

OUICK NOTES:

- The Lady Blazers capped off a thrilling near-perfect season at home as they closed out play at The Complex last Tuesday night. Their 14-1 record was highlighted by a huge conference win over North Alabama last month. The Lady Lions came in at No. 16 in the country as VSU overcame the odds for a 72-61 victory at The Complex.
- The Lady Blazers are currently 4th place in the GSC. They rank 5th in scoring with an average of 68.1 points per game. Defensively, VSU is 4th in the league, allowing an average of 59.2 points per game, resulting in a 8.9 point margin of victory on the year (4th).
- Blazer forward Madi Mitchell was placed on First Team All-GSC for the second consecutive season. Mitchell's stellar senior campaign consisted of many milestones, including being inducted into the VSU 1,000-point club earlier in the season. The senior out of Warwick, Ga. is currently averaging 18.3 points-per game and tops the GSC leaderboard in the scoring category with 495 points on the season with 495 points on the season (3rd). Defensively, Mitchell ranks 4th in the conference, pulling in 239 rebounds (89 offensive, 150 defensive), and averaging 8.9 rebounds per game in the paint.
- Senior Kenya Samone'-Dixon earned Second Team All-GSC honors as announced this afternoon. The forward is is currently 2nd in the league in rebounds, averaging 9.5 per game. The senior has pulled down 213 defensive and 44 offensive (257 total) for the Lady Blazers thus far. Samone'-Dixon also ranks among the top scoreres in the league, averaging 12.1 points per game. This marks Samone-Dixon's second consecuative honor as All-Gulf South Conference.

Carley Kuhns enters her second season with Valdosta State on the heels of an incredible first year, in which she was named the Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year.

Under Kuhns' leadership, the 2016-17 season produced VSU's first 20-plus win since 2011 and the first NCAA South Regional Tournament appearance since 2010. With 26 wins against just six losses, Kuhns and the Lady Blazers claimed the program's first Gulf South Conference Championship since 1984.

Individual awards bestowed on Kuhns' players included All-GSC and All-Region honors for both Madi Mitchell and Kenya-Samone' Dixon. Furthermore, Mitchell earned All-American recognition by the WBCA to become VSU's first All-American since Brittany Ferguson in 2012.

Kuhns, a 2015 Blazer Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, took

over at VSU following a six year stint as an assistant coach at Belmont, where she helped lead the Bruins to an Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2015-16 and the program's second NCAA Tournament appearance in the history of Bruin Basketball. During Kuhns' tenure at Belmont, she participated heavily in the program's recruiting process, and five of her recruits earned All-OVC recognition. In addition, Kuhns served as an academics and compliance liaison while also adding contributions with scouting, team workouts, camps, and the training of perimeter players. Her efforts helped lead the Bruins to a 24-9 record in 2015-16.

Kuhns went to the Bruins after completing a two-year graduate assistantship at Valdosta State. While with the Lady Blazers, she assisted with various components of the program. Within one month of joining the Bruin staff in 2010, Kuhns was named to the prestigious Gulf South Conference All-Decade Second Team for her stellar career on the hardwood at Valdosta State.

A former student-athlete at Valdosta State, Kuhns constructed her Hall of Fame career and received numerous honors from 2004 through 2008, including becoming the first Lady Blazer since 2001 to be named a Kodak/State Farm WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. She also recorded 1,133 career points, the 16th-most in program history and was a two-time First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection. Her 262 three-pointers earned the sharpshooter ownership of the school record in the category and placed her 5th all-time in Gulf South Conference history.

The illustrious playing career of Kuhns also helped VSU earn a trip to the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen during her senior campaign with a 26-6 overall record. She led the team in scoring, averaging 10.4 points per game, and shot .373 percent from behind the three-point arc that season. In her career, Kuhns also tallied 436 rebounds, 247 assists, 35 blocked shots, and 245 steals.

The approach with Kuhns at the helm brings an energetic, fast paced style of basketball with an effort to score quickly off the break on offense and put heavy pressure on the ball on de-

Kuhns earned her Bachelor's in Physical Education from Valdosta State in 2008 and completed her Master's in Higher Education Leadership in 2010. She and her husband Matt, who also played basketball for Valdosta State, have two daughters, Carsten (2) and Kyler (6 months).



