

- · With the first release of the 2016-17 NCAA South Region rankings, Valdosta State falls in at No. 6. The Lady Blazers are one of just two GSC teams to crack the top six and one of just four GSC teams to crack the top 10.
- Among players who have competed in 20-plus games this season in the Gulf South Conference, Madi Mitchell leads the league in field goal percent-age. She has hit over half of the shots she has taken this season (144-of-282) for a 51.1 shooting percentage. Madi ranks fourth in the league in corrier with an in the league in scoring with an average of 16.4 points per game, and her average of 8.0 rebounds per contest places her ninth among conference players.
- The Lady Blazers hold an alltime record of 35-14 against Alabama-Huntsville. The two teams last met in Valdosta, Ga. on January 2nd, with Valdosta State taking a 76-66 win.
- A red hot Valdosta State team enters tonight's matchup looking for their sixth straight victory. Heading into the final four games of the regular season schedule, the Lady Blazers are currently in second place in the Gulf South Conference standings. UWF is in first with a narrow one-game lead.
- Kenya Samone' Dixon currently leads the Gulf South Conference in three point shooting percentage with 63-of-150 from long range and a percentage of 42.0. Furthermore, the junior ranks 20th in the country in the same category.

1ST SEASON - VALDOSTA STATE 2008



Carley Kuhns was named the Head Coach of the women's basketball program at Valdosta State prior to the start of the 2016-17 season.

Kuhns, and a 2015 Blazer Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, will take over at VSU following a six year stint as an assistant coach at Belmont, where she helped lead the Bruins to an Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2015-16 and the program's second NCAA Tournament appearance in the history of Bruin Basketball. During Kuhns' tenure at Belmont, she participated heavily in the program's recruiting process, and five of her recruits earned All-OVC recognition. In addition, Kuhns served as an academics and compliance liaison while also adding contributions with scouting, team workouts, camps, and the training of perimeter players. Her efforts helped lead the Bruins to a 24-9 record in 2015-16.

Kuhns went to the Bruins after completing a twovear graduate assistantship at Valdosta State. While with the Lady Blazers, she assisted with various components of the program. Within one month of joining the Bruin staff in 2010. Kuhns was named to the prestigious Gulf South Conference All-Decade Second Team for her stellar career on the hardwood at Valdosta State.

A former student-athlete at Valdosta State. Kuhns constructed her Hall of Fame career and received numerous honors from 2004 through 2008, including becoming the first Lady Blazer since 2001 to be named a Kodak/ State Farm WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. She also recorded 1,133 career points, the 16th-most in program history and was a two-time First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection. Her 262 three-pointers earned the sharpshooter ownership of the school record in the category and placed her 5th all-time in Gulf South Conference history.

The illustrious playing career of Kuhns also helped VSU earn a trip to the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen during her senior campaign with a 26-6 overall record. She led the team in scoring, averaging 10.4 points per game, and shot .373 percent from behind the threepoint arc that season. In her career, Kuhns also tallied 436 rebounds, 247 assists, 35 blocked shots, and 245 steals.

The approach with Kuhns at the helm is expected to bring an energetic, fast paced style of basketball with an effort to score quickly off the break on offense and put heavy pressure on the ball on defense.

Kuhns earned her Bachelor's in Physical Education from Valdosta State in 2008 and completed her Master's in Higher Education Leadership in 2010. She and her husband Matt, who also played basketball for Valdosta State, have two daughters, Carsten (2) and Kyler (6 months).

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Lady Blazer basketball team flourished in the second half to outlast the resilient Faulkner Eagles for an 80-68 non-conference victory in Valdosta, Ga. at The Complex on Thursday night.
Faulkner posted an impressive first half effort, in which the Eagles shot

The VSU defense held the rest of the way and spread the team's lead to four before the final buzzer with a series of critical free-throws.

