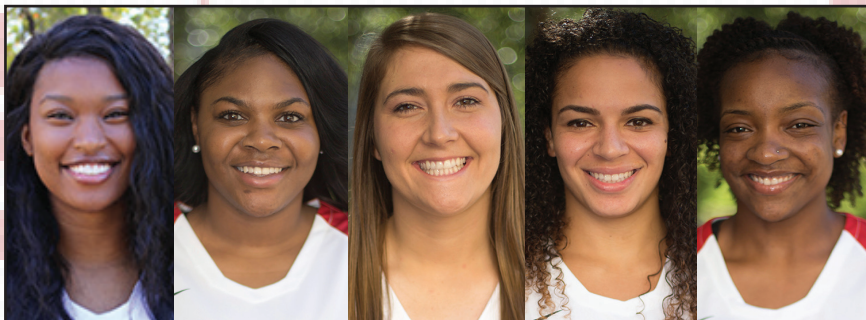

QUICK NOTES:

- Madi Mitchel became the 27th Lady Blazer in the history of Valdosta State basketball to join the 1,000 point club. The Senior drained a layup in Thursday nights road matchup against Shorter to earn her spot as the Lady Blazers won 63-41.
- Senior Madi Mitchell currently ranks among the league's top ten in points per game (15.9, 6th), field goal percentage (46.9, 5th), rebounds per game (5.2, 5th), and free throw percentage (73.5, 9th).
- An off night for the Lady Blazer offense led to 66-45 loss to the Lady Flames last Tuesday in a Gulf South Conference matchup at Paul Dana Walker Arena in Cleveland, Tenn.
- The Lady Blazers are currently ranked 6th in the Gulf South Conference in scoring with an average of 69.3 points per game. Defensively, VSU is 4th in the league, allowing an average of 58.8 points per game, resulting in a 10.8 point margin of victory on the year.
- Kenya Samone'-Dixon is currently 3rd in the league in rebounds, averaging 9.8 per game. The senior has pulled down 99 defensive and 27 offensive (126 total) for the Lady Blazers thus far. Samone'-Dixon also ranks among the top scorers in the league, averaging 12.1 points per game.
- The Lady Blazers' 22-win season last year marked their best since 2011-12, when the team went 22-8 en route to a sweet sixteen appearance. The GSC Championship win over West Florida gave Valdosta State its first conference title since 1984.

HEAD COACH CARLEY KUHN

2ND SEASON - VALDOSTA STATE 2008



Carley Kuhn enters her second season with Valdosta State on the heels of an incredible first year, in which she was named the Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year.

Under Kuhn's leadership, the 2016-17 season produced VSU's first 20-plus win since 2011 and the first NCAA South Regional Tournament appearance since 2010. With 26 wins against just six losses, Kuhn and the Lady Blazers claimed the program's first Gulf South Conference Championship since 1984.

Individual awards bestowed on Kuhn's players included All-GSC and All-Region honors for both Madi Mitchell and Kenya-Samone' Dixon. Furthermore, Mitchell earned All-American recognition by the WBCA to become VSU's first All-American since Brittany Ferguson in 2012.

Kuhn, a 2015 Blazer Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, took

over at VSU following a six year stint as an assistant coach at Belmont, where she helped lead the Bruins to an Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2015-16 and the program's second NCAA Tournament appearance in the history of Bruin Basketball. During Kuhn's tenure at Belmont, she participated heavily in the program's recruiting process, and five of her recruits earned All-OVC recognition. In addition, Kuhn served as an academics and compliance liaison while also adding contributions with scouting, team workouts, camps, and the training of perimeter players. Her efforts helped lead the Bruins to a 24-9 record in 2015-16.

Kuhn went to the Bruins after completing a two-year graduate assistantship at Valdosta State. While with the Lady Blazers, she assisted with various components of the program. Within one month of joining the Bruin staff in 2010, Kuhn was named to the prestigious Gulf South Conference All-Decade Second Team for her stellar career on the hardwood at Valdosta State.

A former student-athlete at Valdosta State, Kuhn constructed her Hall of Fame career and received numerous honors from 2004 through 2008, including becoming the first Lady Blazer since 2001 to be named a Kodak/State Farm WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. She also recorded 1,133 career points, the 16th-most in program history and was a two-time First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection. Her 262 three-pointers earned the sharpshooter ownership of the school record in the category and placed her 5th all-time in Gulf South Conference history.

The illustrious playing career of Kuhn also helped VSU earn a trip to the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen during her senior campaign with a 26-6 overall record. She led the team in scoring, averaging 10.4 points per game, and shot .373 percent from behind the three-point arc that season. In her career, Kuhn also tallied 436 rebounds, 247 assists, 35 blocked shots, and 245 steals.