Merkerson serves as an exciting new addition to the coaching staff for the defending Gulf South Conference champions, with a list of notable accomplishments as both a player and a coach at the collegiate level.

Merkerson's experience as a student-athlete in the NCAA began at the University of North Florida in 2010, where she kicked off a career as a consistent starter for the Ospreys. Her senior season as a post player included 22 starts and resulted in a teamhigh 88.6 percent free throw shooting percentage.

The Florida native carried her love of basketball into a coaching career in 2014, when she transitioned into a graduate assistant role at Lincoln Memorial. While earning a Masters degree in Business Administration, Merkerson made the most of her two years and helped lead LMU to a 17-12 record in 2015-16. The successful season marked the program's most single-season wins in over ten years and led the team to its first ever semifinal appearance in the South Atlantic Conference Tournament.

The loss pushed the Lady Blazers to 2-1 overall on the season, while GSW moved to 1-0 after the successful season opener.

A 19-point first quarter gave the Lady Blazers a solid start and a nine point lead heading into the second period, but the Lady Canes outscored VSU 16-12 in the second to pull to within five at intermission.

With a 31-26 lead at the break, Valdosta State used two three-pointers by Aaliyah Cheatham in the first two minutes of second half to open up 37-26 lead at the 7:55 mark. The lead marked VSU's largest of the game, but a scoring drought ensued for the red and black in the final eight minutes, and GSW outscored Valdosta State 13-4 during that stretch to close the gap to a a two-point, 41-39 Lady Blazer lead.

In the deciding frame, the Lady Canes went on an offensive tear, scoring 23 points against VSU's 13. Valdosta State pulled to within one possession two different times during the final two minutes of the contest, but clutch free throw shooting by Shanya Jones held the Lady Blazers at bay down the stretch.

Madi Mitchell delivered 18 points and nine rebounds for VSU, while Kenva Samone' Dixon posted 12 points and eight boards. However, the duo's efforts weren't enough to overcome the balanced attack of the Lady Canes, which included points from eight different players and 17 points off the bench.

Lady Blazers Secure 59-56 Victory Over WWU

Valdosta State Wins, 59-56

BELLINGHAM, Wash. - In the midst of a lengthy road trip of both distance and duration, the No. 20 ranked Valdosta State women's basketball team held off a pesky Western Washington squad on the Vikings' home turf to secure a 59-56 victory on Friday evening in Bellingham, Wash.

Valdosta State began their trek to Washington State earlier this week to compete in the Lynda Goodrich Classic in the northeast part of the country, and the Lady Blazers started on the right foot Friday night, thanks in large part to a season-high 22-point performance by senior Madi Mitchell. Mitchell finished the offensive breakout effort with a 6-of-15 shooting display from the field and a 10-of-14 night from the free throw line. Thirteen of Mitchell's 22 points came in the fourth quarter, when VSU needed them most.

In addition to Mitchell's solid effort, seniors Taylor Buie and Kenya Samone' Dixon each reached double-digit figures in the scoring column, with Buie posting a season-high 14 points on offense. Furthermore, Dixon tallied yet another double-double - her third in four games - with 10 points and a whopping 15 rebounds. Dixon's 15 boards supplemented 39 team rebounds for the Lady Blazers and helped lead the squad to 12 second chance points on 10 offensive hoards

Both teams went toe-to-toe throughout the first half, leading to a 15-15 tie at the end of the first quarter and a 26-26 tie at the halftime break. Valdosta State broke away in the third quarter, as the Lady Blazer defense locked down to allow just six Western Washing ton points in the frame. With a 41-32 lead heading into the final period, however, WWU's offense came alive for 24 points. The Lady Blazers weathered the late storm by going inside to their All-Conference senior, and Mitchell answered the call with a layup at the 6:35 mark that sparked the aforementioned 13-point surge down the stretch. The strong finish for Mitchell also included two three-point plays, one of which came with the score tied at 53-53 inside the final minute of the contest.