For VSU, Cheatham recorded her first career double-double with a teamhigh 19 points (7-of-12) and ten rebounds. Lady Blazers Extend Streak to Five

Valdosta State Wins, 80-78

CLEVELAND, Tenn. – On a cold, snowy weekend in Cleveland, Tenn., the red hot Valdosta State women's basketball team caught fire in the second half on Saturday for an 80-78 comeback Gulf South Conference win over the Lee Lady Flames.

The loss for Lee marked their first home loss of the 2016-17 season and dropped the Lady Flames to 9-3 overall, 4-2 in GSC play. Meanwhile, the Lady Blazers scored their fifth straight victory to improve to 8-4 overall and 5-1 in conference play. The five-game winning streak marks the longest for VSLI since 2011-12, when the Lady Blazers regeled fit pine-straight

VSU since 2011-12, when the Lady Blazers reeled off nine-straight.
After a sub-par performance in the first half, the Lady Blazers scored just 25 points and trailed by 15 points heading into the halftime break. Lee expanded on their lead early in the second half and looked as if they might run away with the contest after opening up a 19-point advantage midway through the third quarter.

The Lady Blazers had other ideas, however, and it all started with junior Madi Mitchell. At the 5:18 mark in the third, Mitchell connected for a pair of free throws, which triggered a 20-5 run for Valdosta State over the final five minutes of the frame and allowed VSU to pull to within four at 57-53.

That momentum carried into the fourth, as Valdosta State continued to chip away before taking their first lead of the game at 76-74 on a pair of Mitchell free throws with 1:45 to play in regulation. The points represented two of a career-high 28-points by Mitchell, and although the Flames tied the game up twice during the final two minutes, the Lady Blazers never trailed again.

Valdosta State's final opportunity came with just 7.9 seconds to play in the fourth quarter, and guard Sonya Franklin answered the call with a cut to the basket and a successful layup at the 0.9-second mark. Lee's desperation attempt at the buzzer came up short, and VSU came away victorious.

Mitchell complemented her incredible offensive effort with 13 rebounds, which led to her seventh double-double of the season. She was accompanied by Franklin, Kenya Samone' Dixon, and Aaliyah Cheatham, each of which reached double-digit figures in the scoring column.

Lady Blazers Fall to Shorter, 70-63

ROME, Ga. -Valdosta State's winning streak came to an end on Monday night in Rome, Ga., as the Shorter Hawks outlasted the Lady Blazers for a 70-63 win in Gulf South Conference action.

The loss put a halt to VSU's longest winning streak since the 2011-2012 season and dropped the Lady Blazers to 8-5 overall and 5-2 in GSC play. Meanwhile, Shorter improved to 5-7 overall, 4-3 against league opponents.

Kenya Samone' Dixon matched a career high with 20 points on the night after shooting 7-of-19 from the field and 6-of 13 from the three point line. The performance went for naught, however, due to 21 turnovers in the contest by the red and black.

The Lady Blazers held a 52-51 advantage after three quarters of play and extended the lead to 55-51 after three quick points early in the final frame. Shorter took control of the game from that moment on, however, and outscored VSU 19-8 over the final eight minutes of the contest.

Taylor Adams, who came into the game as the league's leading rebounder, was held to just seven boards on the night by Valdosta State. The senior managed to offset that number though, with 25 points, 14 of which came in the second half. Adams led the way for the Hawks, while Raven Fair chipped in with 10 points. The Hawks also benefitted from a productive night at the free throw line that led to 21 points on 26 attempts.

CARROLLTON, Ga.- The Valdosta State women's basketball team fell short, as the Wolves of West Georgia used a strong fourth quarter to nip the Lady Blazers 63-53 in a Gulf South Conference game on Thursday night in Carrollton, Ga.

