

### **OUICK NOTES:**

- The Valdosta State women's basketball team has been predicted as the top finisher in the Gulf South Conference, as announced by the GSC office
- Senior Madi Mitchell currently ranks among the league's top ten in points per game (16.1, 6th), field goal percentage (49.0, 5th), rebounds per game (7.6, 6th), and free throw percentage (75.7.0,
- Valdosta State is glad to be back home after a lengthy road trip that began on November 14th and ran through December 6th. During that stretch, the Lady Blazers went 2-3 with a narrow Gulf South Conference loss to West Florida in Pensacola, Fla. VSU is perfect at home so far in 2017-18 with four wins, two of which came earlier this week on back-to-back days at The Complex.
- The Lady Blazers are currently ranked 5th in the Gulf South Conference in scoring with an average of 68.9 points per game. Defensively, VSU is 4th in the league, allowing an average of 57.1 points per game, resulting in a 11.8 point margin of victory on the year.
- Kenya Samone'-Dixon is currently 2nd in the league in rebounds, averaging 9.8 per game. The senior has pulled down 73 defensive and 15 offensive (88 total) for the Lady Blazers thus far.
- The Lady Blazers' 22-win season last year marked their best since 2011-12, when the team went 22-8 en route to a sweet sixteen appearance. The GSC Championship win over West Florida gave Valdosta State its first conference title since 1984.

## eh Carley Kuins

2ND SEASON - VALDOSTA STATE 2008



Carley Kuhns enters her second season with Valdosta State on the heels of an incredible first year, in which she was named the Gulf South Conference Coach of the Year.

Under Kuhns' leadership, the 2016-17 season produced VSU's first 20-plus win since 2011 and the first NCAA South Regional Tournament appearance since 2010. With 26 wins against just six losses, Kuhns and the Lady Blazers claimed the program's first Gulf South Conference Championship since 1984.

Individual awards bestowed on Kuhns' players included All-GSC and All-Region honors for both Madi Mitchell and Kenva-Samone' Dixon. Furthermore, Mitchell earned All-American recognition by the WBCA to become VSU's first All-American since Brittany Ferguson in 2012.

Kuhns, a 2015 Blazer Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, took

over at VSU following a six year stint as an assistant coach at Belmont, where she helped lead the Bruins to an Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2015-16 and the program's second NCAA Tournament appearance in the history of Bruin Basketball. During Kuhns' tenure at Belmont, she participated heavily in the program's recruiting process, and five of her recruits earned All-OVC recognition. In addition, Kuhns served as an academics and compliance liaison while also adding contributions with scouting, team workouts, camps, and the training of perimeter players. Her efforts helped lead the Bruins to a 24-9 record in 2015-16.

Kuhns went to the Bruins after completing a two-year graduate assistantship at Valdosta State. While with the Lady Blazers, she assisted with various components of the program. Within one month of joining the Bruin staff in 2010, Kuhns was named to the prestigious Gulf South Conference All-Decade Second Team for her stellar career on the hardwood at Valdosta State.

A former student-athlete at Valdosta State, Kuhns constructed her Hall of Fame career and received numerous honors from 2004 through 2008, including becoming the first Lady Blazer since 2001 to be named a Kodak/State Farm WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. She also recorded 1,133 career points, the 16th-most in program history and was a two-time First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection. Her 262 three-pointers earned the sharpshooter ownership of the school record in the category and placed her 5th all-time in Gulf South Conference history.

The illustrious playing career of Kuhns also helped VSU earn a trip to the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen during her senior campaign with a 26-6 overall record. She led the team in scoring, averaging 10.4 points per game, and shot .373 percent from behind the three-point arc that season. In her career, Kuhns also tallied 436 rebounds, 247 assists, 35 blocked shots, and 245 steals.

The approach with Kuhns at the helm brings an energetic, fast paced style of basketball with an effort to score quickly off the break on offense and put heavy pressure on the ball on de-

Kuhns earned her Bachelor's in Physical Education from Valdosta State in 2008 and completed her Master's in Higher Education Leadership in 2010. She and her husband Matt, who also played basketball for Valdosta State, have two daughters, Carsten (2) and Kyler (6 months).



Merkerson serves as an exciting new addition to the coaching staff for the defending Gulf South Conference champions, with a list of notable accomplishments as both a player and a coach at the collegiate level.

Merkerson's experience as a student-athlete in the NCAA began at the University of North Florida in 2010, where she kicked off a career as a consistent starter for the Ospreys. Her senior season as a post player included 22 starts and resulted in a teamhigh 88.6 percent free throw shooting percentage.

The Florida native carried her love of basketball into a coaching career in 2014, when she transitioned into a graduate assistant role at Lincoln Memorial. While earning a Masters degree in Business Administration, Merkerson made the most of her two years and helped lead LMU to a 17-12 record in 2015-16. The successful season marked the program's most single-season wins in over ten years and led the team to its first ever semifinal appearance in the South Atlantic Conference Tournament.

Both teams went toe-to-toe throughout the first half, leading to a 15-15 tie at the end of the first quarter and a 26-26 tie at the halftime break. Valdosta State broke away in the third quarter, as the Lady Blazer defense locked down to allow just six Western Washing ton points in the frame. With a 41-32 lead heading into the final period, however, WWU's offense came alive for 24 points. The Lady Blazers weathered the late storm by going inside to their All-Conference senior, and Mitchell answered the call with a layup at the 6:35 mark that sparked the aforementioned 13-point surge down the stretch. The strong finish for Mitchell also included two three-point plays, one of which came with the score tied at 53-53 inside the final minute of the contest.

