field and a 42.3 percent effort (11-of-26) from the three point line. Most impressive, however, was the team's free throw shooting display, which resulted in a season-high 92.9 percentage from the stripe. Valdosta State is now shooting 74.5 percent from the free throw line this season, which places the Blazers 3rd overall in the Gulf South Conference.

KJ James served as the game breaker for Valdosta State on the night, pouring in a career high 32 points, which eclipsed his 24-point effort against West Alabama on December 18th to set a new career-high for the senior forward.

Shorter (1-13, 1-5 GSC) gave the Blazers (11-2, 4-1 GSC) trouble throughout the first half of the contest, and Drew Thomas closed out the frame with a long three inside the final five seconds of the first half to put the Hawks on top 34-33 at the break.

The Blazers weathered the storm, however, and with the spark of a Jimmook oded three ball during the first minute of the second half, the Blazers took a lead that they would never again relinquish.

Beau Justice, who was named the GSC Player of the Week a few hours prior to tipoff, delivered another 20-plus point performance with 23 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the field and a 3-of-4 effort from logistance. In addition, Justice hit 6-of-6 from the free throw line, extending his total of consecutive free throws to 19 straight and improving his free throw sporting percentage to 91.5 on the year. Justice leads the league in free throw shooting and represents the only player to have a percentage above 90 percent above 90 percent.

Despite allowing 33 points to forward Josh Burnett, the Blazer defense held the Hawks to just 6-of-24 from the three point line for 25.0 percent. Perimeter defense, along with poor free throw shooting by Shorter, allowed the Blazers to retain momentum heading into the weekend.

The Statesmen, who entered the contest having allowed just 56 points or less in their last three games, were unable to solve the Blazers, thanks to a balanced effort by Valodsta State that included a 46.2 percent shooting effort from the field. In addition, VSU outrebounded the Statesmen 34-25.

Despite an early jump by the Blazers in the first eight minutes of the opening half, the Statesmen put together an 11-5 run in a four minute span to pull to within a one point deficit at 18-19 with 8:50 to play in the period. Valdosta State remained resilient, however, and never coughed up the lead, thanks to some timely shots that included an earth-shaking put back dunk by Greg Zuppas in the final 17 seconds of the half.

Valdosta State held momentum in the second half, starting with a quick three-pointer by Jimmy Kodet that put VSU up 41-35 on the Blazers first second half possession. The shot sparked an extensive 27-15 run that lasted just under 10 minutes and helped VSU open up a 65-50 advantage for their largest lead of the night.

The Statesmen managed to whittle away at VSU's lead and pulled to within seven with just under three minutes to play, but the Blazers weathered the storm and used an 86.7 percent shooting effort (13-0f-13) from the free throw line in the second half to maintain the lead and secure the team's fifth consecutive with

Clay Guillozet, who delivered a career high 24 points against Lee on the road last week, put up another strong offensive effort with 18 points scored on 7-of-12 shooting from the field. Guillozet enjoyed as trong supporting cast that included Beau Justice, KJ James, and Winston Morgan, who each posted double-digit figures in the scoring column with 17, 15, and 13 points, respectively.

Valdosta State improved to 12-2 overall and 5-1 in Gulf South Conference play for a tie with West Florida at the top of the league standings. Mean-while, Delta State dropped to 7-8 overall and fell to 5-2 against league opponents.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - Winston Morgan It up The Complex with nine threes and 27 points in a 101-78 rout of the Mississippi College Choctaws in Gulf South Conference action on Tuesday night in Valdosta, Ga.

The victory marked VSU's sixth consecutive victory and boosted the Blazers to a 13-2 overall record. Valdosta State has not lost a conference game since their GSC opener against West Florida in early December and now holds a 6-1 record against conference opponents. The loss for the Choctaws dropped MC to 7-7 overall and 4-5 against the GSC.

Morgan set the tone early on offense and came out swinging with his first three pointer of the night within the first 20 seconds of the game. With the help of a raucous crowd, the junior used the momentum to hit shot after shot, and he carried his performance well into the second half to top his previous season high of eight threes, which came in a win over Montevallo before the Christmas break.