The approach with Kuhn at the helm brings an energetic, fast paced style of basketball with an effort to score quickly off the break on offense and put heavy pressure on the ball on defense.

Kuhn earned her Bachelor's in Physical Education from Valdosta State in 2008 and completed her Master's in Higher Education Leadership in 2010. She and her husband Matt, who also played basketball for Valdosta State, have two daughters, Carsten (2) and Kyler (6 months).

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH

CHANDLER MERKERSON

(1ST SEASON, NORTH FLORIDA, 2014)



Merkersen serves as an exciting new addition to the coaching staff for the defending Gulf South Conference champions, with a list of notable accomplishments as both a player and a coach at the collegiate level.

Merkersen's experience as a student-athlete in the NCAA began at the University of North Florida in 2010, where she kicked off a career as a consistent starter for the Ospreys. Her senior season as a post player included 22 starts and resulted in a team-high 88.6 percent free throw shooting percentage.

The Florida native carried her love of basketball into a coaching career in 2014, when she transitioned into a graduate assistant role at Lincoln Memorial. While earning a Masters degree in Business Administration, Merkersen made the most of her two years and helped lead LMU to a 17-12 record in 2015-16. The successful season marked the program's most single-season wins in over ten years and led the team to its first ever semifinal appearance in the South Atlantic Conference Tournament.

BELLINGHAM, Wash. - In the midst of a lengthy road trip of both distance and duration, the No. 20 ranked Valdosta State women's basketball team held off a pesky Western Washington squad on the Vikings' home turf to secure a 59-56 victory on Friday evening in Bellingham, Wash.

BELLINGHAM, Wash. - The No. 20 ranked Valdosta State Lady Blazers completed their northwestern trek with a convincing 89-73 victory over Saint Martin's in non-conference Division II women's basketball action on Saturday at Carver Gym in Bellingham, Wash.

Taylor Buie delivered her first 20-plus point performance of the season with 22 points on 8-of-17 shooting from the floor and a whopping six three pointers on 13 attempts. The total of Buie's shots made from beyond the arc on Saturday doubled the total that the senior had made prior to the start of the game.

The two teams fought tooth and nail throughout the opening period, but were forced to settle for 11-21 in the opening quarter. The number two frame was where the Lady Blazers created some separation, as Kia Perry connected from three-point range at the 8:04 mark to spark a 23-point surge before the break. The effort, along with a defensive lockdown that limited the Saints to just 11 points in the quarter, resulted in a 12 point lead for VSU at the half.

Valdosta State never scored fewer than 21 points in a single quarter throughout the game, which helped soften the blow of a 25-point offensive push by Saint Martin's in the final period.

Madi Mitchell, who joined Buie on the All-Tournament team for the Lynda Goodrich Classic hosted by Western Washington, added another solid effort with 17 points and eight rebounds. The Blazers also benefited from a breakout performance by Crystal Townsend, who came off the bench to score 11 of 26 bench points for the Lady Blazers on the afternoon. Townsend shot 5-of-7 from the field and connected on the only three pointer that she took in the contest, and she did it all in just 14 minutes of action.

As a team, the Lady Blazers shot 48.6 percent from the floor and outrebounded the Saints 38-29. The 13 offensive rebounds by VSU led to 15 putback points, which nearly covered the entire spread of the final score.

The win lifted the Lady Blazers to 4-1 on the season, while Saint Martin's stayed above .500 but dropped to 4-3 on the year.

TAMPA, Fla. - A late push came up just short for the Valdosta State women's basketball team, as the Tampa Spartans took down the Lady Blazers 59-54 in regional action on Wednesday night in Tampa, Fla.

After a tight first quarter, Tampa used a strong offensive effort to pull away throughout the second quarter. The Spartans saw six different players contribute with points scored during a 6-of-14 effort from the field. The difference came at the free throw line, however, as the Spartans managed to negate the Lady Blazers' 19 fourth-quarter points with 12 points on 18 free throw attempts. Valdosta State pulled to within one at 51-50 with just over one minute to go, but the Spartans shot 28 free throws against just 10 for the Lady Blazers throughout entirety of the game, and UT capitalized on the abundance of free throw shots down the stretch to avoid concession of the slim lead.

In the contest, Valdosta State shot below 30 percent for just the second time this season. Kenya Samone* and Madi Mitchell* both produced double-doubles on the night, but the Tampa defense zeroed in on Mitchell and allowed the senior just four buckets on 16 attempts. The Spartans didn't fare much better offensively, but VSU's opponent eclipsed the 30 percent mark by a slight margin with a 17-of-51, 33.3 percent shooting effort from the field.

Molly Franson did the most damage offensively for the Spartans with 20 points and eight rebounds. Meanwhile, Karma Jeremie delivered 15 points on a 4-of-12 performance and added 10 rebounds to score a double-double.