With the loss, Valdosta State dropped their overall record to 8-6 and 5-3 in conference action. Meanwhile, the Wolves lifted their season record to 6-6 overall and 5-3 in GSC play

In the first half, Kenya Samone' Dixon connected on 3-of-5 attempts from long range to help VSU outshine the Wolves with a 35.7 shooting percentage against West Georgia's 24.1. Collectively, the Lady Blazers hit -of-10 from beyond the arc compared and took a 28-19 advantage into the half.

Aysha Harris, who led the Wolves with 16 points in the game, set an alternate tone in the second half with a quick jumper, and teammate De'Ashia Jones came alive to score eight of her 13 points in the third frame alone. Jones' performance sparked a 22-point third quarter for the Wolves, which allowed UWG to tie the game up at 41-41, heading into the final period.

The Wolves took their first lead of the night at the 08:52 mark in the closing quarter on another jumper by Jones. Maddy Corazza promptly fired back with a pair of free throws to knot the score up at 43 all, but a critical and-one play from Harris put the Wolves back on top with 6:37 left in regulation. A five-minute drought from the field followed for the red and black, which allowed the Wolves to put the game out of reach.

For the Lady Blazers, Samone' Dixon shined with double-double per-formance, as she led VSU with a team high of 17 points 13 rebound. Cheatham and Franklin recorded 11 and ten points, respectively. Corazza led the team on the boards with a career-high 14 rebounds.

The highlight of the night was Valdosta State's offensive performance, which escalated quickly after Kenya Samone' Dixon connected for her first three of the game at the 7:25 mark in the opening quarter. The basket cut into an early 7-0 lead for the Tigers, and Samone' Dixon was relentless on the attack throughout the rest of the quarter. The junior shot a perfect 4-of-4 from beyond the arc, and Valdosta State managed to fashion a 21-19 lead by the end of the frame.

Valdosta State's defense then took over in the second quarter and allowed the Tigers to score just 10 points. In contrast, the Lady Blazers put up 17 points, which opened up a 38-29 advantage for the red and black at halftime.

The second half proved to be a battle, as West Alabama trimmed into VSU's lead with 24 third-quarter points. Trailing by just five heading into the final period, the Tigers pulled to within one point of the Lady Blazers seven different times in the final ten minutes and tied the game twice within the final four minutes. A gritty VSU squad held on, however, and a three-point play by Madi Mitchell inside the 3:00 mark proved to be the deciding moment, as VSU led the rest of the way.

Samone' Dixon obliterated her previous career-high with a total of 31 points on the day, while Mitchell added 18 points and Cheatham racked up 17. The Lady Blazers also enjoyed additional production on offense with scoring numbers from four other players.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Lady Blazers kicked off a new winning streak on Thursday night at The Complex, after holding off the Lady Statesmen of Delta State for a 53-50 Gulf South Conference win.

Jazmyn McIntosh ended the drought with a critical layup at the 4:53 mark, but Delta State fired right back with a pair of jumpers and a free throw to pull to within one. Mitchell delivered a timely jumper at the 2:12 mark, however, and despite continued pressure by DSU over the final two minutes, Valdosta State weathered the storm with some clutch free throw shooting by Cheatham and Franklin in the closing moments of the game.

Fourth Quarter Surge Produces VSU's Fourth Straight Win

CLEVELAND, Miss. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team extended their winning streak to four on Saturday afternoon with a 48-38 Gulf South Conference win over Delta State in Cleveland, Miss.

The triumph marked VSU's first against Delta State in Walter Sillers Coliseum since March 7, 1983, when VSU defeated the Lady Statesmen 85-83. VSU improved their overall record to 14-8 and 11-5 in GSC play. Meanwhile, the Lady Statesmen dropped to 8-12 on the season and 5-10 in conference action.

The two teams battled shot for shot throughout the first quarter, before a second quarter offensive drought allowed Delta State an opportunity to open up a significant lead. The Lady Blazers scored just three points in the second quarter until Sonya Franklin connected on a layup just 30 seconds prior to the half. DSU used 11 VSU turnovers to account for 14 of their first half points. The Lady Statesmen outscored the Lady Blazers 13-5 in the second quarter for a 12-point halftime lead.