Despite just a 29.5 (18-of-61) team shooting effort, the Lady Blazers gutted out the win to improve to 3-1 on the season, while the Vikings fell to 3-1 overall.

Townsend shot 5-of-7 from the field and connected on the only three pointer that she took in the contest, and she did it all in just 14 minutes of action

As a team, the Lady Blazers shot 48.6 percent from the floor and outrebounded the Saints 38-29. The 13 offensive rebounds by VSU led to 15 putback points, which nearly covered the entire spread of the final score.

The win lifted the Lady Blazers to 4-1 on the season, while Saint Martin's stayed above .500 but dropped to to 4-3 on the year.

"We only shot three free throws in the first half, which was agie of how unaggressive we played befor halftime. The plan was to get the ball to our guards and get the ball up the floor. We wanted to attack the rim, and when we did, you could see the difference. We shot 21 free throws in the second half and just opened things up more, made ourselves more comfortable, and save ourselves confidence."

Lymn took a 21-20 lead on a Meagan Shanahan layup at the 6:33 mark in second quarter and expanded the lead to 32-56 at halfitme with an 11-6 run throughout the back end of the frame. The Lady Blazers bounced back to outscore the Fighting Knights 21-15 in the third, and Madii Mitchell's layup with 0:11 seconds to play in the quarter forced a 47-47 tie. Valdosta State didn't take a second-half lead until the 4:39 mark in the fourth quarter, when Kenya Samone' Dixon buried a shot from long distance to put the Lady Blazers on top 60-58. The shot gave Dixon three of her 11 points and afforded VSU a lead they would not relinquish.

Each of the eight players that entered the game contributed with both points and rebounds. Taylor Bule represented the leading scorer for Valdosta State with 19 points on 7-0f-11 shooting, and Mitchell posted her second straight double-double with 17 points and a season-high 14 rebounds.

"Our second half today is much more indicative of what we expect out of of this team," added Kuhns. "I think we're getting closer and closer to finding that with players finding the ways that they best contribute. Everyone that played scored today, everyone that played rebounded, and that's what we want to see. Kayla Bonilla, for example, didn't score a lot, but she had four rebounds and a few steals in just 20 minutes of action. Even when they aren't scoring, we need players to find a way to have an impact the way Kayla did today."

Valdosta State shot 44.1 percent from the field in the contest to propel the team to victory and improve YSU's overall record to 5-3. Meanwhile, the Fighting Knights were held to just 35.5 percent shootling in the second half and just 18.2 percent from three point range during the second half. As a result, the Fighting Knights saw their record fall to 2-7 overall.

VALDOSTA, Gg. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team scored a season-high 93 points en route to a dominant 93-70 victory over the Montevallo Falcons on Saturday afternoon in Valdosta, Ga.

The Falcons delivered the first successful shot of the game on the first possession of the game, but the Lady Blazers fired back with 10 unanswered points. From that moment on, Valdosta State completely controlled the contest with a 48.6 percent shooting effort that included 33 field goals on 70 attempts. In the second half, VSU flipped a switch on both sides of the ball. The Lady Blazer defense locked down on the Tiger defense, allowing just nine points in the third quarter. Meanwhile, Valdosta State began an offensive surge that resulted in 54 second half points.

Valdosta State saw contributions from the top of their roster to the bottom, while Madi Mitchell and Aaliyah Cheatham led the way offensively with 23 and 22 points, respectively, Mitchell's point total lifted the third-year Blazer to 990 career points, placing the senior just 10 points away from becoming VSU's 26th 1.000-point scorer.

Perhaps the biggest spark of the game came from freshman Kayla Bonilla. The fiery 5'0' guard helped fuel the comeback for the red and black with several key plays on both ends of the floor, including a play in which she scored a bucket and drew a foul for a three point play during the final five minutes of the game.

With the win, Valdosta State improved to 8-3 on the season and lifted their GSC record above .500 at 2-1. The Tigers, meanwhile, fell to 5-7 overall and 2-3 against league opponents.

Valdosta State put up another 15-point quarter in the fourth and out-scored the Flames by one point, but it was too little too late.

Valdosta State's 21 turnovers led to 16 points for Lee throughout the night, which came from V5U being out of sync and not tough with the ball, according to Kuhns in the postgame interview.

