

- The Valdosta State women's basketball team has been predicted as the top finisher in the Gulf South Conference, as announced by the GSC office
- Senior Madi Mitchell recieved MVP Senior Madi Mitchell recieved MVP at the Lynda Goodrich Thanks-giving Classic this past weekend. Mitchell averaged 19.5 points per game on 14-27 shooting (51.9%) with 6 rebounds per game. She lead the Lady Blazers to a 2-0 record during their time in Bell-ingham Washington. The senior drained 22 points in their win vs. Western Washington Friday night.
- Senior gaurd Taylor Buie was placed on the All-Tournament team during the Lynda Goodrich Thanksgiving Classic where she averaged 18 points per game and drained 8 three-pointers for the Lady Blazers. She had a season high 22 points in their game vs. Saint Martins Saturday night.
- The Lady Blazers are currently 3rd in the Gulf South Conference with field goals made (39). They are averaging 7.8 FGs per game.
- Kenya Samone'-Dixon is currently 2nd in the league in rebounds, averaging 10.4 per game. The senior has pulled down 43 deffensive and 9 offensive (52 total) for the Lady Blazers thus far.
- The Lady Blazers' 22-win season marks their best since 2011-12. when the team went 22-8 en route to a sweet sixteen appearance. One more win will give VSU their most wins since 2007-08, when the team put together a 26-6 season and entered the South Regional as the No. 6 seed. VSU made a sweet sixteen appearance that season also.

Carley Kuhns was named the Head Coach of the women's basketball program at Valdosta State prior to the start of the 2016-17 season.

Kuhns, and a 2015 Blazer Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, will take over at VSU following a six year stint as an assistant coach at Belmont, where she helped lead the Bruins to an Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 2015-16 and the program's second NCAA Tournament appearance in the history of Bruin Basketball. During Kuhns' tenure at Belmont, she participated heavily in the program's recruiting process, and five of her recruits earned All-OVC recognition. In addition, Kuhns served as an academics and compliance liaison while also adding

contributions with scouting, team workouts, camps, and the training of perimeter players. Her efforts helped lead the Bruins to a 24-9 record in 2015-16.

Kuhns went to the Bruins after completing a twovear graduate assistantship at Valdosta State. While with the Lady Blazers, she assisted with various components of the program. Within one month of joining the Bruin staff in 2010. Kuhns was named to the prestigious Gulf South Conference All-Decade Second Team for her stellar career on the hardwood at Valdosta State.

A former student-athlete at Valdosta State, Kuhns constructed her Hall of Fame career and received numerous honors from 2004 through 2008, including becoming the first Lady Blazer since 2001 to be named a Kodak/ State Farm WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. She also recorded 1,133 career points, the 16th-most in program history and was a two-time First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection. Her 262 three-pointers earned the sharpshooter ownership of the school record in the category and placed her 5th all-time in Gulf South Conference history.

The illustrious playing career of Kuhns also helped VSU earn a trip to the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen during her senior campaign with a 26-6 overall record. She led the team in scoring, averaging 10.4 points per game, and shot .373 percent from behind the threepoint arc that season. In her career, Kuhns also tallied 436 rebounds, 247 assists, 35 blocked shots, and 245 steals.

The approach with Kuhns at the helm is expected to bring an energetic, fast paced style of basketball with an effort to score quickly off the break on offense and put heavy pressure on the ball on defense.

Kuhns earned her Bachelor's in Physical Education from Valdosta State in 2008 and completed her Master's in Higher Education Leadership in 2010. She and her husband Matt, who also played basketball for Valdosta State, have two daughters, Carsten (2) and Kyler (6 months).




Merkerson serves as an exciting new addition to the coaching staff for the defending Gulf South Conference champions, with a list of notable accomplishments as both a player and a coach at the collegiate level.

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH

(1ST SEASON. NORTH FLORIDA. 2014)

Merkerson's experience as a student-athlete in the NCAA began at the University of North Florida in 2010, where she kicked off a career as a consistent starter for the Ospreys. Her senior season as a post player included 22 starts and resulted in a teamhigh 88.6 percent free throw shooting percentage.

The Florida native carried her love of basketball into a coaching career in 2014, when she transitioned into a graduate assistant role at Lincoln Memorial. While earning a Masters degree in Business Administration, Merkerson made the most of her two years and helped lead LMU to a 17-12 record in 2015-16. The successful season marked the program's most single-season wins in over ten years and led the team to its first ever semifinal appearance in the South Atlantic Conference Tournament.

Furthermore, Dixon tallied yet another double-double - her third in four games - with 10 points and a whopping 15 rebounds. Dixon's 15 boards supplemented 39 team rebounds for the Lady Blazers and helped lead the squad to 12 second chance points on 10 offensive hoards

Both teams went toe-to-toe throughout the first half, leading to a 15-15 tie at the end of the first quarter and a 26-26 tie at the halftime break. Valdosta State broke away in the third quarter, as the Lady Blazer defense locked down to allow just six Western Washing ton points in the frame. With a 41-32 lead heading into the final period, however, WWU's offense came alive for 24 points. The Lady Blazers weathered the late storm by going inside to their All-Conference senior, and Mitchell answered the call with a layup at the 6:35 mark that sparked the aforementioned 13-point surge down the stretch. The strong finish for Mitchell also included two three-point plays, one of which came with the score tied at 53-53 inside the final minute of the contest.

Despite just a 29.5 (18-of-61) team shooting effort, the Lady Blazers gutted out the win to improve to 3-1 on the season, while the Vikings fell to 3-1 overall.

BELLINGHAM, Wash. - The No. 20 ranked Valdosta State Lady Blazers completed their northwestern trek with a convincing 89-73 victory over Saint Martin's in non-conference Division II women's basketball action on Saturday at Carver Gym in Bellingham, Wash.

Taylor Buie delivered her first 20-plus point performance of the season with 22 points on 8-of-17 shooting from the floor and a whopping six three pointers on 13 attempts. Townsend shot 5-of-7 from the field and connected on the only three pointer that she took in the contest, and she did it all in just 14 minutes of action.

As a team, the Lady Blazers shot 48.6 percent from the floor and outrebounded the Saints 38-29. The 13 offensive rebounds by VSU led to 15 putback points, which nearly covered the entire spread of the final score.

The win lifted the Lady Blazers to 4-1 on the season, while Saint Martin's stayed above .500 but dropped to to 4-3 on the year.