Valdosta State exploded out of their locker room after the half with a quick bucket by Franklin at the 9:35 mark. The layup sparked a 9-2 run during the first six minutes of the third quarter to pull VSU to within five at 27-22, a spread which remained throughout the remainder of the third quarter.

The deciding frame came in the fourth, as the Lady Blazer defense locked down to allow the Lady Statesmen just four points during the entire quarter. Valdosta State countered with their biggest offensive surge of the night, a 19-point outpouring that afforded VSU a comfortable 10-point lead by the end of regulation.

Franklin teamed up with Madi Mitchell for 34 of VSU's 48 points in the game. Each had 17 points on offense, while Kenya Samone' Dixon just missed a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds.

Lady Blazers Clinch Playoff Spot With 75-59 Win Over Union

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team used an incredible first half shooting effort to roll to a 75-59 Gulf South Conference win over Union on Thursday night at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

The Lady Blazers shot 50.0 percent from the field in the first half and racked up an impressive 7-of-12 effort from the three point line for a 58.3 shooting percentage from downtown. In contrast, Valdosta State's defense held Union to 11-of-33 (33.3 percent) from the field and just 2-of-10 (20.0 percent) from beyond the arc during the first two quarters.

"We're feeling really good right now, very confident," said Kenya Samone' Dixon, who hit three fourth-quarter three pointers and connected on 5-of-6 from long range over the duration of the entire game. "We also know that just as quickly as we got on this high, it can also be taken away. We've got to be confident, but remember that there is always room for improvement.'

The opening half produced a 44-28 lead at the break, and the Lady Blazers were able to ride it out, despite the fact that Union shot over 40 percent from the field and matched VSU shot for shot throughout the second half.

Samone' Dixon led the way with 23 points in the game, while each of the other four starters also reached double-digit figures in the scoring col-umn on offense. Dixon also added 10 rebounds, which led to the eighth double-double of the season for the junior out of Baton Rouge, La.

"It's really easy for us to feel confident from the three point line or anywhere else when your coach believes in you," added Samone' Dixon. "We know Coach Kuhns believes in us, and we believe in each other as teammates. It makes you want to fire it up there, because you know that whether it goes in or goes out, they are still going to believe in you when you take that next shot.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - An incredible first half shooting display led the Valdosta State Lady Blazers to an 80-70 victory on Saturday afternoon over the Christian Brothers Lady Bucs in Valdosta, Ga. at The Complex.

The Lady Blazers connected on 16-of-25 attempts from the field in the first half for a 64.0 percent shooting effort. Furthermore, VSU buried 7-of-11 from beyond the arc with the help of Aaliyah Cheatham and Kenya Samone' Dixon, who teamed up for four of those treys and helped lead VSU to a 63.6 first-half percentage from long range.

The surge allowed VSU to take a 41-29 lead into the second half. The advantage proved to be very beneficial to Valdosta State down the stretch, as Christian Brothers used a 44.4 percent performance to bounce back and outscore the Lady Blazers 41-39 in a fast paced second-half.

Valdosta State went cold from beyond the arc in the second half with just two three-pointers on eight attempts. VSU overcame, however, thanks to a respectable 42.9 (12-of-28) effort from the field over the course of the third and fourth quarters.

Lady Bucs forward Samantha Reeves topped CBU with 20 points and seven rebounds, but Valdosta State saw four of its starting five reach double-digits in the scoring column. Cheatham led the way with 20 points on 5-of-13 shooting and an 8-of-8 effort from the free thow line. Meanwhile, Kenya Samone' Dixon buried 6-of-9 for 18 points, and Madi Corazza added on with 15 points of her own. Dixon also landed her second consecutive double-double and her ninth of the season after pulling down 12 rehounds.