VSU Rides Explosive Second Half to Victory Valdosta State Wins, 73-62

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team used 47 second-half points to overcome a six point halftime deficit for a 73-62 win over Lynn in NCAA Division II South Region basketball action on Sunday afternoon at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

"Our game plan in the second half was to be more aggressive, especially offensively," said Head Coach Karly Kuhns after the win. "We only shot three free throws in the first half, which was a sign of how unaggressive we played before halftime. The plan was to get the ball to our guards and get the ball up the floor. We wanted to attack the rim, and when we did, you could see the difference. We shot 21 free throws in the second half and just opened things up more, made ourselves more comfortable, and gave ourselves confidence."

Lynn took a 21-20 lead on a Meagan Shanahan layup at the 6:33 mark in second quarter and expanded the lead to 32-26 at halftime with an 11-6 run throughout the back end of the frame. The Lady Blazers bounced back to outscore the Fighting Knights 21-15 in the third, and Madi Mitchell's layup with 0:11 seconds to play in the quarter forced a 47-47 tie. Valdosta State didn't take a second-half lead until the 4:39 mark in the fourth quarter, when Kenya Samone* Dixon buried a shot from long distance to put the Lady Blazers on top 60-58. The shot gave Dixon three of her 11 points and afforded VSU a lead they would not relinquish.

Each of the eight players that entered the game contributed with both points and rebounds. Taylor Buie represented the leading scorer for Valdosta State with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting, and Mitchell posted her second straight double-double with 17 points and a season-high 14 rebounds.

"Our second half today is much more indicative of what we expect out of this team," added Kuhns. "I think we're getting closer and closer to finding that with players finding the ways that they best contribute. Everyone that played scored today, everyone that played rebounded, and that's what we want to see. Kayla Bonilla, for example, didn't score a lot, but she had four rebounds and a few steals in just 20 minutes of action. Even when they aren't scoring, we need players to find a way to have an impact the way Kayla did today."

Valdosta State shot 44.1 percent from the field in the contest to propel the team to victory and improve VSU's overall record to 5-3. Meanwhile, the Fighting Knights were held to just 35.5 percent shooting in the second half and just 18.2 percent from three point range during the second half. As a result, the Fighting Knights saw their record fall to 2-7 overall.

Lady Blazers Blow By Falcons, 93-70

Valdosta State Wins, 93-70

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team scored a season-high 93 points en route to a dominant 93-70 victory over the Montevallo Falcons on Saturday afternoon in Valdosta, Ga.

The Falcons delivered the first successful shot of the game on the first possession of the game, but the Lady Blazers fired back with 10 unanswered points. From that moment on, Valdosta State completely controlled the contest with a 48.6 percent shooting effort that included 33 field goals on 70 attempts. In contrast, the VSU defense held the Falcons to just 36.2 percent from the floor.

The offensive onslaught from Valdosta State included 18 points from both Madi Mitchell and Aaliyah Cheatham, with Cheatham's performance marking her highest point total since VSU's season opener on November 11th. In addition, Kenya Samone-Dixon poured in 17 points and hauled in 12 rebounds for her 7th double-double of the season.

While committing just 12 turnovers in the contest, Valdosta State topped Montevallo in nearly every major statistical category, including offensive rebounds (19), defensive rebounds (25), assists (19), steals (9), and free throws (19). Valdosta State enjoyed another balanced effort from its roster, as 10 different players put points on the board and 11 different players secured at least one rebound.

Valdosta State improved to 7-3 with the victory, and the win shifted the Lady Blazers' Gulf South Conference record to 1-1 on the year. The Falcons fell to 2-8 on the season and were left searching for their first GSC victory at 0-3 in conference play.

Lady Blazers Finish Strong in 85-74 Win Over UWA

Valdosta State Wins, 85-74

VALDOSTA, Ga. - After starting the game with just 10 first quarter points, Valdosta State finished strong with 32 in the final frame to claim an 85-74 victory over the West Alabama Tigers in Gulf South Conference action on Monday night at The Complex.

The Tigers jumped all over the Lady Blazers in the first half and used a tremendous shooting effort in the first two periods to open up a 19-point lead midway through the second quarter. Despite a 48.5 percent (16-of-33) shooting performance from the field and 50.0 percent (4-of-8) effort from the three point line in the first half by the Tigers, however, Valdosta State weathered the storm and used a 13-5 run down the stretch to pull to within an 11-point, 42-31 deficit at the break.

In the second half VSU flipped a switch on both sides of the ball. The Lady Blazer defense locked down on the Tiger defense, allowing just nine points in the third quarter. Meanwhile, Valdosta State began an offensive surge that resulted in 54 second half points.