Offensively, Kenya Samone'-Dixon led the Lady Blazers with 14 points, draining 6-0f-11 from inside the arc. Freshmen Kayla Bonilla chipped in with 8 points and shot 50.0 percent from the field on the night.

With the loss, the Lady Blazers fell to 8-4 overall and 2-2 in conference play, while the Lady Flames improved to 10-3 overall and 3-2 in the Gulf South Conference.

A strong offensive performance by the Lady Blazer women's basketball team led to a 63-41 victory over the Shorter Hawks on Thursday night in Gulf South Conference action in Rome, Ga. Senior Madi Mitchell scored her 1,000th career point to help lead the team to a big conference win.

Mitchell put on a show offensively, and wasted no time doing so. Near the eight minute mark in the second quarter, the senior drained a layup to become the 26th Lady Blazer to score 1,000 points in Valdotas State history. Overall, she was 6-for-11 in field goals with eight rebounds. She tallied 16 total points in 29 minutes of significant or the state of utes of play.

Valdosta State's strong defensive effort limited Shorter to only 20 first half points while the Blazers racked up 30 points in the first two frames. The Blazers battled tough in the paint with 27 first-half rebounds, including six for Mitchell, five for Kenya Samone' Dixon, and four for both Crystal Townsend and Jaz McIntosh.

Coming out hot in the second half, Dixon drained a 3-pointer, which sparked a 10-4 run in favor of VSU. Overall, the Lady Blazers outscored Shorter 17-10 in the third to take a comfortable 47-30 lead heading into the final quarter.

The final quarter of play was more of the same, as the Lady Blazer's secured their victory with 16 more points. Buie, a senior out of Puyallup, Wash., scored five of her 13 points in the fourth and finished the night shooting 5-for-7 from the field and 3 for 4 from behind the property of the property and 3-for-4 from behind the arc.

As a team, Valdosta State shot 44.4% from the field and 61.5% from the 3-point line. Valdosta State dominated in the paint, outrebounding Shorter 48-25 and generating 17 second-chance points.

Valdosta State Wins, 61-46

 $\it VALDOSTA, Ga.$ - The Valdosta State Lady Blazers picked up their second straight Gulf South Conference win with a 61-46 victory over Delta State on Sunday afternoon at The Complex.

With the win, VSU extended their perfect home record to 7-0 on the season and improved to 10-4 overall, 4-2 in league play. The Lady Statesmen of Delta State fell to 5-8 overall and fell below .500 at 3-4 against GSC opponents.

Valdosta State's success started with a stellar defensive effort that held Alondrea Valuda a face's already and a sterial deletable flow that field without high grant flow for the conference's top 10 scorers, to just two points on 1-of-11 shooting from the field. Collectively, DSU was able to connect on just 2-of-13 attempts from the three point line, and the Lady Blazer defense held the Lady Statesmen to a 35.4 percent (17-of-48) shooting performance from the field.

Delta State took an early lead in the opening minutes of the contest, thanks to a pair of jumpers by Simone Jackson and Alexis Ross. Valdosta State used a pair of free throws from Madi Mitchell and a three ball from Kenya Samone' Dixon, how-ever, to reclaim a 5-4 lead within the first three minutes of the opening quarter. Taylor Buie followed with a three-pointer, and Kia Perry sank a shot from close range shortly after, and the Lady Blazers never looked back.

Valdosta State was led on offense by seniors Mitchell and Samone' Dixon, who teamed up to score 35 of VSU's 61 points. Samone' Dixon poured in 18 on 5-of-8 shootting and delivered her best three-point shooting performance of the season with a 4-of-5 effort. Samone' Dixon also hauled in 10 rebounds to pick up her ninth double-double of the season.

Mitchell, who scored her 1,000th career point last week at Shorter and was recognized in front of the home crowd prior to the men's game, connected on 5-of-11 from the field and shot 7-of-8 from the free throw line for a 17-point display.