As of Tuesday night, Morgan ranked sixth in the country in total three pointers made with 56, and his 49.1 shooting percentage from beyond the arc placed him in a tie for 13th among all DII players.

Valdosta State's barrage of offense didn't stop at Morgan, as three other players posted double-digit figures. The additional contributors included Justin McBride, who delivered a breakout performance with a career-high 20 points. The 6'-11" big man also came up just one rebound shy of a double-double, while KJ James reached the mark with 13 points and 11 rebounds.

The Blazers controlled the game throughout, thanks in large part to a paltry five turnover total on the night. Valdosta State recorded more steals than turnovers with six, and the red and black defense topped both of those numbers with a whopping seven blocks.

Valdosta State Wins, 72-70

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - The Valdosta State Blazers trailed for most of the second half, but took the lead when they needed to in order to claim a massive 72-70 Gulf South Conference win over the Christian Brothers Bucs on Saturday night in Memphis, Tenn.

Although the Blazers trailed for most of the second half, Valdosta State pulled to within one point nine different times in the period. A layup by Beau Justice at the 1:58 mark trimmed CBU's lead to 70-69, and each team held the other scoreless during the next two possessions with a series of key defensive stops.

Valdosta State held possession with less than one minute remaining, and Greg Zuppas narrowly missed a well contested layup from the left side. Zuppas corralled in his own rebound, however, and managed to call time out as he fell toward the sideline to keep the ball in VSU's hands. Following the timeout, Winston Morgan missed a three, but Justice hauled in the offensive board to give Valdosta State yet another scoring opportunity. This time, the Blazers wouldn't miss, as Morgan made the adjustment for his only three of the game, a go-ahead bucket from the left corner on VSU's final possession, which gave VSU a two point edge and proved to be the deciding basket.

Prior to the shot, Morgan was an uncharacteristic 0-of-5 from the three point line. The sharp shooter credited his teammates, however, for giving him the mental edge he needed to fire up the game-winner during the final 30 seconds.

KJ James poured in 15 points and racked up 10 rebounds for his second double-double of the week and his third of the season. Meanwhile, Justice hit the 20-point mark again with an 8-of-17 shooting effort from the field and a 4-of-7 performance from the three point line. The point total represented Justice's ninth game of the season in which the Junior has scored 20 or more points in a single game. Jimmy Kodet also added 11 points, including two huge three pointers in the second half that helped keep the Blazers within striking distance.

Justice finished the night with 13 field goals on 22 attempts, and six of those makes were from long distance.

Four other Blazers reached double digits in the scoring column, as Jimmy Kodet scored 17, Clay Guillozet and KJ James notched 16 each, and Winston Morgan added 11. As a team, the Blazers committed just four turnovers on the night and shot for a whopping 56 percent in front of a large, lively crowd of 1,831.

Blazer Defeat UWG; Justice Posts Second Straight Career Night

Valdosta State Wins, 114-92

VALDOSTA, Ga.- For the second time in three days, Beau Justice topped a career high point total to fuel the Valdosta State men's basketball team in a 114-92 Gulf South Conference victory over the West Georgia Wolves on Sunday afternoon at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

After scoring what was at the time a career high on Friday night against Auburn Montgomery, Justice didn't settle and proceeded to rack up a whopping 40 points against one of VSU's biggest rivals on Sunday. Justice literally could not miss throughout the majority of the contest. In fact, the Peebles, Ohio native was a perfect 9-of-9 from the three point line before he finally missed from long distance with 6:49 left in the game.

Justice finished the night 10-of-11 from beyond the arc and added five more buckets all total for a 15-of-19 performance from the field. The effort capped off a week in which the junior averaged 29.3 points per game and 4.7 rebounds per game. Since the Blazers squared off against Union on Monday, Justice has connected on 18-of-31 three pointers for 58.1 percent. On top of that, he has turned the ball over just twice.