Despite just a 29.5 (18-of-61) team shooting effort, the Lady Blazers gutted out the win to improve to 3-1 on the season, while the Vikings fell to 3-1 overall.

The Blazers also benefited from a breakout performance by Crystal Townsend, who came off the bench to score 11 of 26 bench points for the Lady Blazers on the afternoon. Townsend shot 5-of-7 from the field and connected on the only three pointer that she took in the contest, and she did it all in just 14 minutes of action

As a team, the Lady Blazers shot 48.6 percent from the floor and outrebounded the Saints 38-29. The 13 offensive rebounds by VSU led to 15 putback points, which nearly covered the entire spread of the final score.

The win lifted the Lady Blazers to 4-1 on the season, while Saint Martin's stayed above .500 but dropped to to 4-3 on the year.

TAMPA, Fla. - A late push came up just short for the Valdosta State women's basketball team, as the Tampa Spartans took down the Lady Blazers 59-54 in regional action on Wednesday night in Tampa, Fla.

The fourth quarter was more of the same, as the VSU defense held Tampa to just two field goals throughout the entire fourth quarter. The difference came at the free throw line, however, as the Sparans managed to negate the Lady Blazer's 19 fourth-quarter points with 12 points on 18 fee throw attempts. Valdosta State pulled to within one at 51-50 with just over one minute to go, but the Spartans shot 28 free throws against just 10 for the Lady Blazers throughout entirely of the game, and UT calliated on the abundance of free throws shots down the stretch to avoid concession of the slim lead.

In the contest, Valdosts State shot below 30 percent for just the second time this season. Kenya Samone? Blown and Madi Mitchell both produced double-doubles on the night, but the Tampa defense zeroed in on Mitchell and allowed the senior just four buckets on 16 attempts. The Spartans didn't fare much better offensively, but VSU's opponent eclipsed the 30 percent mark by a slight margin with a 17-of-51, 33.3 percent shooting effort from the field.

Molly Franson did the most damage offensively for the Spartans with 20 points and eight rebounds. Meanwhile, Karma Jeremie delivered 15 points on a 4-of-12 performance and added 10 rebounds to score a double-double.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State women's basketball team used 47 second-half points to overcome a six point halfitime deficit for a 73-62 win over Lynn in NCAA Division II South Region basketball action on Sunday afternoon at The Complex in Valdosta. Ga.

"Our game plan in the second half was to be more aggressive, especially offensively," said Head Coach Carley Kuhns after the win. "We only shot three free throws in the first half, which was a roll of how unaggressive we played befor halfitme. The plan was to get the ball to our guards and get the ball up the floor. We wanted to attack the rim, and when we did, you could see the difference. We shot 21 free throws in the second half and just opened things up more, made ourselves more comfortable, and gave ourselves confidence."

Lymn took a 21-20 lead on a Meagan Shanahan layup at the 6:33 mark in second quarter and expanded the lead to 32-56 at halfitme with an 11-6 run throughout the back end of the frame. The Lady Blazers bounced back to outscore the Fighting Knights 21-15 in the third, and Madii Mitchell's layup with 0:11 seconds to play in the quarter forced a 47-47 tie. Valdosta State didn't take a second-half lead until the 4:39 mark in the fourth quarter, when Kenya Samone' Dixon buried a shot from long distance to put the Lady Blazers on top 60-58. The shot gave Dixon three of her 11 points and afforded VSU a lead they would not relinquish.

Each of the eight players that entered the game contributed with both points and rebounds. Taylor Bule represented the leading scorer for Valdosta State with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting, and Mitchell posted her second straight double-double with 17 points and a season-high 14 rebounds.

"Our second half today is much more indicative of what we expect out of of this team," added Kuhns. "I think we're getting closer and closer to finding that with players finding the ways that they best contribute. Everyone that played scored today, everyone that played rebounded, and that's what we want to see. Kayla Bonilla, for example, didn't score a lot, but she had four rebounds and a few steals in just 20 minutes of action. Even when they aren't scoring, we need players to find a way to have an impact the way Kayla did today."

Valdosta State shot 44.1 percent from the field in the contest to propel the team to victory and improve YSU's overall record to 5-3. Meanwhile, the Fighting Knights were held to just 35.5 percent shootling in the second half and just 18.2 percent from three point range during the second half. As a result, the Fighting Knights saw their record fall to 2-7 overall.

VALDOSTA, Ga. - The Valdosta State Lady Blazers cruised to a dominant 70-35 victory over Thomas University in non-conference action on Monday night at The Complex.

Valdosta State's second win in as many nights kept the red and black perfect at home and lifted the Lady Blazers to 6-3 overall on the season. The victory set the stage for the continuation of Gulf South Conference play, which will pick back up this weekend at The Complex.

The Nighthawks struck first in the opening minute of the contest with a layup by Daycia Bandy, but Kenya Samone' Dixon promptly followed with her first of three long distance buckets to put VSU back on top 3-2. Taylor Buie connected from three point range just 30 seconds later, which sparked a 17-10 run for the Lady Blazers in the first quarter.

The Valdosta State defense held TU to single digits in both the second and third quarter for 14 total points. In contrast, VSU racked up 37 points during that same stretch to run away with the contest.

Madi Mitchell led the way offensively with 17 points on 8-of-14 shooting from the field, while Dixon poured in 15 points and pulled down 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the year. Ten different Lady Blazers scored in the balanced offensive effort, and every VSU player that entered secured at least one rebound.