Valdosta State put on a show from long distance, shooting 7-of-17 from beyond the arc for a 41.2 three point shooting percentage. Furthermore, VSU turned the ball over just 10 times in the game and buried 18-of-20 from the free throw line for 90.0 percent.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Lady Blazers delivered a steady flow of offense on Tuesday night for their third consecutive Gulf South Conference win, a 76-53 rout of the Mississippi College Lady Choctaws at The Complex in Valdosta, Ga.

The win lifted Valdosta State to an 11-4 record overall and boosted the red and black to a 5-2 stint in GSC play. Meanwhile, the Lady Choctaws fell to 5-10 on the year and dropped to 1-8 against league opponents.

Valdosta State guided the opening tip right to Kia Perry, who gathered the ball in stride and buried an easy layup from the left side to set the tone. Fueled by a 29-point outing by senior Madi Mitchell, the Lady Blazers never scored fewer than 16 points in a quarter the rest of the way. Mitchell finished the night with her fourth double-double of the season after pulling down 12 of Valdosta State's 48 rebounds and connecting on 10-of-11 from the field. Additionally, the Lady Blazers' team offensive rebounding effort led to 18 offensive rebounds and 23 second chance points.

The Lady Blazers shot 44.8 percent from the field on offense, which marked the seventh time this season VSU eclipsed the 40-percent threshold from the field. Along with Mitchell, nine different Lady Blazers scored points in the game, and each of those nine players also secured at least one rebound.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team matched their highest rebound total of the season on Sunday afternoon in Valdosta, Ga. to cap off the weekend with a gritty 56-45 Gulf South Conference victory over the visiting Wolves of West Georgia.

The Lady Blazers pulled down a whopping 52 rebounds in the game, 45 of which were on the defensive end. As a result, the Wolves weren't afforded many second chances. This, along with a paltry 25 percent (16-of-64) shooting effort by Wolves, spelled doom for UWG at The Complex, where VSU has won each of its 10 home games this season.

Madi Mitchell poured in 22 for her second 20-plus point performance of the week, and the senior also added seven rebounds with two assists. Fellow senior Taylor Buie served as a solid supporting cast member with 12 points, and she doubled her season high rebound total with eight boards in the contest. Furthermore, Kenya Samone! Dixon delivered 11 rebounds, and Crystal Townsend hauled in nine to top her previous best of seven, which she tallied against Shorter on January 4th.

Valdosta State improved to 13-6 overall with the victory and lifted their conference record to 7-4. As a result, VSU is now tied for fourth in the Gulf South Conference standings with West Florida, and only two games separate the Argonauts and Lady Blazers from Lee and North Alabama, who are tied for second place with 9-2 conference records. With today's loss, West Georgia fell into fifth place with a 10-8 overall record and a 6-5 stint against league opponents.

In front of a crowd of nearly 2,000 Blazer faithful, the Lady Blazers jumped out to an early 5-0 lead, thanks to a layup by Jazmyn McIntosh and a three pointer by Mitchell in the first two minutes of the opening quarter. Valdost a state extended the lead to 10 by the end of the first, and the Lady Blazers never trailed again for the rest of the night.

"We are so thankful for the opportunity to play in front of such an awesome, energetic crowd," added Kulms. "The support the crowd showed us tonight was incredible, and we couldn't ask for a more exciting environment for our team to play in."

The Lady Blazer defense delivered an incredible effort throughout the contest, holding Lee, who entered the game as the GSC's third ranked team, to a 35,9 shooting percentage from the field. In contrast, Validotas State's offense connected on 46.9 percent of their shots and hit 6-of-11 from long distance for a 54.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc.

Lee whittled Valdosta State's lead down to just three points with less than two minutes to play, but the Lady Blazers used good free throw shooting, timely buckets, and a crowd-pleasing block by McIntosh in the closing seconds to hold on and secure the big victory.

Valdosta State improved to 16-7 overall and 10-5 in league play after the win. More importantly, VSU moved into fourth place in the conference standings and pulled to within just one game of the third place Flames, who are now 18-5 overall and 11-4 in the GSC.

Lady Blazers Hold on For Win Over West Georgia

Valdosta State Wins, 70-67

CARROLLTON, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team stayed on their hot streak with a 70-67 Gulf South Conference win over the Lady Wolves of West Georgia Thursday night in Carrollton, Ga.