Valdosta State saw contributions from the top of their roster to the bottom, while Madi Mitchell and Aaliyah Cheatham led the way offensively with 23 and 22 points, respectively. Mitchell's point total lifted the third-year Blazer to 29th career points, placing the senior just 10 points away from becoming VSU's 960, 1,000-point scorer.

Perhaps the biggest spark of the game came from freshman Kayla Bonilla. The fiery 5'0" guard helped fuel the comeback for the red and black with several key plays on both ends of the floor, including a play in which she scored a bucket and drew a foul for a three point play during the final five minutes of the game.

With the win, Valdosta State improved to 8-3 on the season and lifted their GSC record above .500 at 2-1. The Tigers, meanwhile, fell to 5-7 overall and 2-3 against league opponents.

Lady Blazers Falter in 66-45 Road Loss to Lee

Lee Wins, 66-45

CLEVELAND, Tenn. - An off night for the Lady Blazer offense led to 66-45 loss to the Lady Flames on Tuesday in a Gulf South Conference matchup at Paul Dana Walker Arena in Cleveland, Tenn.

The Flames jumped on the Lady Blazers early to claim a 20-9 at the end of quarter one, and VSU couldn't seem to find their rhythm in the remaining minutes prior to the half. Valdosta State tallied just six points in the second quarter of play, four of which were from free throw opportunities.

As a team, the Lady Blazers shot just 16.0 percent from the field and 15.4 percent from behind the arc in the first half. Meanwhile, Abby Bertram fueled Lee with 16 of her 21 points in the first two quarters and ended the half with a buzzer beating off the glass from the top of the key. As a result, Valdosta State headed into the half trailing the Lady Flames 15-35.

Cystal Townsend led the way in the third period with four consecutive points off the bench, which sparked a 15-point offensive burst in the frame, but the Lady Blazers' aggressive third quarter display wasn't enough to bring VSU back to within striking distance, as Lee maintained the spread for a 52-30 advantage leading into the final quarter of play.

The Blazers won the rebounding battle on the night with 45 total rebounds, 18 of those being offensive. Senior Madi Mitchell pulled down 11 in the paint and Kenya Samone-Dixon contributed with seven.

Valdosta State put up another 15-point quarter in the fourth and outscored the Flames by one point, but it was too little too late.

Valdosta State's 21 turnovers led to 16 points for Lee throughout the night, which came from VSU being out of sync and not tough with the ball, according to Kuhns in the postgame interview.

Offensively, Kenya Samone-Dixon led the Lady Blazers with 14 points, draining 6-of-11 from inside the arc. Freshmen Kayla Bonilla chipped in with 8 points and shot 50.0 percent from the field on the night.

With the loss, the Lady Blazers fell to 8-4 overall and 2-2 in conference play, while the Lady Flames improved to 10-3 overall and 3-2 in the Gulf South Conference.

Lady Blazers Clip the Hawks, Mitchell Scores 1,000

Valdosta State Wins, 63-41

ROME, Ga. - A strong offensive performance by the Lady Blazer women's basketball team led to a 63-41 victory over the Shorter Hawks on Thursday night in Gulf South Conference action in Rome, Ga. Senior Madi Mitchell scored her 1,000th career point to help lead the team to a big conference win.

Mitchell put on a show offensively, and wasted no time doing so. Near the eight minute mark in the second quarter, the senior drained a layup to become the 26th Lady Blazer to score 1,000 points in Valdosta State history. Overall, she was 6-for-11 in field goals with eight rebounds. She tallied 16 total points in 29 minutes of play.

"Madi has really put our team on her back the past two years and her ability to score the ball inside and out just makes her so dangerous. I couldn't be happier for her. It's a big milestone and I'm really proud of her," added Kuhns, who also represents one of the 26 members of VSU's 1,000 point club.

Complimenting Mitchell's strong performance was fellow senior Taylor Buie, who went 3-for-4 shooting from the field and buried two from behind the arc in the first half of play. Valdosta State's strong defensive effort limited Shorter to only 20 first half points while the Blazers racked up 30 points in the first two frames. The Blazers battled tough in the paint with 27 first-half rebounds, including six for Mitchell, five for Kenya Samone' Dixon, and four for both Crystal Townsend and Jaz McIntosh.

Coming out hot in the second half, Dixon drained a 3-pointer, which sparked a 10-4 run in favor of VSU. Overall, the Lady Blazers outscored Shorter 17-10 in the third to take a comfortable 47-30 lead heading into the final quarter.

The final quarter of play was more of the same, as the Lady Blazer's secured their victory with 16 more points. Buie, a senior out of Puyallup, Wash., scored five of her 13 points in the fourth and finished the night shooting 5-for-7 from the field and 3-for-4 from behind the arc.

As a team, Valdosta State shot 44.4% from the field and 61.5% from the 3-point line. Valdosta State dominated in the paint, outrebounding Shorter 48-25 and generating 17 second-chance points.