The Blazers opened up the scoring during the first minute with a layup from Clay Guillozet, before the Wolves returned fire with a layup by Marquill Smith, who entered the contest ranked second in the GSC with an average of 21.6 points per game. Guillozet struck again one minute later, however, with another bucket, and Valdosta State never looked back. In fact, the Blazers took complete control of the game during the first ten minutes after a three ball by Winston Morgan gave VSU a double-digit, lead at the 11:19 mark. The Blazers would never allow the Wolves to pull the deficit back to within single digits on the scoreboard.

Other contributors for the Blazers included KJ James, who scored 20 and ripped down 10 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the year and his fourth in the last five games. Additionally, Morgan added 17, while Guillozet and Jimmy Kodet picked up 15 and 11, respectively.

Blazer Extend Streak With Overtime Win Over

Valdosta State Wins, 97-93

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. - The Valdosta State men's basketball team survived a slow start on the road to claim a thrilling overtime Gulf South Conference victory over Alabama-Huntsville, as the Blazers took down the Chargers 97-93 on Thursday night at Spragins Hall in Huntsville, Ala.

Senior forward KI James showed off his versatility with six three pointers in the contest, including two treys in Valdosta State's 22-point overtime period. James 28-point performance led the Blazers in the scoring column and helped VSU overcome a six-point halftime deficit.

Valdosta State took a one-point lead on a Clay Guillozet free throw with 2:34 to go in regulation, and the Blazers extended the lead to three at 75-72 when Guillozet finished a fastbreak with a right hand jam two possessions later. The Chargers had an opportunity to tie the game on the final possession, and UAH guard Seth Swalve delivered with a desperation three from the top of the key as time expired.

The Blazers remained calm and collective during the extra frame, and James helped VSU reclaim momentum with a three in the first 15 seconds of the overtime period. Though the Chargers kept the game close, the shot gave Valdosts State a lead they would not relinquish throughout the full duration of the overtime period. Winston Morgan, who finished with four threes and 15 points, helped keep VSU in front with two timely triples during the final five minutes.

Beau Justice, the reigning GSC Player of the Week, added 18 in the game, Guillozet poured in 17, and Greg Zuppas delivered 25 quality minutes with seven rebounds and 12 points.

With the win, the first place Blazers improved to 18-2 overall and lifted their con-ference record to 11-1. Valdosta State has now won 11 straight games. Even more impressive, is the fact that the Blazers have won 30 of their last 34 games against Gulf South Conference opponents. Alabama-Huntsville's loss marked only their second of the year at Spragins Hall and dropped the team to 12-8 on the year, 5-7 against league opponents.

Valdosta State Wins, 101-99

FLORENCE, Ala.- The Valdosta State men's basketball team picked up their 12th consecutive victory in a 101-99 overtime win over rival North Alabama in Gulf South Conference action on Saturday afternoon in Florence, Ala.

The overtime contest marked VSU's fourth of the season, each of which have resulted in Blazer wins. Furthermore, Valdosta State extended their current winning streak and picked up their 31st win in the program's last 35 GSC matchups dating back through the 2016-17 season.

This time out, Clay Guillozet served as the fuel for Valdosta State's high-octane offense. The sophomore scored the first five points of the game for the Blazers and proceeded to drop 24 on the Lions in the contest to match a previous season high, which Guillozet reached in an overtime road win over Lee back on January 2nd. The Ohio native buried 11-of-14 from the field and 2-of-4 from the free throw line, while adding six rebounds, five assists, and three steals.

Valdosta State trailed by as many as 13 with 15-plus minutes to play in the second half, before VSU began a slow, methodical comeback. For the next 10 minutes, the Blazers used their firepower to take their first lead of the second half with a two-handed KJ James dunk in transition.

Five lead changes and four ties ensued during the final five minutes of the contest, and VSU managed to thwart a potential game winner for UNA on the final possession of regulation to force overtime.

North Alabama scored the first two points of the overtime period on a pair of Sharwyn McGee free throws, but the Blazers returned fire with a three point play by Beau Justice to take a one-point lead. Kendall Stafford put UNA back in front with a tip-in on the ensuing possession, but VSU scored eight unanswered points with back-to-back threes by Winston Morgan and Jimmy Kodet, before Guillozet added a fastbreak layup. The lead was one the Blazers would not relinquish, despite a barrage of UNA three pointers down the stretch.