Despite four Lady Wolves scoring in double digits, VSU was able to control the pace and hold West Georgia at arm's length throughout a majority of the game. VSU's largest lead came in the third quarter, where the Lady Blazer extended their lead to as many as 17 points. West Georgia showed resiliency down the stretch, however, and whittled away at Validosta State's lead with five third quarter three pointers.

As West Georgia trimmed the Lady Blazers' lead down the stretch, Valdosta State claimed what was arguably their biggest possession of the game at the 6.03 mark in the fourth quarter. After UWG pulled to within four at 64-60, Kenya Samoe Dixon was fouled on a close range shot. Dixon hit the first and missed the second, and Jazmyn McIntosh helped secure an offensive rebound to give the Lady Blazers a chance to add more. Madl Mitchell capitalized on the opportunity with a layup, and added another point after she was fouled while making the shot. Mitchell's free throw turned the possession into a four-point play, which represented half of the Lady Blazers' fourth quarter points and gave VSU just enough to survive their scoring drought down the stretch.

Dixon capped off her 13th double-double of the season in the matchup. The senior displayed a dominant first half, putting up 13 points on a 5-for-7 effort overall and a 3-of-4 three point performance before intermission. Dixon ended the night with a team0-high 18 points, complemented by 10 rebounds and 4 assists.

From the line, VSU shot an even 70% (19-27) to capitalize on the 17 fouls committed by the Lady Wolves. Mitchell saw the line 11 times and put away 8 for the Lady Blazers. The senior ended the night with another double-digit performance of 12 points, and she pulled down 6 rebounds.

Crystal Townsend has been a source of firepower on offense as of late for VSU, and she racked up 10 points, including two three pointers, in the contest. Forward Maddy Corazza also had a career-best performance tonight where she tallied 15 points and grabbed 7 rebounds to cap off the victory.

With the win, the Lady Blazers improved to 17-7 on the season and 11-5 in GSC action, while West Georgia drops to 13-10, 9-7 in conference play. With Lee's loss to Union on Thursday, VSU is now knotted up with Lee in a tie for third place in the conference standings.

In front of the most raucous Blazer crowd in recent memory, Kuhns did a masterful job of weaving just seven available players in and out of a master matchup that served as one of the most intense battles of the 2017-18 season. Serving Madi Mitchell and Taylor Buie both gutted out 40 minutes of action, while Kenya Samone' Dixon sat for just one minute on the night.

In addition to the staple 18-point performance of Mitchell, to which Blazer Nation has grown so accustomed, Valdosta State's biggest boost came from a pair of unlikely hero-ines. Freshman Rayla Bonilla delivered 17 points on a perfect 4-of-4 night from the field, while adding 8-fo-11 at the free throw line. Furthermore, Jazmyn McIntosh tallied double digits in the scoring column for the first time in her career with a total of 14 points on 7-of-11 shooting with seven rebounds.

The Lions knotted the game up at 50-50 just inside the start of the fourth quarter, but Bonilla answered with a three-point play on the opposite end, which sparked a 24-point surge in the final quarter and helped VSU run away with the massive win.

Coach Kuhns continuously referred to the team effort of her squad on Saturday, which also included contributons from Maddy Corazza, who pulled in three rebounds and again the Blazzers six opinis of the beach. Even with just nine minutes of action, 8ñs clemmons single-handedly thwarted North Alabama's push for momentum at the end of the first half with a buzzer bearting three fromer.

Validosta State improved to 20-7 on the year with the victory and lifted their GSC record to 14-5. The Lady Blazers have now won six straight and remain undefeated at 13-0 on their home floor at The Complex. The Lions suffered just their third loss of the season and fell to 23-3 overall, 16-3 against league opponents.

The Lady Blazers will compete for a third place seeding on Thursday night, February 22nd, when the West Florida Argonauts come to town for the final regular season game of the 2017-18 season. The game, which will the at 5:00 p.m. at The Complex, has been selected as the NCAA Division il Showcase Game of the Week and will be aired live on 15PN3 and the Watch 15PN app. Direct links for access will be available at www.vstateblazers.com.

In addition, both the Lady Blazers and the Blazers have secured hosting rights for the first round of the Gulf South Conference Tournament. Opponents are yet to be determined, but the games will take at 6.00 pm. and 8.00 pm. on Tuesday, February 27th. The event has been dubbed "Super Tuesday" by the Gulf South Conference and will mark the second consecutive year in which both the Lady Blazers and Blazers will host the opening round quarterfinal matchup.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - Valdosta State women's basketball overcame an extremely slow start on Senior Night at The Complex to secure a third place seed in the Gulf South Conference with a 67-62 Thursday night win in Valdosta, Ga.

The Argonauts jumped out of the gate with eight unanswered points to open up an early 8-0 lead in the first five minutes of the contest. Valdosta State got two buckets from Taylor Buie to pull back to within six, but UWF proceeded to outscore the Lady Blazers 20-7 over the course of the entire opening frame.

The second quarter was a completely different story, however. West Florida's Shaniqua Magee connected for a layup at the 8:53 mark in the frame, but the Valdosta State defense went into lock down mode and did not allow another point for the rest of the quarter.

While shutting down the opponent with a gutsy defensive effort throughout the remainder of the first half, the Lady Blazers got a three ball from Mitchell and a layup from Kayla Bonilla inside the final minute to cap of an 18-2 second quarter surge. The second quarter performance gave VSU their first lead of the game and lifted the Blazers to a 25–22 advantage at the break.

In the second half, it was all Taylor Buie. The senior, in front of friends and family in attendance to celebrate senior day, buried 6-0f-11 from the field, and each of the six shots were threes. Buie posted the highest scoring total of her Blaster career with a total of 24 points scored, and Mitchell complemented the effort with a team-high 25 points on 11-of-21 shooting.

The Lady Blazers' biggest shot of the game came at the 25 second mark, when Buie buried her final three from the corner to put the Blazers up by two possessions at 64-59 (shown in the video above). The shot proved to be the dagger in the heart of the Argonauts and helped VSU secure a third place seeding in the upcoming Gulf South Conference fournament.

Valdosta State improved to 21-7 in regular season play on the season and 16-5 in GSC play. The Argonauts fell to 16-11 overall and 11-9 against league opponents. The win capped off a perfect regular season in The Complex, where the Lady Blazers finished 14-0.

Playoff action is set to begin on Tuesday night at 6:00 p.m., where the Blazers will once again welcome the Argonauts to town. The game will represent the first round playoff matchup between the number three and number six especitively. The winner will advance to the SemiFinal Round on Saturday in Birmingham, Ala.

Women's Basketball Falls to UWF in GSC Opener

West Florida Wins 68-49

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team struggled to find a rhythm early, and the West Florida Argonauts held off the Lady Blazers for the duration of the Gulf South Conference Tournament quarterfinal matchup to claim a 68-49 first round upset on Tuesday night at The Complex.

The loss for Valdosta State marked their first of the 2017-18 season on their home floor, and denied a return trip to the GSC Tournament semifinals on Saturday in Birmingham, Ala.

With a record of 21-8 on the season and a No. 7 ranking in the latest round of South Regional olls, the Lady Blazers will now be forced to wait until the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Selection Show to find out if their season will continue. The top eight teams in the region will compete in the 2018 South Regional Tournament, and each participant will be announced at 10:00 pm. E75 on Sunday, March 4th.

Valdosta State never could get it going offensively in the contest and finished with a 28.6 shooting percentage from the field. In contrast, West Florida connected on 46.7 of their shots. The Argonauts biggest boost came from their three-point shooting, which led to a 53.3 percentage (8-of-15) from beyond the arc.

The Argonauts held VSU's top scorer to just nine points in the game, and Taylor Buie was the only Lady Blazer to reach double digit figures in the scoring column with 10 points on the night.

Valdosta State committed just 12 turnovers in the game and outrebounded the Argonauts 39 to 36. VSU's shooting woes, however, proved to be too much to overcome.

UWF was led offensively by Halee Nieman, who connected on 8-of-13 from the field, including two threes, for 21 points. Shami Goodman added 14, and Chloe Branch gave the Argonauts 12
